By way of introduction, I'm Genie McNaughton, long-time on-and-off resident of Bolinas since September 1973. Our house on Birch Road is currently rented out to a local family. I served on the BCPUD Board from 1989 to 1997, when we moved to San Francisco to reduce my commute time to work at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. I come to Bolinas at least once a month to work in my garden. I'm a member of the advisory Land Stewardship Committee of the BCPUD. We've been meeting for five years now (!), focusing on how to improve the bike path and encouraging native plants to emerge in an area, the knoll, on the BCPUD property below the treatment ponds (see the announcement of the next Broom Pull, Sunday, 2/24, 10-1 in Monday's Hearsay). I wrote the following email to the BCPUD, which I've been asked to share with the community.

January 14, 2019

Hi Jennifer and the BCPUD Board of Directors:

I can't be at the BCPUD meeting on Wednesday so I'm writing to express my concern about the BCLT process as demonstrated indirectly in the responses the group received from the County Planning Department.

The inadequacies of both the 430 Aspen and Overlook pointed out in response to those applications echo community concerns expressed at meetings and in writing to the Land Trust.

Personally, I am particularly concerned about the lack of adequate environmental review and the idea that the projects would be granted waivers of that review.

As a side but very critical issue is the apparent characterization of those who would like to see a more community-inclusive process, which would likely be more time consuming but better for it in the long run, as nimbies. Community requests for adequate planning does not equal nimbyism.

I am also very concerned about how the proposed projects and others contemplated for future development will affect the environmentally based and confirmed constraints on the water supply and moratorium.



Hitler's Messenger:





Bolinas Museum COLLAGE: JEAN VARDA AND THE VALLEJO Gallery Talk with author Betsy Stroman Saturday, February 16 ~2 PM ~Free

Artist Jean Varda's wildly colorful life spanned monumental changes in culture and the art world. Born in 1893 by the Adriatic Sea during the Ottoman Empire, he died in 1971 in Sausalito, having spent the last twenty-five years at the heart of multi-generational counter culture of thought and the art. The old ferryboat that he lived on, the S.S. Vallejo, which he owned with artist Gordon Onslow Ford, was a gathering place for legendary artists, poets, philosophers, musicians and writers whose influences stretched from European modernists in the 1920s, to generating the first Human Be-In in 1967, San Francisco, leading to the Summer of Love.

Varda's associates included such characters as Picasso, Aldous Huxley, Henry Miller, Ruth Asawa, Allen Ginsberg, Gary Snyder, Maya Angelo and Alan Watts. Varda's art was as colorful and layered as his friendships. He was known for recycling and repurposing paper and fabric into his vibrant signature collages.

Please join us for a lively talk as author Betsy Stroman shares tales from her book The Art and Life of Jean Varda, where she has captured the spirit of her subject. Stroman will answer questions and sign books after the talk.

The BCLT wanted to take this opportunity to let you know that we have received a third gift of land, the vacant lot across the street from John's Store. You may have noticed that, thanks to the work of Al Rodas, a lot of cleanup has already been completed.


Like the parcel at the Tacherra Ranch, it was given to us by an anonymous donor, with the stipulation that we build affordable rental housing there. Both gifts have also come with the promise of covering construction costs provided we can get through the planning and permitting phases of pre-development.

As a community, we are extremely lucky to be receiving this gift. The BCLT is tremendously grateful both for the confidence this donor has shown in us and for the opportunity to create so many homes. We recognize that these two projects will have a profound effect upon our little town and to this end we would like to open up the discussion and process to anyone who would like to participate. On March 23rd we will be holding a meeting at the Community Center from 3:30pm - 5:30pm. At this meeting we will present what we know so far, and answer your preliminary questions. We will be gathering your ideas and concerns and hopefully creating a list of community members who would be interested in joining a working group to help the BCLT get these projects done. We believe this opportunity is too big and important to be carried out by us alone and for this reason we will be looking for broad community representation on our project committees.

For the time being, the BCLT will be leasing parking rights to the Coast Café and Smiley's, both of whom require this additional parking for employees as a condition for their operation permits. You may see occasional consulting professionals, such as surveyors walking the lots. Both Smiley's and the Coast Café will be granted permission to use the lots to assist with their operations, but we assure you that every phase of our projects will be made public and that our process will be transparent.


