





Janet had been in declining health for many years, and after major surgery in March 2017, she never fully recovered. Her outer world over the past ten months became increasingly smaller, as she found it difficult to keep up with friends and even harder to spend almost any time away from the little home she had lived in since 1990.


Her inner world however, remained rich, and she often commented to me, other family members and close friends, of her abiding love for music, singing, laughter, the lush pink Cecile Brunner rose bush outside her front door which in our family we always called "baby roses", and the many birds, animals and insects who made her yard their home. And of course, anyone who knew Janet well, knew that her kitties remained, to the very end, the great loves of her life.

Janet was a unique (a word used by almost everyone who knew her) spirited little girl, who grew into a unique, complex, compassionate woman with an off-the-wall sense of humor. She was curious about everything, and her eclectic interests ranged from Sufi poetry to the latest scientific and medical discoveries, the sex life of snails, and everything in between. The natural world, including her beloved Pacific Ocean, always offered her solace and joy. She was a voracious reader, and a remarkably good artist whose pen and ink sketches of animals (predominately cats, sheep and the occasional frog) were often included in her daily journal pages.

Janet worked in San Francisco to help found the Fort Mason Center for Arts and Culture back in its infancy in the 70's. She also worked for a while at the Marin Humane Society as an animal advocate, going to the local schools, where she educated young people about compassionate animal care.

The Bolinas community and the friends Janet made there during her nearly 30 years in her little home by the sea, became her second family. She cherished those friendships, and delighted in them even when she was no longer able to participate in the life of this unique community.




WHERE THERE IS HOPE

"Faces of Resistance"

On our way home the day after Thanksgiving, Don and I had the opportunity to visit the New Museum of Los Gatos, to view the exhibit of Ilka Hartmann's photos, "Faces of Resistance". For many years we've been aware of her extraordinary eye for the faces of history, having seen examples of her work in books, magazines, and smaller exhibits in Marin and San Francisco. Ilka is one of those rare photographers who can convey a critical moment through a human portrait. However, we'd never seen a large display of her work--her art--until that day.

The exhibit is arranged by event and spans the latter half of the 20th century: the Anti-War movement; the Black Power and Native American movements; Gay rights; Farm workers rights, and more. By walking through each area, we're given an insider's view of the people and events that shifted our country's viewpoint out of complacency and into the 21st century. While Ilka's photographs are focused on the Bay Area, they echo shifts occurring throughout the US from the late 1960s to the late 1980s.

The exhibit will remain open until July 2018. I hope that many of you can include a visit if you're in the San Jose area. It's a rare opportunity to see more deeply into a time that shaped our consciousness today.

The New Museum of Los Gatos (106 East Main Street, Los Gatos, 95030) is open from 11-5 Wednesday through Sunday.





California Issues Cell Phone Radiation Warnings Electromagnetic Radiation Safety

December 13, 2017

Today the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) issued a press release to announce their long-awaited cell phone warning document. The document forewarns the public about health risks from exposure to cell phone radiation and provides tips on how to reduce exposure.

This document originally prepared in 2009 by health professionals within the CDPH Division of Environmental and Occupational Disease Control underwent numerous revisions but was never published by CDPH until now.

In March of this year, the Sacramento Superior Court ordered the CDPH to release the draft documents to Dr. Joel Moskowitz, the plaintiff in a law suit filed under the California Public Records Act by the Environmental Law Clinic at UC Berkeley Law and the First Amendment Project.

To comply with the court order, CDPH released 27 versions of the document and reimbursed legal expenses. The most recent draft, dated January, 2015, contained a bold watermark, "Draft and Not for Public Release" and a footnote, "Document released pursuant to Moskowitz v. CDPH, Sac. Super. Ct. No. 34-2016-80002358."

In July, the California Brain Tumor Association held a <u>demonstration</u> in Sacramento outside of CDPH to call for the public release of the cell phone warning document.

The safety recommendations in the document released today by CDPH are similar to those issued by the Connecticut Department of Public Health in May, 2015.

The preponderance of the research indicates that cell phone radiation poses a major risk to health. The recommendations of state and federal health agencies have not kept up with the research. The Federal Communications Commission, the agency responsible for regulating cell phones, relies on industrygenerated guidance that is two decades old.

More than 230 scientists who have published peer-reviewed research on electromagnetic fields and health have signed a petition calling on all nations to adopt stronger regulations and disclosure to the public about the health risks of electromagnetic fields.
