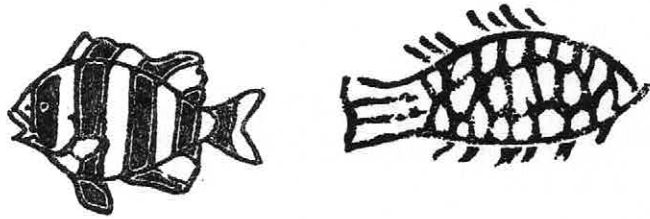

Bolinas Marine Lab Coalition Endorses Three Candidates in Marin Community College District Governing Board Member Election

Marin County, California – October 22, 2018 – The Bolinas Marine Lab Coalition is a group of citizens, scientists, educators, nonprofits and others formed in late 2017 to encourage the College of Marin to place its Bolinas Field Station back in service for hands on science training for its students and continued research with respect to the ecologically important adjacent Bolinas Lagoon and Duxbury Reef areas that has been in process since the College gained ownership of the Field Station in the 1950s. It has been closed since 2005.

The Coalition wholeheartedly endorses **George Rothbart** for Marin Community College District Governing Board Member as he has made restoring the Field Station for programmatic use by teachers and students a centerpiece of his campaign.

The Coalition also endorses incumbents **Wanden Treanor** and **Diana Conti** with the understanding that, although they have been hesitant to take action in the past, they now understand the ability of the College to place the Field Station back in service and have committed to doing so.

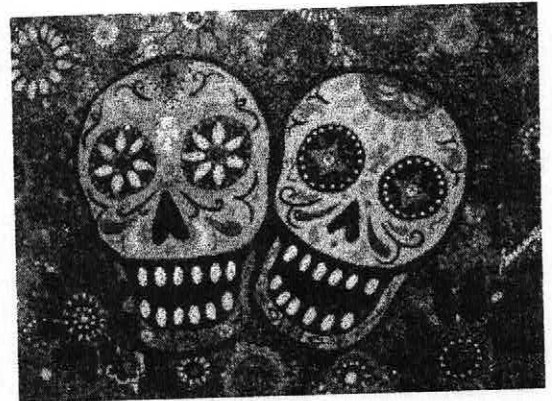
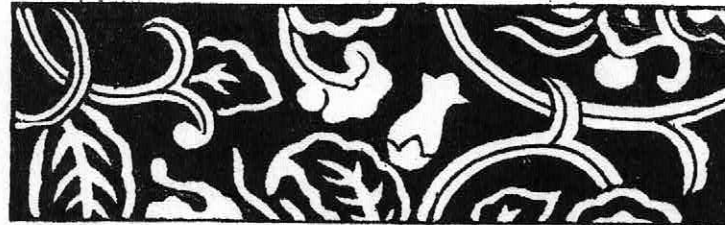

I would have this to say, speaking to whomever it may speak to – and for.

We, as it happens, are a town full of artists, philosophers, dreamers and drifters. Being of this mind we love order and serenity and when things go awry we try to communicate and reason, mitigate and placate, using the enforcement agencies only in extreme cases of real crimes. When things go in the wrong direction we try our best to remedy through dialog and compromise rather than to penalize; sometimes it takes effort and patience but I have seen this approach consistently bear fruit over my nearly four decades of living here; we enjoy a near absence of vandalism, teen rebellion, theft and violence. This shouldn't be overlooked or taken for granted – everyone reaps the benefits.

We (of this mind) are wary of restrictive laws that lead to oppression; many of us feel that this appropriately branded measure "X" carries with it the specter of authoritarianism. Oppression is the root cause of rebellion in its many forms; let's keep it out of our town.

Measure W Facts and Figures

There is concern that the TOT increase of 4% for West Marin will drive business away; this does not seem likely. There are less than 300 hotel and lodging bed available for the 2.5 million annual visitors to West Marin. The impact of the TOT increase done by the Marin Economic Forum in July 2018 titled "Raising the Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) in West Marin: An Economic Brief" found that the TOT rate hike is unlikely to reduce hotel demand. Interestingly, it notes that the average daily room rates have increased by almost 6% annually for the past 8 years. The study is on the county's website as well as ours www.w4westmarin.org under "learn more."

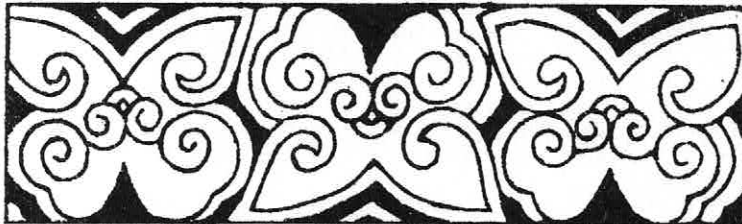

- ***Our friends and neighbors should not have to fear being victimized.***

The village, its residents and visitors deserve to feel safe and secure as community members and individuals. There are seniors, children and women who now feel anxious and/or fearful to traverse the downtown streets by themselves at night. There are no street lights and the feeling of insecurity is greatly increased by the thought of having to walk through a gauntlet of inhabited vehicles on both sides of the Avenue.

- ***Increasing population density, vehicular traffic, refuse and the use of water by overnight and long-term occupation of the streets are increasingly heavy burdens on the Bolinas infrastructure and the environment.***

We have lived here with the belief that this small piece of the planet is quiet, beautiful and precious. Over the years, we have shown our commitment to protect the earth, atmosphere and water from the degradations of sprawl, contamination, and overuse. We stopped an island and helicopter landing from being built in the lagoon. We fought for and won a water moratorium that limits use of our sparse water supply. We built a groin to stabilize Bolinas Beach – to protect the land mass and to widen the sand beach. Shall we stand by and watch as the quality of the Bolinas town center diminishes?

- ***We are allowing abuse of a precious community resource.***

The land for the Park on Brighton was purchased by financial contributions by Bolinas neighbors, led by the Avenue's residents. Townspeople worked shoulder-to-shoulder to landscape and plant the Park. The purpose: to assure a quiet, green area for folks to meet and play. There was a poets' corner where people could meet to share their writing. The Park Committee donated the area to Marin County Open space so that a tennis court and day-use sanitary facilities could be provided. These still exist. But a peaceful commons it is not; rather it serves as a junction of bush-whacked trails tracked through the plantings from every direction for easy entry to the toilets.

- ***Residents should feel assured that we as a community care about them and their quality of life.*** Many of our downtown neighbors no longer live in tranquility in their homes. They are intimidated by the fear of reprisal if they speak out. Overnight street occupancy produces mechanical and human generated noise, bustle and movement, and bright, moving light. Cooking is done over portable flames, and gear is spread in front of homes and driveways. Occupants who are vacationing come-and-go; they are not potential acquaintances or friends; they do not contribute to the community. They are here for the easy use of the town.

- ***Opponents of Measure X have ripped down over 2/3rds of the hand-made YES on X signs.*** Not only is this against the law, it is an act of disrespect for civil life in Bolinas. This is not a good way to relate to each other. This does not represent the dialogue we want to have with one another. Is this our definition of democracy?

- ***A feeling of safety and well-being is eroding throughout the community.***

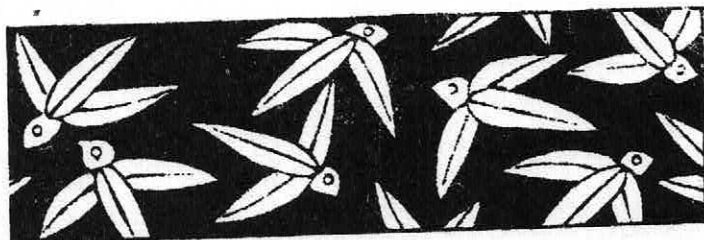
Until the last few years, almost no one in Bolinas felt they had to conscientiously attend to locking their cars and doors while downtown or at home. Now many do.

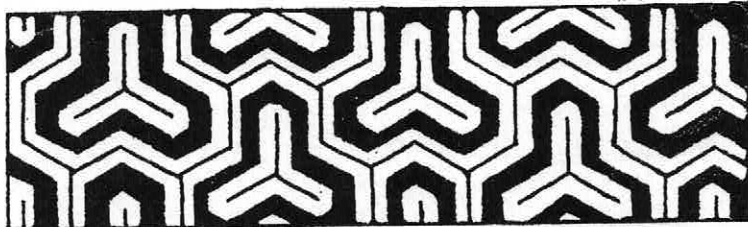

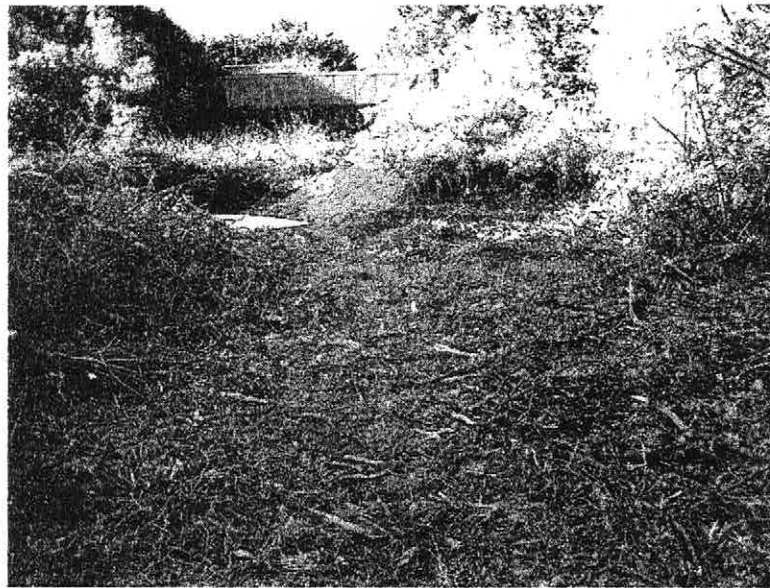
Long Term Impact of Short Term Decisions.

It was not until 1983 that the Marin Co. Supervisors voted to allow the creation of second units for the purpose of low and moderate housing in residential areas of Bolinas. (Intro- Bo. Community Plan). Under 'Housing' p.53, it states that this 'policy provides for controlled development of second units thereby ensuring that the community development and environmental qualities of Bolinas Community are met.'

Page 29, 'Wildlife Habitats' states that limiting the impact of humans on the environment is one of the most important planning objectives in the Bolinas Community Plan. Protecting the environment...plant and animal wildlife and the landscape is more than a legal obligation....The Bolinas community has repeatedly shown that environment issues are its first concern.'

I believe it is essential to both bring more affordable and low cost housing to this town. In the process, environmental respect and impacts on the neighboring areas need to be in the forefront of the decisions. An inclusive, working dialogue should not be seen as a threat but as an integral part of the process.

In the 10/12 Hearsay BCLT announced that test pits would be dug on a newly acquired property, and that the process would done carefully, and nothing more done at this time.



This lot is one of the last remaining appx. 90% intact coastal scrub habitat areas left on the Mesa. Bird populations have been recorded for this specific area. Neighbors have made a point to alert the BCLT Board as to the values inherent to it in the hopes of mitigating the impact, or even diverting the process. Six days later the inner property was cleared to simply install 6- appx. 5' x 4' test holes. Here, if it fits in paper, is a photo of a corner of the lot after the work was done.

This Sat. at the Firehouse BCLT will announce two new property acquisitions for building upon. If you pay to join at the door, you can find out where/what these are. Will they be within the same 6% of the gridded Mesa where the other projects are slated? Will one be near your residence? You would not know because the purchase negotiations are closed, meaning no info of the sale, even that the property is for sale, is available to other than the persons involved.

Many would say that this method is the only means to bring more housing. In terms of having a large budget, this may be the easiest, with respect for the fact that it does still take a lot of work.

CLAM- Pt Reye's 'Community Land Trust of West Marin' has already helped home owners create 13 new 2nd and auxiliary units. They have formed Real Community Rentals to help home owners create unique housing by offering financial assistance and guidance thru the process. As part of the housing effort, Bolinas residents could be encouraged to seek info from CLAM. Ongoing development of the green spaces, especially the very few coastal scrub native habitat ones, needs to be challenged. Remodels and in fill housing need to be prioritized. With an interest in obtaining future available water meters, and a previously stated goal of filling the schools by adding up to 40 more families (from where?) to raise each classes' enrollment, all needs to be openly discussed.



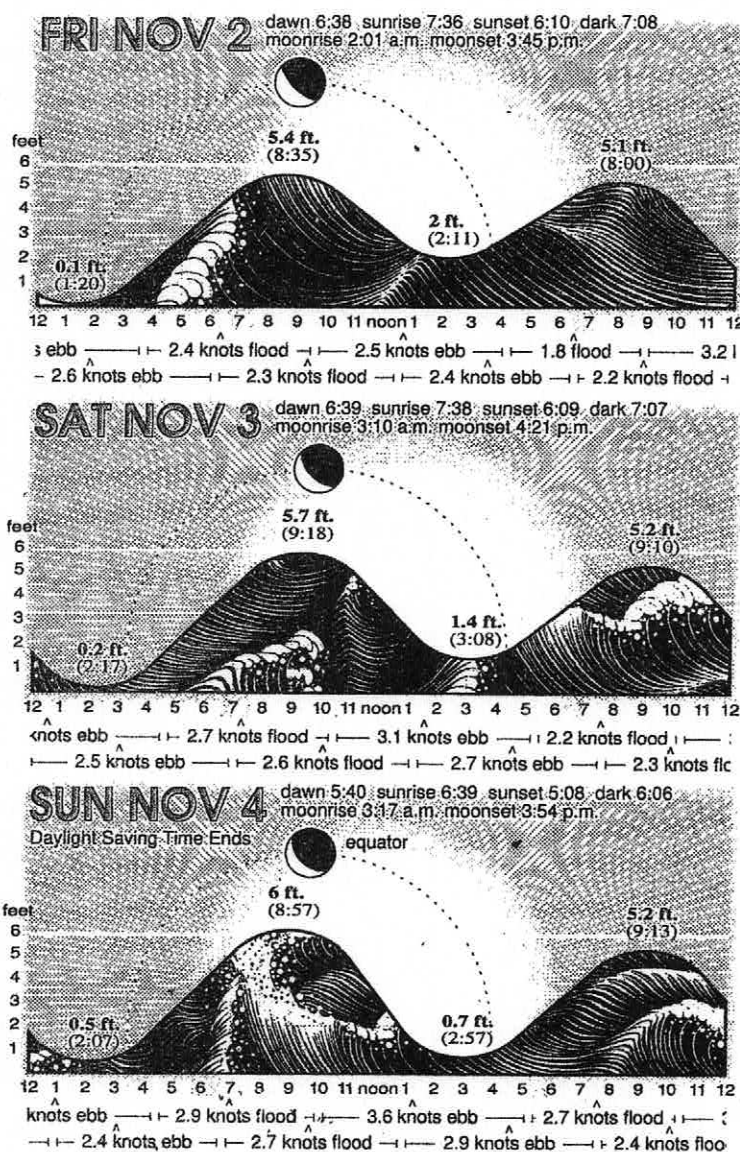

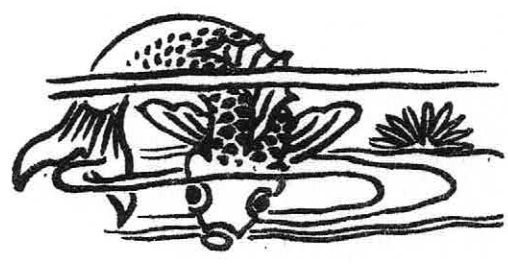
