

After Annie sang the parade started and we began to lurch down Wharf. I say lurched because the voluminous tie dye and American flag material kept catching on the tires

Up on the roof I felt like I was riding a bucking bronco. I braced myself as best I could with my legs spread wide apart in an imitation of Chuck Berry doing the splits. I was trying to play a decent rendition of the Star Spangled Banner and halfway down Wharf I started to play it pretty well. Then my A string broke.

No longer able to play in the key of A, I threw away my flat pick and began to play a fast blues in E with my thumb and forefinger. The noise of the crowd almost drowned out my playing. I realized that the crowd noise was also in the key of E. It was a perfect drone tone for my guitar.

So I skipped notes across the hubbub like skipping rocks across the lagoon. I played like a wild man until the parade ended on Brighton Ave, After we stopped I looked down at my electric guitar. The white pick guard was spattered with droplets of blood. I'd been playing so furiously that I had abraded my forefinger and bled on my guitar.

I marvelled at the moment.

"Blood sacrifice on my guitar in the middle of the

Fourth of July parade." I said to myself. "Epic!"

"I'm going to remember this Fourth." I thought as I looked at my blood spattered guitar. "This is going to make a great story 30 years from now: how I bled on my guitar during the 4th of July parade in Bolinas."

'...doing to others what we wish they would do







THE SAD STORY OF CAPTAIN EASKOOT

The quiet, almost hidden community of Bolinas has more than its fair share of legendary folk figures. One of the most distinguished is Captain Easkoot—or rather, the ghost of Captain Easkoot. He lived in the huge white mansion which overlooks the Bay. Following the premature death of his wife and a traumatic incident in which her coffin was washed out to sea by an unusually high flood tide as it was being taken to the cemetery, the Captain became an embittered man. His ire was increased by the fact that his hook-hand (all notorious captains seem to have one!) disappeared during the funeral wake. He spent the rest of his life chasing innocent travellers away from the bay which he considered to be his property and, even now on stormy nights, his ghost haunts the town looking for the

During the 1850's Bolinas was a major logging center for San Francisco. Although over 15 million feet of lumber was felled in the area, the town's prosperity dwindled with the demise of the gold rush. Subsequent periods of potato farming, coal, copper, oil and asbestos mining, shipbuilding and even rum-running and opium smuggling were all shortlived. The bay became silted and Bolinas never grew.
