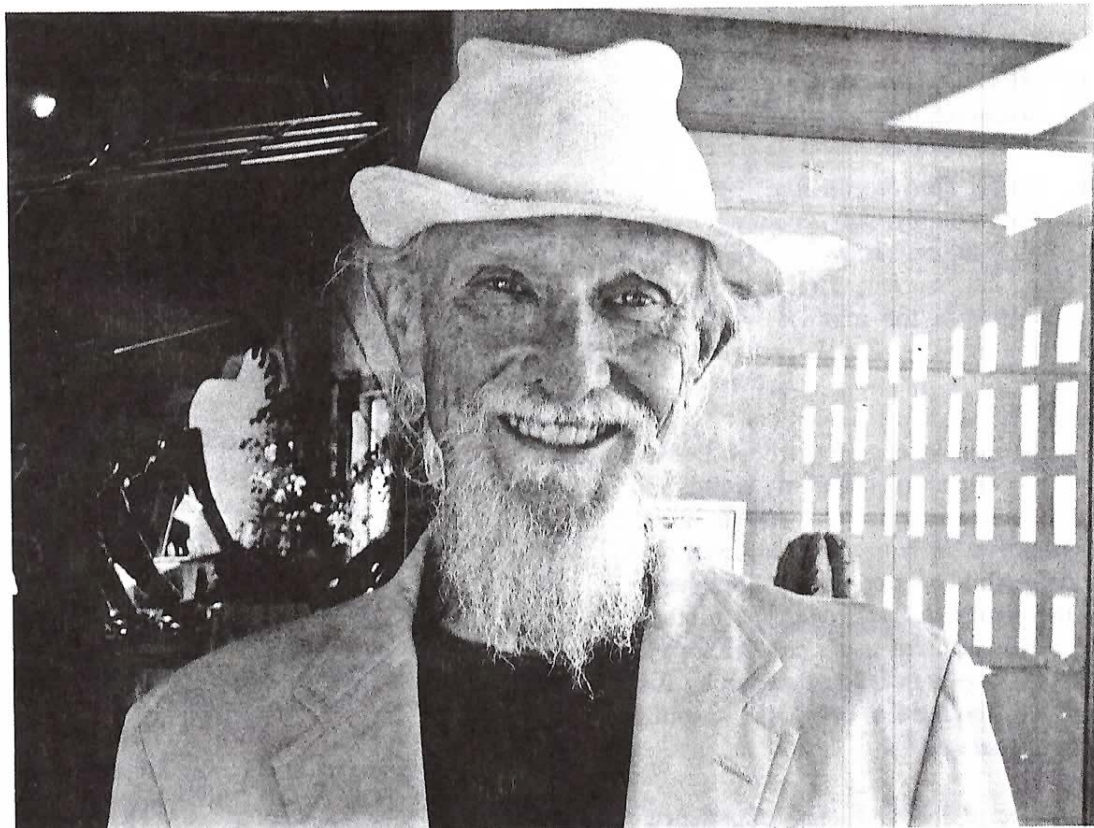

True "Sea" Stories- Saturday, Oct. 26th, St. Aidan's (6:30-music, 7pm stories)

I copied the idea for *True Stories* some years ago after seeing the monthly story reading event *Spark* in Santa Monica. They have a theme: vacation, blue, fathers, etc. The structure is: personal, true story 6 to 8 minutes when read aloud. No intros or titles. People just read one after the other.

My brother was reading a story there, so I went and was transported to different worlds. I became the woman who got polio after swimming in a river in India, I remembered my own birth story while hearing a woman tell hers, I hijacked the plane to Oaxaca with my brother (actually, I really did...but that's another story), I felt the pain of the man being dumped by his model girlfriend, and the fear of the man coming out as gay to his parents.

We were connected in our human experience. Even if the details of the story did not fit my own, the emotions were familiar. It was the best entertainment in town. Nothing phony about it. Just regular people's personal true stories. And, we all have them. Plus, I loved the refreshments served afterwards: peanut butter sandwiches and veggies for those of us who had not had dinner, and of course cookies and sweets for those who had. There was wine and coffee offered as well. All for \$10!

The show was packed. Obviously, others crave true, deeper connections, too. I was moved, entertained, and inspired. I vowed to create (copy) the same format in Los Barriles, Baja California where we live 9 months of the year. I did not impose a theme. It is a small town like here, and I wasn't even sure if I'd get enough readers. But, through encouraging, cajoling, and coercion, I did. My husband who doesn't go to many events if he doesn't have to and who in general doesn't like plays, loved it and echoed my thoughts, "This is the best entertainment in town."

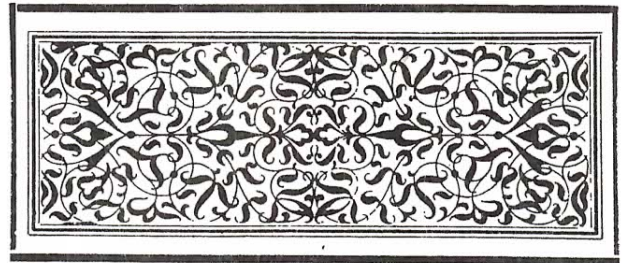
Since then, I have organized seven *True Stories* there and they are always real, entertaining, and

popular. I decided to organize one in Bolinas to become more present here, get to know people, and give people a chance to get to know each other better.

Not being full time here, I had to use more serious tactics to rally readers, but so far I have organized two here (Jane did a third at the library that I hear was super successful), and one in Stinson. (There, I felt like a telemarketer or door-to-door salesman as I cold called people and walked from business to business rallying writers). That one was great, too, with many Bolinas people participating and in the audience. From these events, I have gotten to know people in a deeper way. I encourage everyone to share their stories.

This time, I have a theme: "Sea" or "Water." Some of the readers are: Claudia Chapline, Elizabeth Vezzani, Camilla Ford, StuArt Chapman, and more! So, come see True "Sea" Stories, Oct. 26th at St. Aidan's, 6:30 refreshments and sea music by Adam Chinchilla, 7pm stories start. Enjoy "folks like you and me" reading their personal/true stories. And, think about telling your own next time!

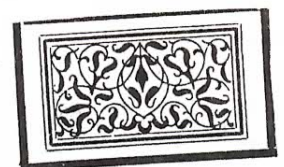

LOVE IS ALL YOU NEED....OR IS IT?

If love of Bolinas and a desire to preserve and protect its character and community were the only necessary qualifications for serving on the BCPUD, then all of the six candidates for the three seats up for election would be unquestionably qualified.

But, as I saw over the many years that my husband, Jack McClellan, was on the board, there is a lot more to the job than that.

After listening to the candidates at the candidates' night last week, I must agree with Don Smith and Jennie Pfeiffer in their strong recommendations for:

LYNDON COMSTOCK: He impressed me with his emphasis on the operations aspect of the Board's responsibilities, and with his understanding of the need for balance between spending money for maintenance and upgrade of the system, and saving money so that our already high water rates don't become even more burdensome.

When the conversation turned to the way the BCPUD is our de facto forum for all kinds of community issues, often with no relation to the BCPUD's core functions, I was pleased to hear that while Lyndon expressed an understanding and acceptance of that role for the Board, he also stood firmly for the proposition that the core functions must receive all the attention they demand. He has already done a lot of homework on the infrastructure, and has extensive experience in finance and on nonprofit boards. I think we're very fortunate that he is willing to take a turn on the BCPUD.

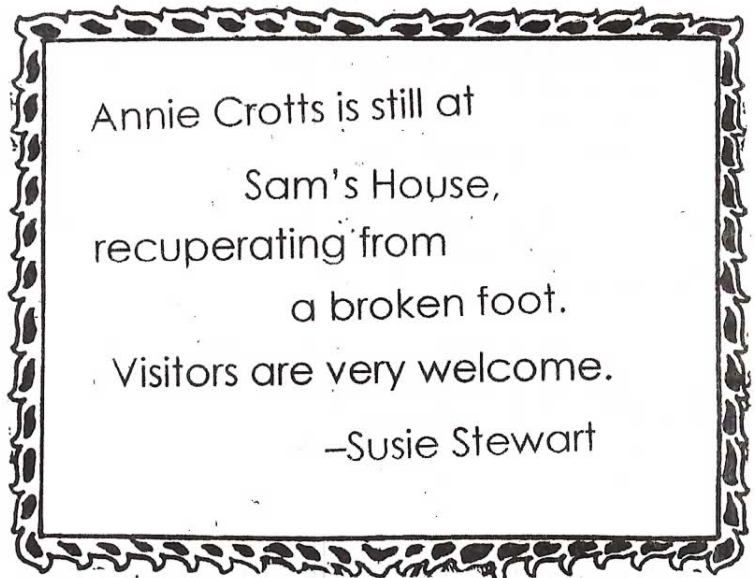
GRACE GODINO: I am impressed by her long history of community participation both in her prior life in


Sausalito and here at the Bolinas School. Her comments and demeanor lead me to believe that her reputation for being intelligent, thoughtful, and skilled in interpersonal relations is well deserved. I think she would be a quick study on the nuts and bolts issues. I like the fact that she is extensively familiar with local families and interested in educating them about water conservation and other BPCUD issues that affect them. I believe she also would be an asset in our relations with the County, which frequently require both tact and firmness.

JACK SIEDMAN: Despite his long tenure on the Board, he is willing to keep going for another term. Amazing! His experience and historical knowledge of BCPUD matters would continue to serve us well, especially at a time when there will be two freshman directors to be brought up to speed.

And by the way, I'm also going to VOTE YES on MEASURE I. Mesa Park is an asset to the community, even to those who do not use it themselves. We all know that physical activity is good for health. \$49 yearly is very little to spend to provide the kind of outdoor facilities that enhance our community life.



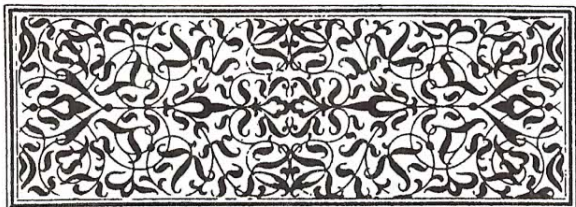
In our move some things were taken to the free box by over zealous helpers, including some baby photos, of me, as well as Viv and some old photos of my grandfather from the 1930's.
