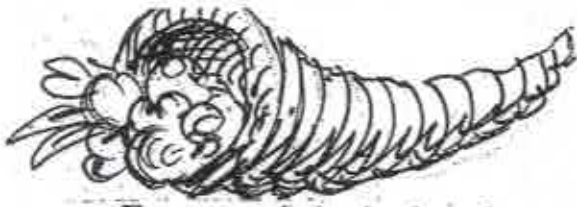

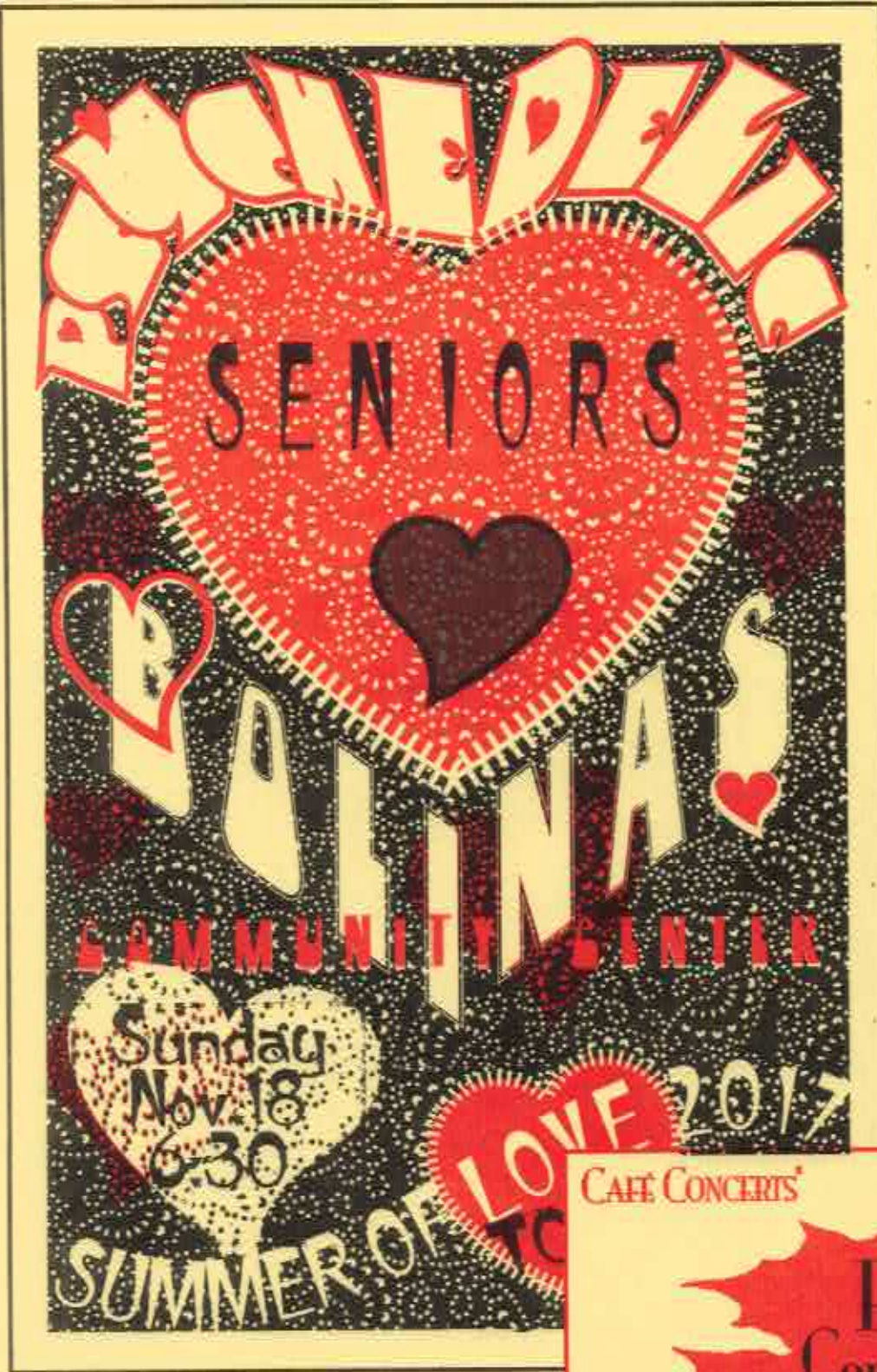

Art by 46 coastal Marin artists and others awaits visitors to the Bolinas Museum exhibitions that open with a holiday party this Saturday, Nov. 18. The "Hardly Strictly Mini: A Biennial Benefit Exhibition" presents small works for sale by 70 Bay Area artists, selected by lottery and nomination.

This is the museum's 27th holiday art sale to benefit both artists and the museum. Two additional dynamic exhibitions will also open this Saturday: Sharon Beals's gorgeous large-format photographs of birds nests--many from natural history museum collections--dramatically present the remarkable innovation and architecture of the nests; and Bolinas artist Sirima Sataman carves linoleum and wood blocks to print big, dramatic black-and-white scenes from the California coast.

Everyone is invited to the 2 p.m. artist and curator talks and the holiday party and opening reception, from 3 to 5 p.m. The exhibitions show through December 31.

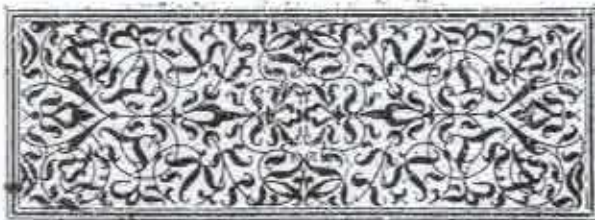
The perfectly limited menu has something for everyone — local oysters, thin-crustured meat and meatless pizza, delicious salads with flavor-paired local ingredients, and desserts that often include leftover bakery items, such as the most scrumptious cinnamon bun bread pudding. My favorite is the ubiquitous margherita pizza, which consistently is cooked so that it is moist and melted on top, yet still crunchy-crustured.

Eleven's wine list is thoughtfully diverse and, speaking of the red wines which I have happily consumed, superb. The ambiance is warm and inviting, with local art, good music and impeccable lighting. Becca and Kate, the beautiful sisters and creative VIPs in and out of the kitchen, are running the show, along with their lovely husbands and truly wonderful staff; I love this group of people.

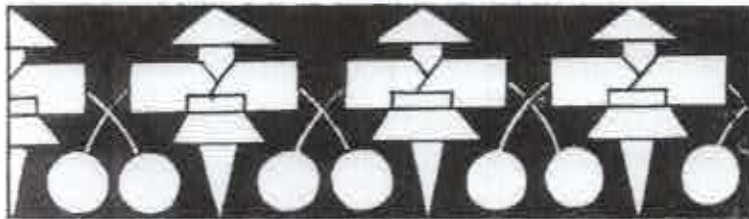

WEST MARIN FUND AWARDS \$64,500 IN GRANTS TO SUPPORT LOCAL NONPROFITS

Point Reyes Station: West Marin Fund, the community foundation serving coastal West Marin, recently awarded \$64,500 in its Autumn 2017 grants round. With ten open grant rounds in the past five years, West Marin Fund has awarded over \$550,000 to more than 65 nonprofits through its community grants program – all made possible by generous gifts from local donors to the Fund.

The Autumn 2017 grants were awarded to 28 organizations to support projects and activities that were greatly needed but for which it was hard to find funding: Successful proposals addressed a wide variety of needs, including environmental science and civic engagement for youth; vibrant and diverse community arts programming; critical technical and facility upgrades; fundraising effectiveness; and services benefitting young children, low-income families, and seniors.

The West Marin Fund is a community foundation supporting the long-term wellbeing of coastal West Marin. The Fund provides grants and training for local nonprofits convenes community members to act on important community issues, and educates full and part-time residents about community needs. The Fund serves coastal West Marin, including the communities of Muir Beach, Stinson Beach, Bolinas, Olema, Inverness Park, Inverness, Point Reyes Station, Marshall, Nicasio, Tomales, and Dillon Beach.

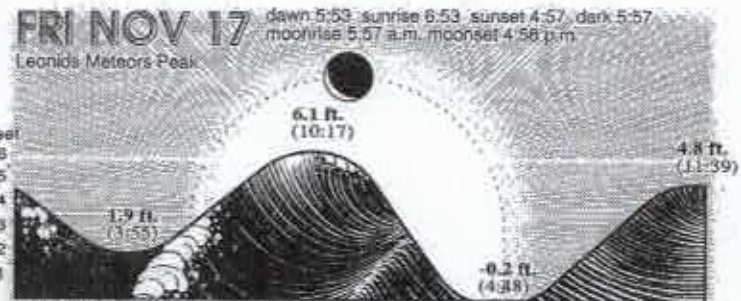
