Measure X and a Bolinas Solution

We have been going round and round regarding the merits and problems of Measure X with no conclusive resolution. It seems that the issue being debated is that Measure X is an anti homeless issue or is it a street management issue. Is there any solution that address both in a fair and Bolinas like fashion? Below find a proposal presented to BPUD months ago by a participant in community expression around managing down town camping. It provides for the implementation of overnight parking controls and vehicle storage being proposed in Measure X while presenting an option for accommodation of campers based on individual willingness to express their commitment to an open community through personal action. Unlike recent posts this eliminates the battle over turf and places the responsibility for action directly on individual conscious. Implementation of a registry and the passage of Measure X would be progress for everyone rather than kicking the can down the road to fester until is resurrected in an even more contentious debate. Check it out.

Is there another way? A win-win solution!

All over the country camper communities are appearing next to freeways, in and around industrial areas or in blighted urban districts. Generally these communities are allowed to exist because they are removed from the edges of high visibility, high use community areas.

Is this what we want for our downtown? THERE MUST BE A BETTER WAY!

At one of the early BPUD meetings regarding Measure X a neighbor from the Mesa suggested that Bolinas establish a registry of sponsors who would be willing to provide a parking place on their property for campers needing accommodation. This would offer a conscious-driven option to the unmanaged camping that currently exists on Brighton Avenue and represent a Bolinas-like solution to the issue of uncontrolled and unmanaged misuse of downtown streets.

Because Bolinas has many large open residential lots providing a small pad for camping would be feasible. The control in this proposal is that the interest of individuals to support their convictions and provide space would establish a limit-based on citizen tolerance. The numbers of campers that could be accommodated by the town would be limited by the willingness of the town folk to provide spaces. It would decentralize the density impact that currently exists downtown and allow the restrictions on downtown camping by tourists to be implemented.

This proposal breaks up the all-too-familiar urban encampment, provides a much less intrusive distribution of campers and provides an opportunity for participating neighbors to interact and directly support a person that might be in need.

It is a less divisive approach to accommodation for those in need without sacrificing the character of the down town neighborhood... a uniquely Bolinas solution to a national problem.

Maggie Gyllenhaal Gael Garcia Bernal



ELECTION DAY APPROACHES

The days are whizzing by and soon it will be time to vote. Measure W is my personal issue in this election. I have watched too many of my friends and neighbors be priced out of homes to rent or buy and have to leave. This dwindling supply of affordable permanent rentals hollows out our neighborhoods and the dwindling school population is a reflection of this negative dynamic.

Short-term rentals of 2nd, 3rd or 4th homes have become the norm. Our fire departments are overworked and stretched thin. Measure W is one response to this problem. It establishes a 4% West Marin hotel tax (Transient Occupancy Tax) on all overnight lodging. 

walk down Brighton and Park Avenues in Bolinas presents one with bumper to bumper old campers, cargo vans, trailers, storage units and cars that no longer function! Many of the occupants of these vehicles have created campsites for themselves with awnings, lounge chairs, and barbecues.

During the week there is limited parking for visitors and residents; there are no available parking spots at all on weekends when surfers jam their vehicles into every nook and cranny they can find. Many of these surfers spend a night or two or three parked on the street or in front of residents' homes, spreading their equipment and camping gear over garden beds and fences, cooking, and

partying

In keeping with the town's history of public input, the issue of street camping, living in vehicles and long term vehicle storage has been considered over a three year period by a representative subcommittee of BCPUD. The committee recommended in favor of regulation of overnight parking and vehicle storage on the downtown streets as a first step. The result of this is Measure X, which introduces a parking regulation as the only clear way that County planners and legal advisors see as the way to address the problems outlined.

All of us are deeply aware of and sympathetic to people who are homeless. We are willing and able to work with others in Bolinas to find a solution. But we maintain that our unincorporated little village is not equipped to be responsible to accommodate short or long term campers in a sanitary or safe manner in our

streets.

The word is out, internet-broadcasted, that anything goes on the streets in Bolinas. If we do not try to regulate this use of our streets now, what is today a definable problem will become overwhelming and intractable. What will our village be like in 5 years? Ten years? Twenty years? Shall our community goodwill be exploited? Shall our village be a public campground or a residential area with a downtown community commons. It's up to us.

For the sake of Bolinas, vote "Yes" on Measure X!

Water-use misunderstanding led to misstatement in Bolinas voter pamphlet



Mistakes aren't always corrected before print time. Last month, the authors of the argument for Measure X, which proposes that the county enact a resolution to regulate overnight parking on downtown streets in Bolinas, reached out to the elections office too late to correct a misstatement about the town's water usage in the voter pamphlet.


In their rebuttal to the argument against the advisory measure, they state that downtown water usage in Bolinas is "100 percent over normal," attributing the statistic to a statement by the general manager of the Bolinas Community Public Utility District at a July meeting. "It is reasonable to surmise that a significant strain on our town's scarce water supply is related to its use by transient habitants," the rebuttal, signed by five Bolinas residents, states.

Yet Jennifer Blackman, the utility district's general manager, said the residents seem to have misunderstood the information she provided at the meeting. Ms. Blackman did say during her report on the district's quarterly data that June was the 10th month in a row of increased water consumption throughout town. She also detailed that the largest water users were the local visitor-serving businesses, all of which had increased water use over the summer, though she described that as typical. To the Light this week she added that the district has not specifically analyzed the water use impact of select water users. And though the district has not compiled a full year's worth of data, she said if she were to hazard a guess, total water usage in Bolinas was at least 10 percent higher than the year before.

Joyce Clements, one of the rebuttal's authors who had provided the information from the utility district meeting, emphasized that the error—and the failure to correct it before the voter pamphlets were finalized—were honest mistakes.




