
MUSIC AND PUPPETS TONIGHT! FRIDAY AT 7pm at The Farmstand

The discussion, titled *The Lights in the Sky are Stars:* Looking, Seeing and Knowing in Art, Astrophysics and Photography, will stimulate your curiosity, reignite your interest in the grandeur of the night sky and inspire your own creative expression.

The panelists, truly great minds, are all participants in the current astronomy-themed exhibitions at Bolinas Museum, curated by Jennifer Gately, who brought together contemporary art and historic and cutting edge science. Each panelist will give a brief introduction about their work before the discussion begins. Director of Lick Observatory Historical Collection, Tony Misch is a retired astronomer who also holds an MFA degree. Don Jolley is legendary as the visionary science teacher of the Bolinas-Stinson School eighth grade, whose immense curiosity and knowledge is contagious for all ages. Michael Light, of San Francisco and Bolinas, is nationally renowned for his aerial photography. He also worked with NASA to bring us previously unseen images from the first trips to the moon. Linda Connor, Marin County photographer who has influenced international and Bay Area photography for forty years, worked with historic negatives from the Lick Observatory. The talk will be moderated by John Weber, the founding director of UC Santa Cruz Institute of Arts and Sciences, Art Division, following his eleven years at San Francisco Museum of Modern Art where he led innovative education programs. This promises to be an exciting and stimulating conversation!

Special announcement: Tony Misch and Michael Light will be at Bolinas Museum on Sunday from 2 to 3 PM to answer questions about the exhibition.

Taurids Meteor Shower The Taurids are a minor shower and are believed to be composed of two shower streams. The southern Taurids stream can be seen as early as mid to late September and are active throughout November and can produce bright meteors and fireballs. The northern Taurids can be seen from October 12th to December 2nd, with this year's peak on Nov 5th. The Taurids radiant point is their namesake constellation Taurus, the Bull. Orion's familiar three star belt is your guide to locate Taurus. Follow the belt upward and you find Taurus' brightest star Aldebaran in the mist of the "V" shaped Hyades star cluster.
