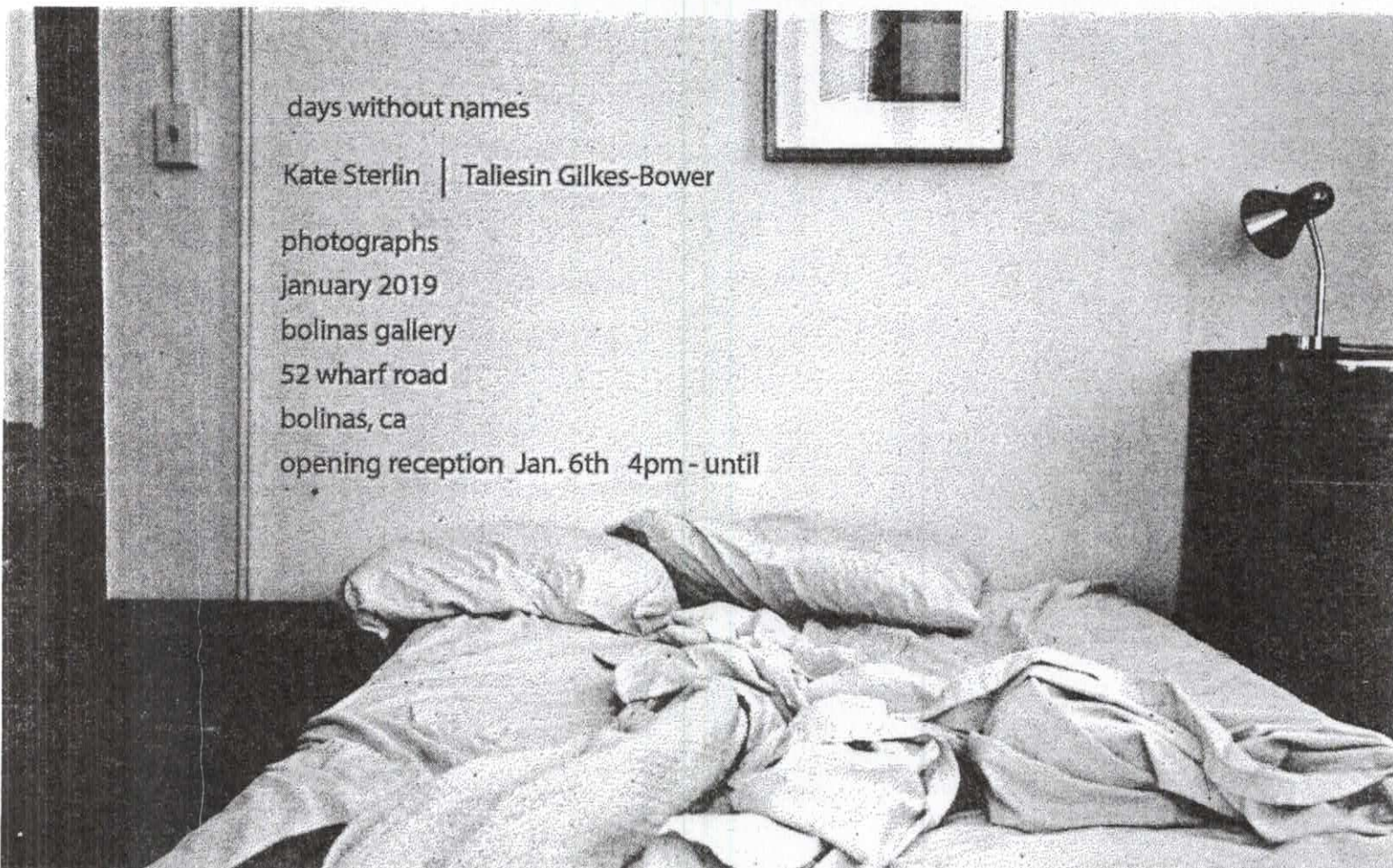
Avengers: Infinity War (2018)

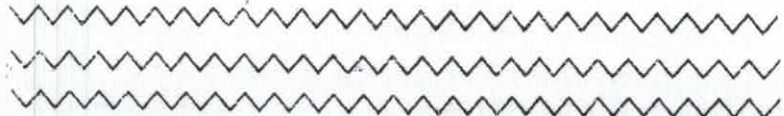

Making Water

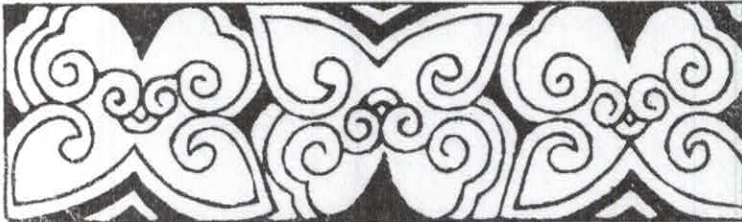
