**Paying Less for Cleaner Energy**

Many *Hearsay* readers will have heard about the People’s Climate March that took place in Manhattan twelve days ago. While crowd counting is an imprecise science, the march’s organizers claim that 400,000 people rallied in-and-around Central Park to demand a swift and just transition to a low-carbon economy. Solidarity actions were held around the world, including here in the Bay.

Discussing the march in his NYT blog, Andrew Revkin predicts a long haul on the path towards clean energy. “And”, he writes, “that’s not just because fossil fuel interests are reluctant to let go of power. It’s because industrialized societies around the world remain pretty content with the comforts, convenience and low real-time costs that come with status-quo energy choices. The long-term costs from global warming have a hard time competing.”

And so it used to be with solar. For most people, solar’s high upfront cost and decade-long payback outweighed the long-term financial and environmental benefits. That was before the solar lease. In 2008, SolarCity introduced a novel solar lease option, which allows qualifying homeowners to go solar for little-to-no cost. Rather than paying for panels or installation, the customer simply pays for energy at predictable costs that are less than PG&E.

A solar lease is similar to a power purchase agreement (PPA) – a term readers may have also encountered. Such arrangements are collectively referred to as third-party energy sales. In some states, it is forbidden for entities other than Public Utilities to sell energy, but in states where third-party energy sales are permitted, they have become the dominant vector for residential solar. Twenty-two states and the District of Columbia allow third-party energy sales. Of the top ten U.S. states for solar

(PV) capacity added in 2013 – CA, NC, AZ, NJ, TX, MA, HI, NM, NV, NY – North Carolina is the only one that does not allow third-party sales. (Besides a generous state renewable energy tax credit of 35%, I attribute North Carolina’s success in this arena to the talent and hard work of the faculty and staff at Appalachian State University, my alma mater.)

Not all houses are suitable for solar, and SolarCity requires a minimum FICO score for pay-as-you-go options. If you could pay less for clean energy than you are currently paying for dirty energy, would you do it?

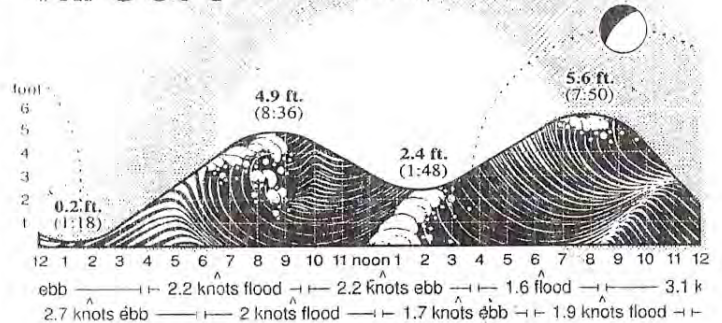

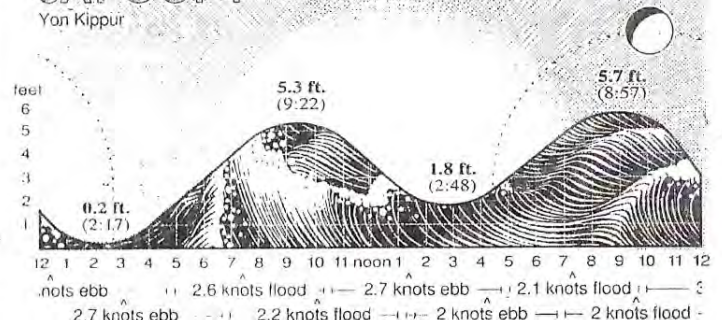

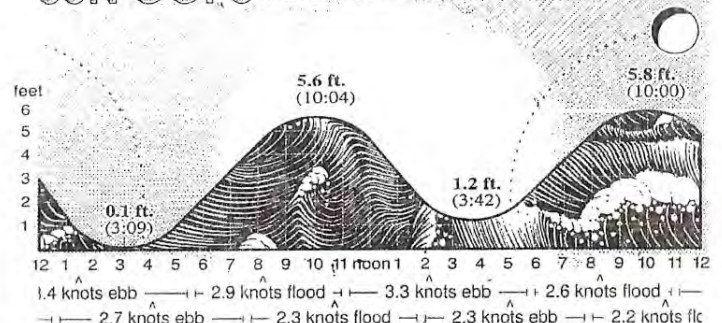
