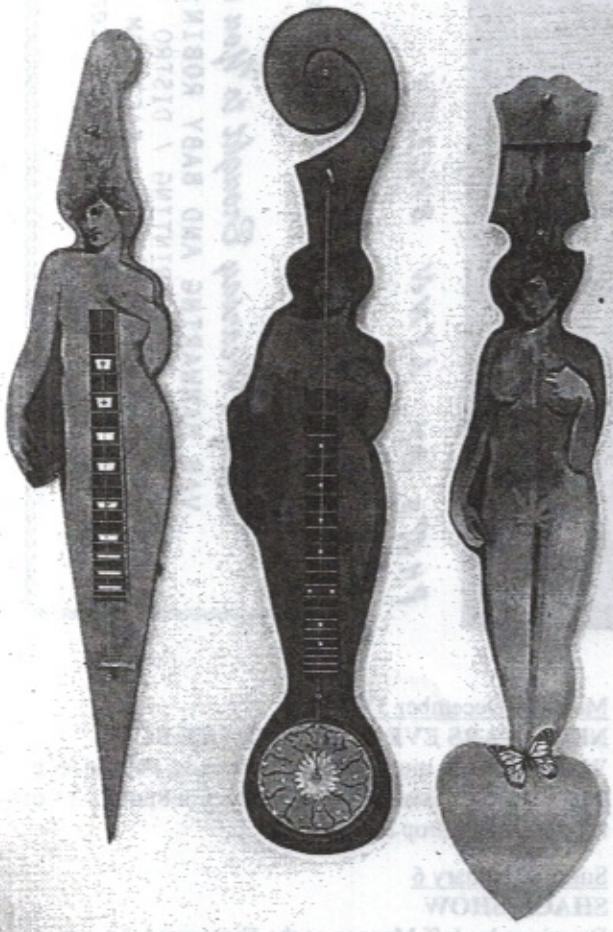

and then some!**

As you read this, approximately 3000 monarchs that arrived in Bolinas last month are huddled together for protection in the evergreen trees around us. As the temperatures drops, the butterflies seek out trees that can shelter them from our winds, wet mists, and cold rains. We see some of these overwintering monarchs on sunny days. They seek nectar from plants that flower in winter, such as native lilacs and other ornamentals in bloom. The precipitous drop of this migratory butterfly's 2018 population has left many observers stunned. The Xerces Society's blog post of Nov. 29th, 2018 notes that last year's sites, in California reported a population of approximately **148,000** monarchs. "In 2018, the same sites have only **20,456** monarchs. **This represents an 86% decline from last year.**"

Their fate is tied directly to human mismanagement: the use of pesticides, herbicides and genetically altered plants (GMOs); urban sprawl; pollution; and impacts to the groves that provide them with winter protection. The plight of the Monarch in the western United States does not imply that the entire species is approaching extinction,

but it is now apparent that we are witnessing the possible end of one of Earth's miracles.

The Western Monarch Migration started near the end of the last Ice Age and has endured to the present day; it now needs our support to continue.

It is not too late for Bolinas to take actions to help save this local phenomenon from extinction. We can help protect the Monarchs here by tending their favored groves with an eye to their needs: a healthy canopy that lets in some sunlight, a blend of older and younger trees, and insulating ground cover. They also need a minimum of disturbance: please cut your firewood early to ensure that our monarchs find the required tree-cover, canopy, insulative ground cover and quiet they need upon arrival in late autumn; and by planting winter flowers like Native *Ceanothus*, which provides nectar for these migratory invertebrates. We can also encourage friends in East Marin and in the East Bay to plant native (not tropical) milkweed.

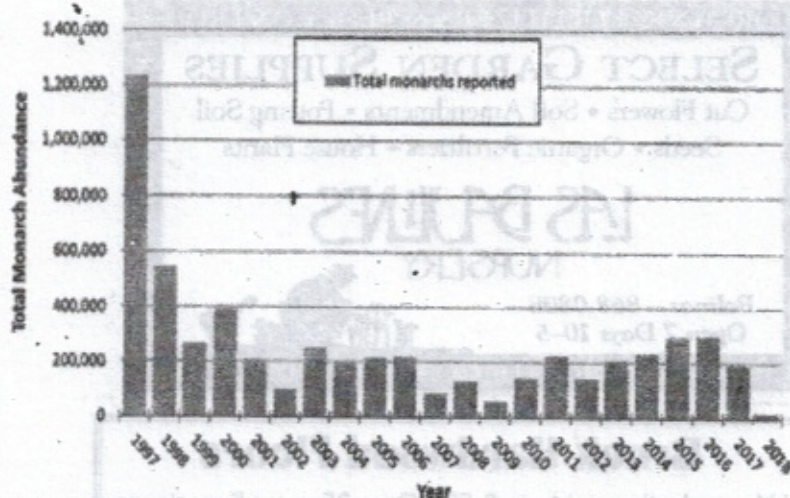
