

SOS california is burning, what do we do?

We're on day 8 of gnarly air quality here in the Bay Area, smoke from the Camp Fire in the foothills brought here by the wind and seemingly stuck. This is not news to anyone.

If you're like me, it's easy to get lost in the perfect storm of FIRE FEELINGS: a mix of anxiety, fear, helplessness, and gratitude (tinged with a little guilt?) that the fire is not here. If you're like me, you maybe also want to feel helpful, and productive, and like you're DOING SOMETHING, whether it's for yourself, your neighbors, a friend who's been more directly impacted, and even strangers in other, far-off California communities.

At the time of printing (reported by CalFire at 7:20am, November 16) the Camp Fire has burned 142,000 acres, and is 45% contained. There are 63 confirmed fatalities and hundreds of people missing. 9,844 residences and almost 3,000 other structures have burned.

The air quality forecast for the Bay Area is not good: the winds aren't shifting as expected, and relief from the toxic air may not come until next week, when rains are supposed to come Wednesday. Pray for rain.

Here are some ideas for things to DO while you're stuck inside, windows shut, waiting it out. I am no expert, just a regular person who is also trying to deal with it all.

Have you signed up for Nixle alerts? This is the hyper-local alert system that sends alert text-messages from the sheriff in times of emergency. Send a text message from your mobile phone to the number "888-777". In the body of the text message, write "94924". You are now signed up for alerts for Bolinas, so if there is a nearby fire or evacuation plans you'll stay in the know. You can sign up for multiple zip codes; I get alerts for my dad's town in Oregon, for peace of mind.

Take a look at the Air Quality Index to really understand how bad it is. I've been looking at www.airvisual.com as well as www.purpleair.com, though neither has a sensor in Bolinas it gives a general idea.

CalFire posts regular updates. There is so much information out there, I find it calming to just check that source for the facts. www.fire.ca.gov

Take care of your lungs! Stay indoors if possible, but we all have to go outside so wear a mask when outdoors. Make sure yours says N95 or P100 on it. These are the minimum strength to filter out the nasty P2.5 particles, the tiny ones that get into our airways and stick around.

Does anyone around you need help? Check on your neighbors. The smoke is harsher for elders and children; if you are neither of these, consider asking your neighbors if they need groceries, help with outside tasks, or other assistance. Woodfire burning is not currently allowed, and it's cold outside. maybe your neighbors need to borrow a space heater?

Are you prepared for the possibility of having to leave your home quickly? Use your time indoors to organize your "things I'd save in a fire". Set aside medications, photos, contact lenses, family heirlooms... www.ready.gov is a good resource. One good tip is to make a list of important things you live with everyday, and their locations. This will give you an easy cheat-sheet in case you have a short time to leave. My list starts with "computer (desk), photo albums (closet), hard drive (under bed), dad's Dead records (cupboard), mom's quilt (downstairs)..."

Avoid alcohol, sugar, and other toxins. Your body is already fighting. Drink tea, eat vegetables. Act like you're recovering from a cold. Nurse your body through this.

A friend from up north in the fire zone says:

"Hello, I wanted to send this link about a project we are collecting funding for to help our communities. It will involve a lot of local folks, and we are going to need to coordinate with local authorities and legislators to do these things in a timely manner. We will also be reaching out to anyone in the community who might have the capacity to be involved in our first phase, which will be a base camp remediation site in Yankee Hill (current plan, however we are still in the initial stages so certain locations may change). Please feel free to follow our page to stay updated on our efforts, and I hope, at the very least, we can be a glimmer of hope to everyone in the wake of this disaster. Much love to our communities, we are strong, and we will rebuild.


If you're inside all day, boil a pot of water on the stove with herbs in it. It helps put some moisture in the air, and aromatherapy is real! It has a comforting effect. I've been boiling rosemary, ends of parsley stalks, lavender, and mint.

Get out of town, if you are able, even just for the day. Air quality is better outside of the Bay Area. Tahoe and Reno are reputed to have good air, and also Los Angeles, despite the Woolsey Fire, because strong winds are blowing that smoke out to sea.

Donate to fire relief efforts. At this point, many organizations have said that the most helpful thing is financial contributions. Check www.charitynavigator.org to research which organization to donate to. I heard from a friend in Chico that the North Valley Community Foundation is a good one.

And above all, give yourself a break! This is traumatic. It's ok to be experiencing grief, and worrying about the future, and feeling helpless. People have died, communities have been devastated, the earth is freaking out, and the weight of the realities of climate change is sometimes too much to bear. Try to take care of yourself!!!

Leonids Meteor Shower Tife Leonids run annually in November from the 6th to the 30th with this year's peak on evening of Saturday, the 17th, and the following morning. The Leonids are believed to be dust grains left behind by Comet Tempe-Tuttle. The waxing gibbous moon will set a little after 1:00 a.m. leaving the sky dark. The radiant point is the constellation Leo that by moonset will have risen above the eastern horizon. Leo can be recognized by its distinctive star cluster that forms a sickle, or to some a backward question mark, and the bright blue white star Regulus. Regulus is called the heart of Leo. the lion.


