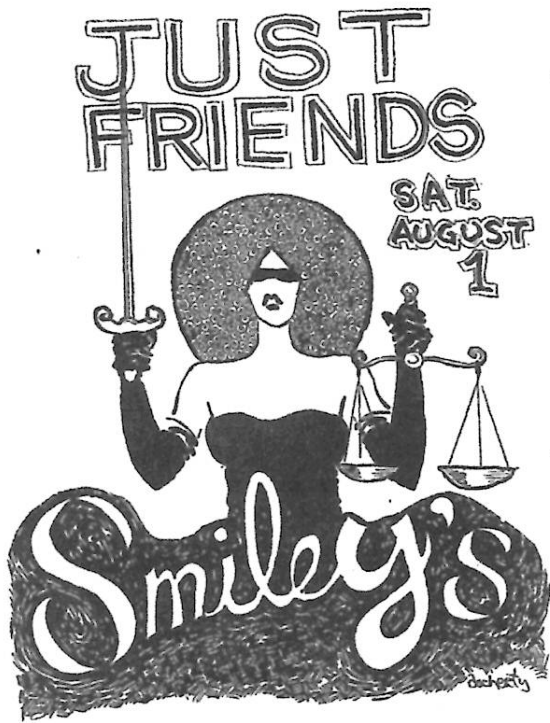

All property owners received the Wildfire Hazard Notice, also known as the "Green Card", from the Marin County Fire Department, the agency responsible for ensuring that all properties meet the State requirements for Defensible Space. California Public Resource Code Section 4291 requires 100' (or to your property line) of Defensible Space to help protect homes in the event of a wildfire.

Hopefully, due to the efforts of the Bolinas fire department in recent months, you are aware that we are rapidly approaching Wildland fire season. With your help and the help of the Marin County Fire Department, our community will be safer from the inevitable wildfire.

Parking versus packing up

Two weeks ago on Saturday, Deputy Johnson issued numerous \$99 parking tickets at the end of Brighton to innocent people who only planned to be there a few moments as they picked up or dropped off their families. Residents and visitors have loaded and unloaded by the beach for decades.

Targeted were the slower-moving families with mothers and babies, children and seniors, who did not think they were doing anything unusual in their beach routine. They were unnecessarily upset, scrambling as the deputy called out, "You're next!" before ticketing them.

People reacted in disbelief to the woman's adversarial attitude. When I attempted to get her name, she refused to give it to me. The victims argued for their common-sense right to pack and unpack their cars on a super-crowded day with no parking anywhere. This went on for quite some time, with Deputy Johnson leaving and coming back; as usual, there was a constant revolving of traffic and the newcomers did not know what had just transpired. Easy pickings.

These folks were not parking. They had parked or were parking far away and were coming to pick up or drop off families and beach gear. There is no sign at the beach entrance that warns not to pick up, load or unload, nor should there be.

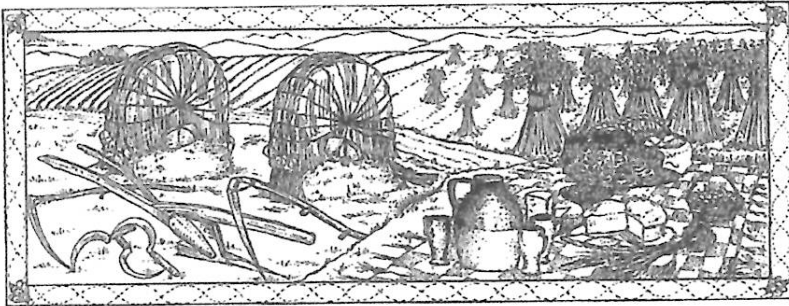

AUGUST

THE FESTIVAL OF LUGHNASADH

*Month of August . . . blithesome the bee,  
Full the hive; better the work of the sickle  
Than the bow.*

WELSH, FIFTEENTH CENTURY



The third great festival of the Celtic year takes place on August 1, known in Ireland as Lughnasadh, "the assembly of Lugh," one of the chief gods of the Tuatha Dé Danann. It marks the midpoint of the summer half of the year between May and November and is the first of the three autumn months. In early Ireland it marked the beginning of the harvest season, which continued till the last sheep and cattle were brought down from the highland pastures in time for Samhain. Farmers reaped the first ears of wheat, oats, and barley and, in later centuries, dug up the first new potatoes. Lambs were weaned so that their mothers would mate and conceive new offspring to be born the following year in time for Imbolc. Soft fruits swelled and ripened—gooseberries in the

garden, bilberries on the moors. The gods had kept their covenant with the people, and it was time to celebrate earth's bounty.

Lughnasadh falls directly opposite Imbolc on the Celtic Wheel of the Year. Imbolc marked the halfway point of the dark, *gam*, or feminine, half of the year and was very much a woman's festival, associated with childbirth and the dairy and presided over by Brigit. Celebrations clustered around the home and family. Lughnasadh stands at the center of the light half of the year and was more of a men's festival. Festivities took place at large outdoor conventions and fairs and included traditionally masculine activities such as commerce, horse racing, and settling legal matters. Even as late as the nineteenth century when the great assemblies of old were reduced to picnics, patterns, and country fairs, the festival was known as "Men's Sunday" in many parts of Ireland.<sup>1</sup>

In the Christian era the festival on August 1 became Lammass, the name derived from *hlaf-mæsse* (loaf-mass), the Old English name for the feast, when a loaf made from the first ripe grain was taken to church to be consecrated upon the altar.

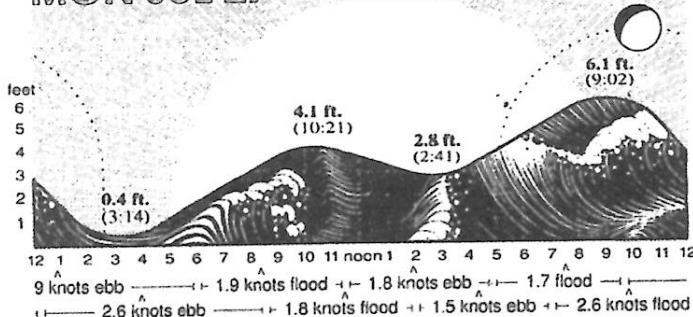

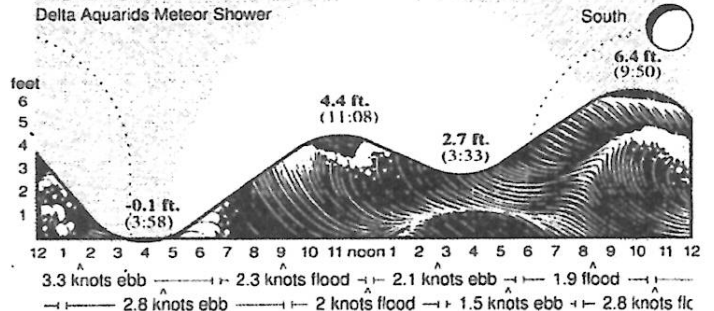

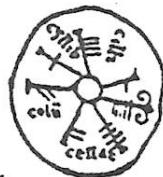
St. Pantaleone, worshiped today, was among other things the patron saint
