

KNOW YOUR BO

In 1846, before the arrival of invading U.S. forces, Gregorio Briones was granted two square leagues of Bolinas by the Mexican Governor of California, Pio Pico. In 1851, the U.S. Government set up a 3-man commission to settle land claims in California. In 1853, Briones filed his claim for Bolinas via his lawyer, Volney Howard. In 1857, as part of his fee, Mr. Howard got 500 acres on the mesa. The land was later owned by the Garzoli family and in 1927, two Manhattanites, Arthur and Ruth Smadbeck, bought 300 of those acres. They divided it into 5,336 lots, each 20 by 100 feet, and in conjunction with the San Francisco Bulletin offered lots for \$69.50 (\$9.50 down and \$3 a month) to anyone who would subscribe to the paper for six months. The Smadbeck colony was exclusive: only whites were admitted and all deeds were banished if the owner built a slaughterhouse, brass foundry, glue plant or insane asylum. In 1941, Attilio Martinelli of Inverness paid \$11,000 for hundreds of acres on the mesa. In 1946, Dudley King, a Manhattan neighbor of the Smadbecks bought 73 lots for the price of one dollar.

Measles: A Dangerous Illness Roald Dahl

Olivia, my eldest daughter, caught measles when she was seven years old. As the illness took its usual course I can remember reading to her often in bed and not feeling particularly alarmed about it. Then one morning, when she was well on the road to recovery, I was sitting on her bed showing her how to fashion little animals out of coloured pipe-cleaners, and when it came to her turn to make one herself, I noticed that her fingers and her mind were not working together and she couldn't do anything.

"Are you feeling all right?" I asked her. "I feel all sleepy," she said.

In an hour, she was unconscious. In twelve hours she was dead.

The measles had turned into a terrible thing called measles encephalitis and there was nothing the doctors could do to save her. That was years ago in 1962, but even now, if a child with measles happens to develop the same deadly reaction from measles as Olivia did, there would still be nothing the doctors could do to help her.

On the other hand, there is today something that parents can do to make sure that this sort of tragedy does not happen to a child of theirs. They can insist that their child is immunised against measles. I was unable to do that for Olivia in 1962 because in those days a reliable measles vaccine had not been discovered. Today a good and safe vaccine is available to every family and all you have to do is to ask your doctor to administer it.

It is not yet generally accepted that measles can be a dangerous illness. Believe me, it is. In my opinion parents who now refuse to have their children immunised are putting the lives of those children at risk. In America, where measles immunisation is compulsory, measles like smallpox, has been virtually wiped out.

He who knows nothing, loves nothing. He who can do nothing understands nothing. He who understands nothing is worthless. But he who understands also loves, notices, sees. . . . The more knowledge is inherent in a thing, the greater the love. . . . Anyone who imagines that all fruits ripen at the same time as the strawberries knows nothing about grapes.

Out of those, more than 10,000 will suffer side effects of one kind or another. At least 10,000 will develop ear or chest infections. About 20 will die.

LET THAT SINK IN: Every year around 20 children will die in Britain from measles. So what about the risks that your children will run from being immunised? They are almost non-existent. In a district of around 300,000 people, there will be only one child every 250 years who will develop serious side effects from measles immunisation! That is about a million to one chance. I

think there would be more chance of your child choking to death on a chocolate bar than of becoming seriously ill from a measles immunisation.

So what on earth are you worrying about? It really is almost a crime to allow your child to go unimmunised. All school-children who have not yet had a measles immunisation should beg their parents to arrange for them to have one as soon as possible.

Incidentally, I dedicated two of my books to Olivia, the first was 'James and the Giant Peach'. That was when she was still alive. The second was 'The BFG', dedicated to her memory after she had died from measles. You will see her name at the beginning of each of these books. And I know how happy she would be if only she could know that her death had helped to save a good deal of illness and death among other children.

The Needle and the Damage Done

"When you decide to walk on the path of truth, then all the forces of the universe help you." Aarvind Kejreyral, founder of victorious Common Man Party

Read Heilig's plug for On Immunity, the metaphor laden book on vaccination by Eula Biss, This book gets hyped because she's in the pro-vaccine camp, metaphorically speaking. Browsed it in a bookstore. Read some reviews and her promotional excerpts from it, including a lengthy one in Harper's Magazine. It's more warning than persuasion to the target audience, white women with household incomes over \$75,000 and higher educational levels like Biss. This is the demographic most likely to opt out of mandatory school vaccinations for their children.

There's a War on Freedom being fought in the HomeLand. Conspiracists claim these Center for Disease Control trained writers, reporters, epidemiologists and public health officers are marshaled in a secretive "Project OO7". They've infiltrated counties with "crazy clusters" of exemptors to insidiously attack those parents who opt out of mandatory vaccinations for religious or personal belief.

That is so grassy knoll, tin foil hat, anti-science nonsense. Project 007 was actually the code name for Merck's project to inflate the effectiveness rate of their Mumps vaccine by adding rabbit antibodies to the blood samples. Currently failing across the country In mumps outbreaks whose vaccinated victims disrupt the drumbeat.

Metaphor, that oft misplaced chisel in the writer's craft, is a conspiracy between two concepts. Without using like or as, that's a simile. Biss seems to have read widely on the history of vaccines, but not deeply on their science. For that, she's drunk the Kool-Aid of official propaganda, promulgated by the media to rouse the pitchfork waving peasants. They're being whipped into frenzy now by Disney measles mania. Chanting "We believe in Science" as they besiege the tiny minority of parents who choose not to vaccinate their school age child.

Biss admits she wasn't able to read the literature on vaccination while pregnant, opting out of "the labyrinthine network of anxieties". She relied on "the pediatrician I had chosen to be my son's doctor" on whether to subject her newborn to the Hepatitis B vaccine. He assured her it was for inner city poor mothers. More likely to carry the virus and transmit it to their baby. She was so "relieved to be told this vaccine was not for people like me" that she was later ashamed "by how little of his racial code I registered." Biss is a doctor's daughter, so steeped in the "social responsibility" shame/guilt brew her book oozes.

The doctor's advice was ethical, since there are known and unknown harms from the vaccine, while protective benefits are entirely for babies of mothers with Hepatitis B. This is easily determined with an inexpensive blood test that he could have ordered to support his prejudice. A French retrospective study identified their mass Hepatitis B vaccination campaign with a doubling of Multiple Sclerosis cases within a few years of their 1993 rollout. Over 10,000 new cases of MS are diagnosed in the U.S. yearly, while newborns are routinely injected with the vaccine. There are cures for the virus, but none for MS.

Bliss skipped that vaccine, but subjected her child to the "most mandatory vaccinations of any nation" on the recommended schedule. She's proud of her decision to "participate in the protection of poor black children, whose single mothers have not as a result of circumstance rather than choice, fully vaccinated them." As a guilt trip, this won't sway those suburban white moms who moved there to avoid "people like them".

She claims that "vaccination was a precursor to modern medicine, not the product of it." Folk medicine that was first written up in 1794 by the medical doctor, Edward enner after using cowpox pus to protect against smallpox. News flash! Modern medical vaccination began with the Salk polio vaccine campaigns in 1954. The Cutter Lab produced vaccine caused the largest polio epidemic in American history that year. Biss doesn't mention it although she lingers over forced smallpox vaccination of immigrants in the 19th century, and

vaccination at gunpoint of blacks in Kentucky.

She banishes any concerns about vaccine additives, "the frickin mercury, the ether, the aluminum, the antifreeze" that Jenny McCarthy railed about after her son became autistic when vaccinated. Breast milk contains all these and more, Biss soothes. They're far safer than the "poison of adders, the blood, entrails and excretion of rats, bats, toads and sucking whelps" feared in vaccines of the 19th century.

The scientific method, where results are measurable, shared openly and repeatable is the basis of Science. No vaccine trials abide by these fundamental criterions. We've traded in one secretive priesthood muttering mumbo-jumbo for another waving hypodermic talismans while fiercely protecting their monopoly on "health care."

Biss blames the infamy of Dr. Paul Offit on his boast that an infant could tolerate "100,000 vaccinations at once" with no harm. He is called "Dr. Proffit" because of the millions he made on Rotashield TM, his vaccine against rotavirus. Biss seems blissfully ignorant that the FDA withdrew it because too many infants contracted pneumonia, suffered bowel obstruction or died shortly after injection. Medical weasel wording insisted they were only "temporally associated". Correlation not Causation.

Biss wrote about pertussis in Coughing Fits, a NY Times excerpt from her book. She developed an unhealthy "fascination with infectious disease" after her son was born. When he was in preschool she went into a pertussis panic after suffering a lingering cough because a "whoop escaped my throat." Even though she had been recently vaccinated, Biss feverishly calculated how many people she had infected "in a hypothetical population imagined through mathematical modeling". While waiting to see her doctor, she "felt grateful for every vaccinated body that stood between me and a vulnerable population." The doctor doused her inflamed imagination, because there was no pertussis outbreak in their area, and many viruses can cause whooping. Sent her home with cough syrup.

"There is clearly something of the occult in the idea of a cloak of invisible protection cast over an entire population" Biss admits, but her attempt to "recast the herd as a hive [to make] the concept of shared immunity more appealing" is basically a voodoo pickle. Biss muses that "herd immunity invites association with the term herd mentality, a stampede toward stupidity." The term "suggests we are only so many cattle waiting to be sent to the slaughter."

That's accurate, because "herd immunity" is not "an observable phenomena". The Council on Foreign Relations, hardly a radical organization, reported in 2014 that the most highly vaccinated countries had the greatest number of measles, mumps, pertussis, rubella, and polio cases.

On Immunity is filled with faulty reasoning and meandering metaphors, but gets nationally praised, plugged and prime location in bookstores. Save Trillions with Universal Health Care, stuffed with rational deductions based on facts and similes, not so much. Bitter herbs grow beside the steep and rocky trails, providing panaceas against panic.
