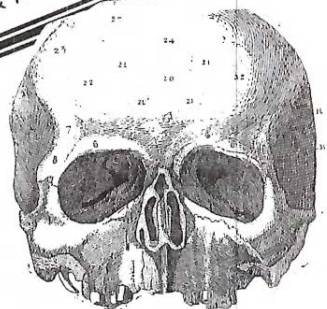

CALL FOR MARCONI/RCA HISTORY & ARTIFACTS

Next year marks the 100th Anniversary of the Bolinas & Marshall Marconi/RCA Radio Stations that played a dynamic role in the history of international communications and the development of Coastal Marin. To honor this 100th year milestone in 2014 the Bolinas Museum is partnering with the Point Reyes National Seashore and other organizations to create multidisciplinary presentations of history and art about the stations, communication themes and the legacy of wireless radio in Coastal Marin.

The two organizations are now reaching out to the public to find information and memorabilia. Do you have stories, information, objects, photos, documents or other things of interest that relate to this great history that you'd like to share?

Marconi (1874-1937) was an Italian inventor, entrepreneur and businessman who pioneered the first worldwide wireless and radiotelegraph communications system, for which he shared the 1909 Nobel Prize in physics. His inventions and Morse code wireless radio service were the vanguard of communication technology and served as an essential link in the development of today's ever more sophisticated technology.

In 1914 the Marconi system was extended to Coastal Marin as part of his ambitious global communication network. A high-powered transmitting station was built in Bolinas and a grand receiving station in Marshall. Marconi's network linked California with Asia and Europe and also provided critical ship-to-shore-to-ship communications across the Pacific Ocean. In Coastal Marin County, Marconi and the later RCA stations had a dynamic impact on our communities, bringing technology (including electricity to Bolinas), jobs for locals and an injection of new people from other parts of the nation. In 1919 Radio Corporation of America (RCA) bought the Marconi sites and then in 1939 developed an important short wave station in the ranch land of Point Reyes Peninsula. Today the Bolinas site is part of the Point Reyes National Seashore and leased by Commonwealth. The Marshall site is now the Marconi Conference Center. When the RCA station on Point Reyes Peninsula closed, the complex equipment was left intact. Now many people locally and worldwide who are passionate about wireless radio, including the Maritime Radio Historical Society, consider this site to be a national treasure.

This is an important story and an exciting public project that will need months of preparation and help from you, members of our communities. Led by Carola DeRooy archivist of Point Reyes National Seashore Museum and Jennifer Gately, Executive Director of the Bolinas Museum, we are now reaching out to the public to find stories, information, objects, photos and memorabilia.

We've scheduled two days where anyone who has relevant materials or knowledge can come in and share their history with us so we know what may be available in the community.

On **Sunday, November 3rd, from 4:00 to 7:00 PM at the Bolinas Museum**, 48 Wharf Road in Bolinas, the Museum's History Curator Elia Haworth will meet with you to document your offerings. Or, **Tuesday November 5th at the Red Barn Classroom** by the Point Reyes National Seashore Headquarters where Archivist Carola DeRooy will be available to meet with you from **1:00 to 4:00 PM**.

Malibu Rules!



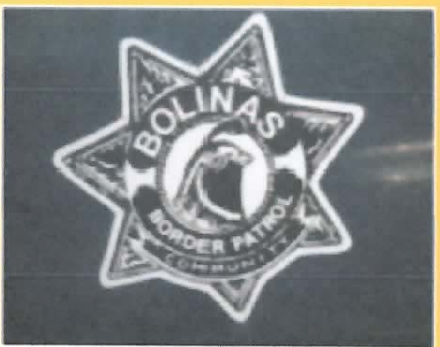
