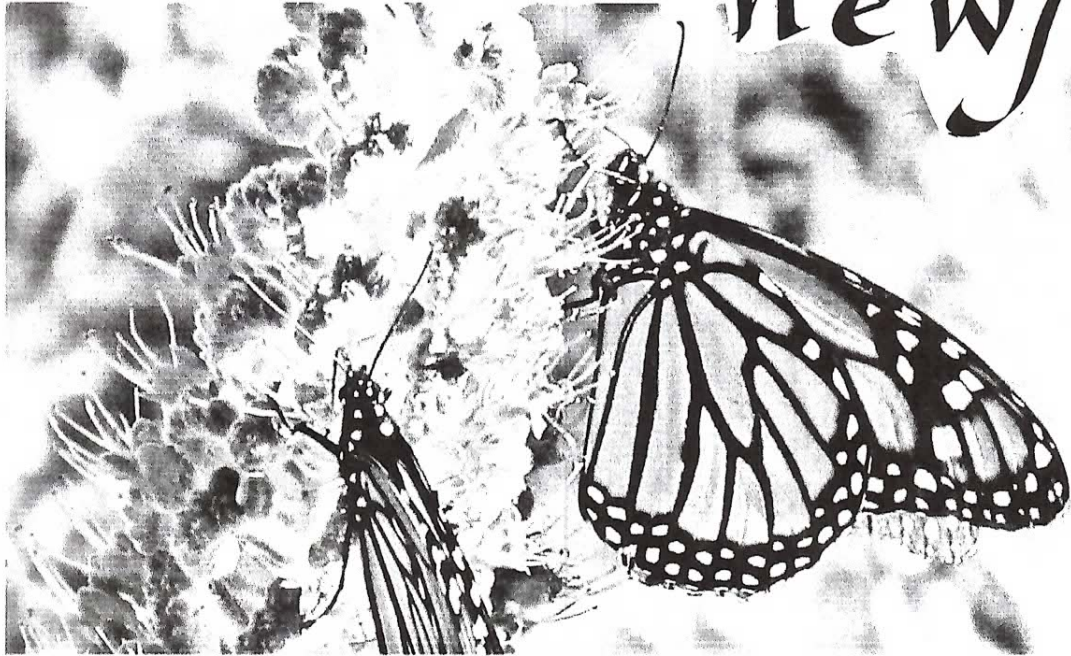

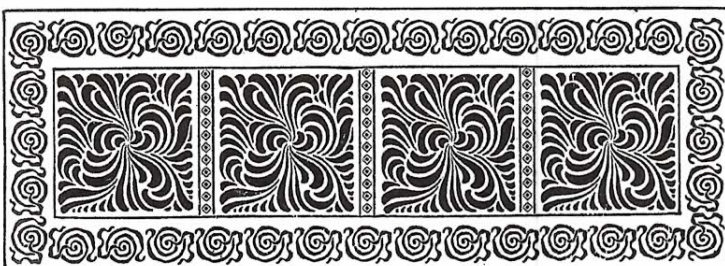

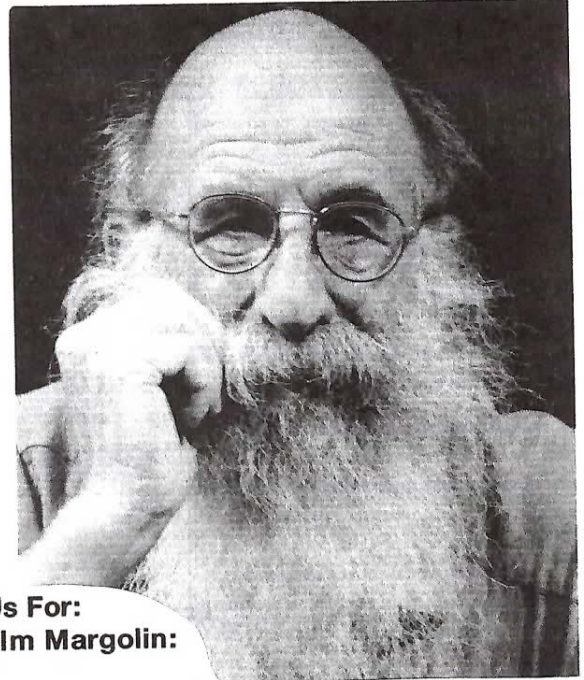

6 seek utility district posts, call to 'keep Bolinas as is'

Most residents like Bolinas pretty much the way it is, and there are few issues in a low-key contest for three seats on the community public utility district board.

Six candidates including attorney Jack Siedman, a veteran incumbent who has served since 1993, are in the running for posts at stake on the November ballot. Incumbents Barbara Beth Kimball and Kimberly Jeanne Bender are not seeking re-election.

"I don't think we have any big issues," said the 59-year-old Siedman, who holds a law degree from Hastings and a bachelor's in political science from the University of California at Los Angeles. "We all support preservation of the town like it is."

Others in the race are therapist Grace Godino, photographer Bill Braasch, retirees Remick Hart and Lyndon Comstock, and sign painter Stuart Chapman. Chapman, a local artist, did not return a half dozen calls seeking comment on his candidacy.

The interest of candidates in serving is an indication of community spirit, Siedman said. "It's not like there is any dissension."

Comstock, 63, a 20-year resident of Bolinas who worked in the nonprofit community development field, is pretty much in accord with Siedman's outlook.

"Calling it a race really doesn't describe Bolinas," Comstock said. "All the candidates are congenial."

Comstock, who holds a master's in business administration from the University of California at Berkeley and a bachelor's in psychology from the University of Michigan, embraces the community's long tradition of environmental activism and said the utility district has done a good job. He said he will work on "fine tuning" progress in water filtration and reduction in the use of chemicals while studying the need to improve aging facilities.

Braasch, 66, a 10-year resident of Bolinas who holds a degree in math and physics from Lewis University in Illinois, said he wants to "hold the line on where Bolinas is, and make sure the water moratorium stays in place." More awareness is needed, he added, especially among newcomers, of the historical restrictions that have made Bolinas a special place.

Keeping Bolinas as is, he added, is a view shared by all candidates. "You're not going to find anybody with a different platform," he noted. "This is Bolinas."

Remick Hart, 67, whose family has lived in Bolinas since 1921, agreed with other candidates that the contest for the utility board doesn't really feature any driving issues. "The existing board has done a fabulous job."

Hart, who holds a bachelor's in business administration from California State University at Hayward, said it's critical to "keep things the same" in Bolinas while seeking to improve district procedures, water management, facilities, safety and related matters.

Godino, 56, a counselor, librarian and reading instructor at Bolinas School for two decades, holds a bachelor's in English from Mills College and a master's in psychology from Dominican University. She is a licensed marriage and family therapist.

Godino said she is running because she loves the community and has the time to serve, and wants to offer her skills as someone who listens, reflects and remains calm. She noted she provides a feminine perspective that is important as the two women on the panel retired.



Fred Wahpepah, a native American elder living in Richmond, California, is providing an opportunity for a growing community of people to participate in traditional ceremonies from Native American traditions. Born in rural Oklahoma in 1930, Fred is of the Kickapoo and Sac-and-Fox tribes.

He began carrying the Sacred Pipe in 1978 and has been involved in the Sacred Sundance Ceremony every year since 1977. He is now dedicated to the Indian ways and to the reawakening and preservation of the Earth centered spirituality of his forbears, with a special interest in sharing Native wisdom with people from all nations. By conducting traditional Sweat Lodge and Pipe Ceremonies as well as leading traditional Vision Quests, Fred is galvanizing a community of people interested in nurturing and supporting each other on their spiritual paths. Through classroom presentations, lectures and workshops, this respected elder educates and inspires children and adults to the present day importance of traditional spirituality and reverence for our earth. His gift for speaking is reflected in his use of story telling and warm interaction with his listeners. Fred is committed to serving the community with his compassion, skills, and knowledge.

Fred has always shared his spiritual gifts with people of all nations who wanted to walk the red road. This has never brought much money into Fred's life, though they can pay a fair rent. They and their 2 dogs are looking for a small 2 bedroom home.

Fred is one of the last true Native American elders in the Bay Area.
