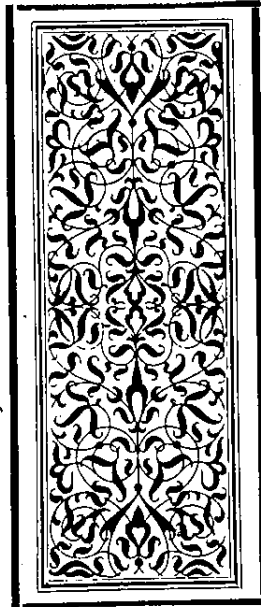

Cathedral Grove

At Van Wyck meadows I came upon my first real barrier - a sign at Bootjack trail which said, "Closed for repairs." But Christsake, it always says that! So, I stepped around the sign (where on the other side it didn't say nothing) and followed the trail down along Redwood creek, surprised to find water still running while the world I'd left outside was all hot and dry.

This was last Tuesday. I decided I wanted to visit Muir Woods while the government was sleeping. So, I went in the back way from Pan Toll and soon discovered why Bootjack was closed: parts of it had completely washed away; trees had fallen across it and been left there; and one bridge just ended half way over a gorge.... But on the bright side, it was beautiful and there was nobody around to tell me not to go into Muir Woods; besides, the only dangerous part of a trail is our misplaced trust in trails, and bridges, and governments, etc, whatever.... So I walked on down along the singing stream into the dim and silent woods.

I never particularly liked Muir Woods National Monument, and I'm not alone. Sure, people come from all over the world to visit, but notice how quickly they go away and never return; it's one of those places you visit once when you want to see California and have only five days to see it. Myself, I prefer the heights - climbing upwards in a futile search for perspective.

As I descended into the monument I wondered at my aversion to it. It was so beautiful: little chapels all made of circled redwood trees appeared, illuminated; redwood pillars and redwood pews and a carpet of soft mulch where offerings of green sorrel seemed lit by candlelight.

One possibility (and it's just a thought) is, we leave our house to go outside - but, like I said, I'd now left the outside world. So, where was I? The great indoors? Unsettling.

The stream widened, but the water no longer sang. More barriers appeared and yellow caution tape, but still there was no one to stop me. So, I entered Muir Woods in much the same way Jack had entered the giant's lair.

Another possibility can be expressed in the axiom "Hell is other people." Just do the math. It's estimated that nearly one million people visit Muir Woods every year. Devide that by 365 and we get about 2,700 visitors a day! Crowded.

But when I entered Cathedral Grove all those people were conspicuously absent... and the chapel analogy expanded into the ruins of a gothic cathedral where light filtered through branch and needles (like stained glass) fell to the forest floor in parallel lines to reveal someone praying.

A third possibility is political: where one group of people preserve a world both from and for another group of people - there's a palpable tension here, and even I, all alone in that vast hall, felt it. But I'm not much of a preservationist, or a good consumer - so, I sat there in Cathedral Grove for about forty five minutes, stealing the experience from a world of unintended marvels; till finally the thought came to me - the thought they wanted me to think: "This is how it must have been before people." but I quickly drop that and flip it on it's head, No, "This is how it will look when all the people are gone." which is another thing entirely.
