The sea along Marin's coast has risen 8 inches since records began to be kept. The best science available says it will rise substantially more in coming years. The CSMART project ("Collaboration: Sea-level Marin Adaptation Response Team") is working to bring communities together to better understand the nature of the challenge and examine possible responses.

The October workshops are the second set of public meetings. However, anyone who missed the first meeting describing the science behind the work and the overall project scope can get that background at the [www.MarinSLR.org](http://www.MarinSLR.org) website.

Participants will collaborate on articulating the values, resources and assets that could be vulnerable to rising seas. Attendees are invited to bring photos of the things that make Marin's coast a special place.

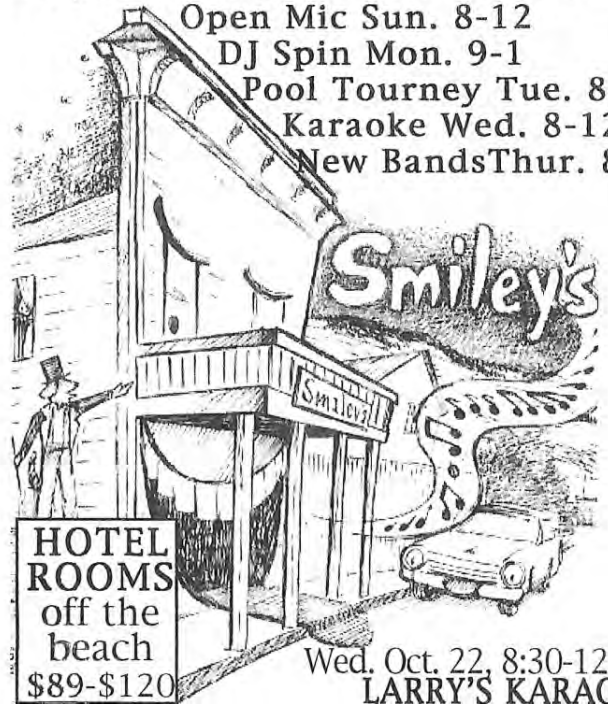

Duxbury Reef, at the edge of the Bolinas headland, is named for a ship from Massachusetts that briefly ran aground on the reef in the Gold Rush era, but the three miles of rough reef rock has been the scene of many ship wrecks. It is the largest shale reef in North America and its rock is sturdy enough to withstand the ocean, yet soft enough for such organisms as sea urchins, chitons and rock boring clams to make countless niches for themselves and others. The reef and its surrounding waters are home and resource to billions of organisms in an ecosystem of astonishing complexity.

Reef inhabitants must withstand the fierce environment of pounding waves, and inundation alternating with exposure to drying sun and wind and predators and generations of human visitors to the reef who have trampled reef life and carried off countless buckets of animals and seaweed--from Bay area families foraging food, scientists over-collecting, to casual visitors or bus loads of school children- all with unintended but devastating effect on the fragile balance of this ecosystem.

Conservation of Duxbury Reef was instigated by Gordon Chan, a marine biology professor at College of Marin, in the 1960s. Yet it took decades more to protect the reef as it is today-- under firm state and federal regulations, with Marin County Parks jurisdiction of the upland area.

**Our human experience of the reef is enriched if we know how to respect and protect this ecosystem while learning about its fascinating inhabitants. On Saturday October 25, the Bolinas Museum presents Ocean Wonders: Sea & Sunset tour, (by reservation) a tide pool etiquette walk with Bruce Bowser, who serves on the Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary (GFNMS) Advisory Council and is a trained reef docent for the GFNMS and the California Academy of Sciences' Rocky Shore Partnership.**

Bowser has dedicated much of his adult life to grassroots and environmental non-profit work. His lifelong passion for ocean advocacy led him to the GFNMS Advisory Council in 2006, where he also chaired the working group that developed the Bolinas Lagoon Ecosystem Restoration Project. His deep commitment to preservation and his joy in sharing the wonder of Duxbury Reef are contagious. **Tour space is limited so please make your reservation now by calling (415) 868-0330. \$20 general / \$15 Bolinas Museum members. ### The Excessive \$9 million School Bond Tax

- > There are many horrific aspects to this Bond, and the excuses for it.
  - >- There is no Plan.
  - >- Apparently the School Board has so little respect for the Community they didn't have a town meeting to discuss options.
  - >- The School Board and Superintendent ignored their duty to notify the Community when arguments were due. That is why there is no negative argument on the ballot.
  - >- And, with one Board member holding on to what used to be a rotating position at the Hearsay News- there is no excuse for that!
  - >- The new Superintendent apparently thinks there is a problem that the school buildings are from 30-50 years old.
  - >- Our homes are older than that - so what!
  - >- As usual the Board acts like there is no problem that parents are driving kids over the hill for math instruction, since they can't get it here.
  - >- Same attitude about test scores.
  - >- New buildings will not increase learning.
  - >- No way is it the job of the school to increase property values.
  - >- If Board members want to own an expensive farm, they need to spend time fundraising, not soaking taxpayers.
  - >- Because this is a Bond, stretched Seniors will not be excluded. And no guarantee of Local Labor.
  - >- Since they only need 55% to vote yes, almost 1/2 the town can be opposed and still forced to pay!
  - >- This is a Blank Check for School Board/ Admin with little *oversight* from hand picked committee. Show up and vote no or you may regret it.
- If we stay silent, our voices will be drowned out and our values will be trampled by special interests.
- >- Only those for whom Bolinas is their Primary Residence are entitled to vote here. Renters should vote no on this. This reminds many of us of another School Board that thought they were oh, so entitled to do what they wanted. We finally won a lawsuit, after 4 years, and proceeded to build our beautiful schools. 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## KNOW YOUR BO

On November 23, 1914, the ship *Hanalei* lost her way in the fog off Duxbury Reef. The Marconi Wireless Station telegraphed San Francisco and two tug boats were sent, but there was nothing they could do. 23 people died in the crash and rescue effort, leading Representative William Kent to introduce a bill in February, 1915, asking for the State to give \$20,000 to build a fully staffed lifesaving station. Bureaucracy never worked so fast. By summer of 1915, a new station was built across from Kent Island. It had eleven crew members and a cook and operated until 1946, but no major shipwreck ever put them to the test. And a good thing too, for the crew "had a hard time getting its boats in and out of the lagoon at low tide." The station is now owned by the College of Marin.
