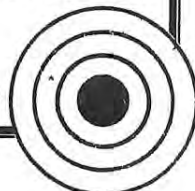

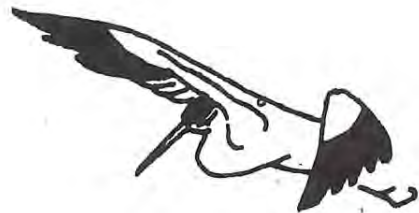

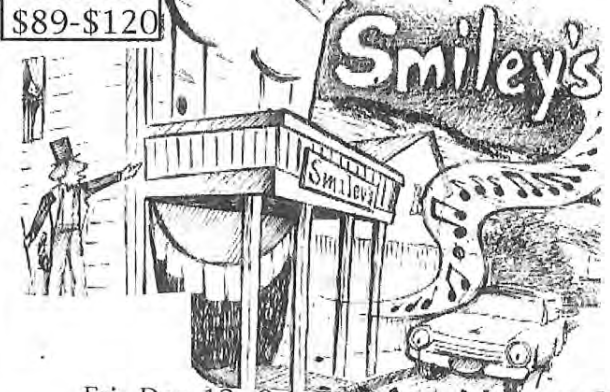

A LETTER FROM SANTA TO BOLINAS

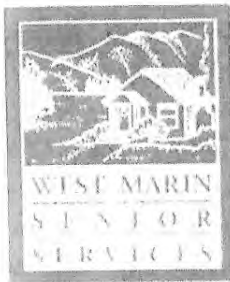
