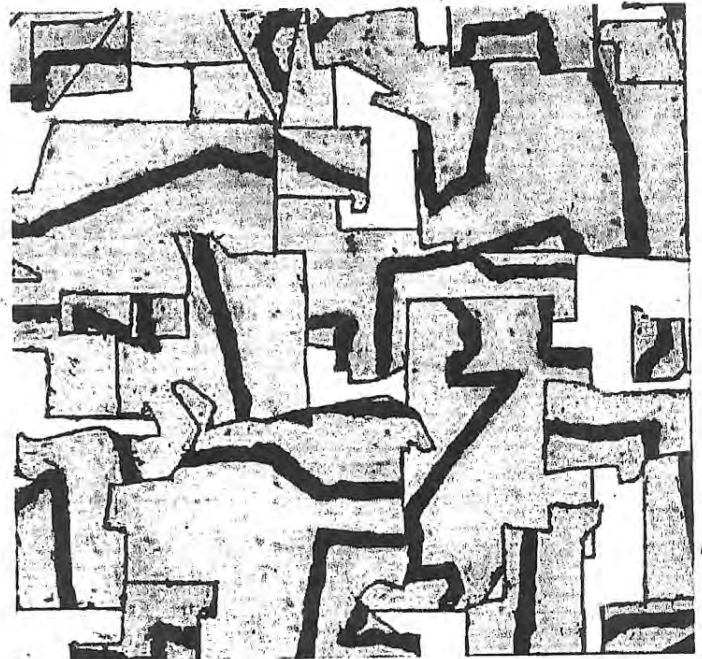
rest of the group left early and went to hear Rose sing at the Gospel Flat farm stand.

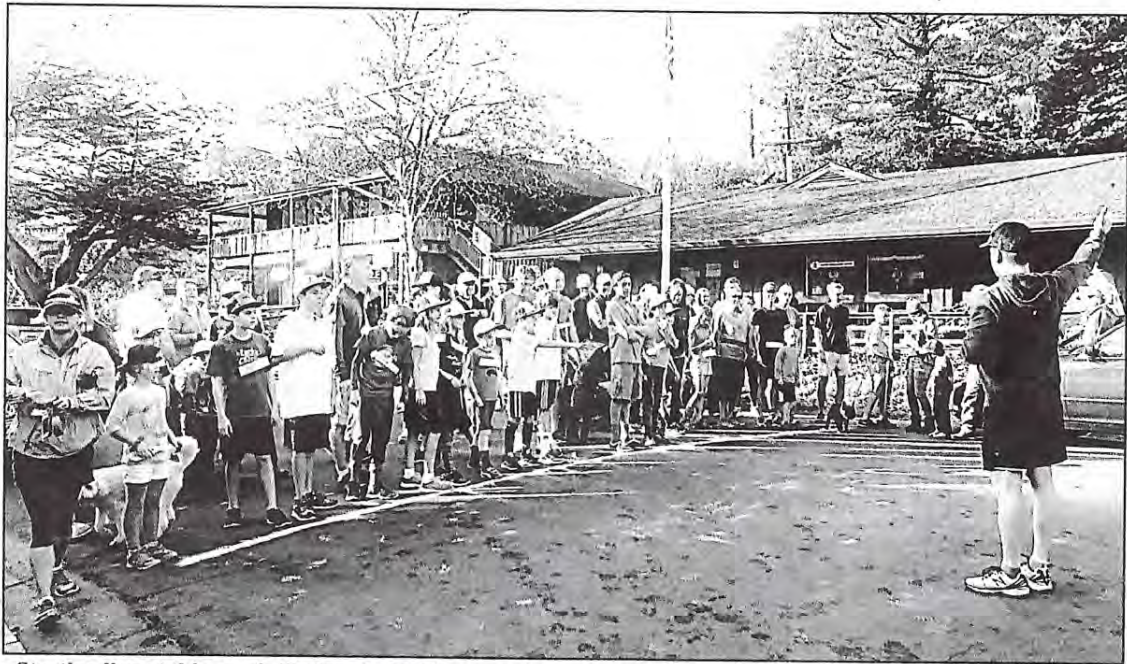

- push over a free-standing gray can without having anything next to it to push against.

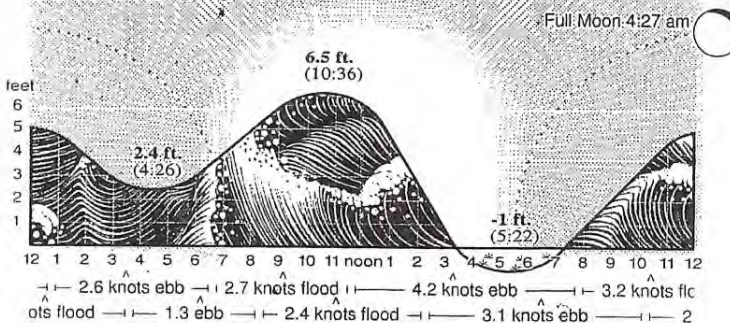

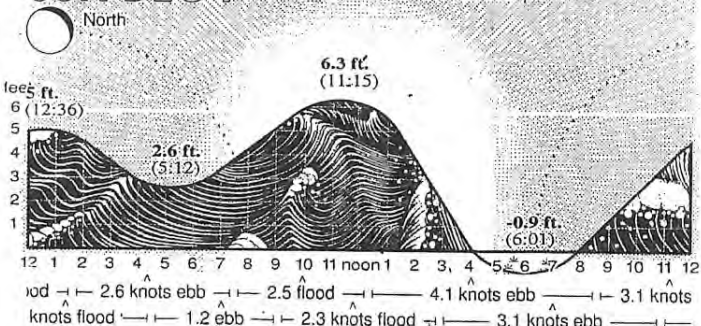


