
Dear Bolinas Community Members:



Finding time to do her art while being a working mom with a young child is challenging. So, the new exhibition of Frazer's prints, pastels, and watercolors is important for her, and exciting for us to see an emerging local talent.

Frazer studied art at Scripps College of Claremont Colleges, where her grandmother, a chemist, had formerly taught science. After graduation Frazer was on the staff of the American Museum of Ceramic Art, for six years, working with the collection, artists, lenders, and organizing exhibitions.

In 2014 Frazer moved to coastal Marin where her grandmother, Winifred Tarpey, had been a resident since 1988. Frazer worked for local businesses, served as intern photo curator for Cordell Bank National Marine Sanctuary, a summer intern at Bolinas Museum and performed as a singer songwriter. She met Sirima Sataman who had been mentored by the same printmaker at Claremont Colleges and Frazer began making prints at Sataman's Point Reyes Station workshop Ink.Paper.Plate. Frazer's images are figurative, female and abstract, hinting at mysteries below the surface. In honor of Valentine's Day, Frazer also created small mixed medium paintings that might serve as gifts of love.

Today, Frazer is the mother of energetic threeyear-old Weylyn, she is on the staff of Bolinas Museum, part time, as Registrar, managing the archive and collection and exhibition coordinator, and on Sundays she works at Claudia Chapline Gallery, benefiting from Chapline's extensive experience in the arts.

Nicole Frazer's exhibition runs February 2 to 28 at Claudia Chapline Garden Gallery, 3445 Shoreline Highway, on the main street of Stinson Beach. Gallery hours are Saturday, Sunday and Monday 12 to 4:30 PM and by appointment. Please join us for the opening reception!



Join us on my birthday at the Civic Center, Tuesday Feb. 5, 5:30 pm for a workshop on 5G with all the Supervisors!

Marin County Supervisors are asking for citizen input re Big Wireless and the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) forced installation of Fifth Generation of wireless. 5G: powerful RF antennas every 300 ft. on light and utility poles close to homes, offices, parks, schools, stores along the public rights of way. They want to know if you will trade your health and environment for faster downloading speed.

Do you mind if a microwave antenna is in front of your home? Do you mind if you and your children are bombarded 24/7 with intense radiofrequency (RF) radiation at close proximity? Do you mind if the FCC says you can't do anything about that? How about losing 20% of your property value because of that antenna close by? (https://ehtrust.org/cell-phone-towers-lower- property-values-documentation-research/)

5G will expose humans, insects, birds and other species to a more intense and complex form of electrosmog than we've experienced before. It will consist of low-band and mid-band microwaves and high band (i.e. millimeter) waves. It will involve phased- arrays, multiple input and output, and beam- forming.

Moreover, we will continue simultaneously to be exposed to WiFi, 2G, 3G, and 4G, all the previous existing manmade RF radiation.

All this constant radiation is cumulative on our biological systems that use natural nano electrical and magnetic signals to function.

Based on many studies, it looks like the most important factor determining health risk is the pulsing and modulation of the signals. The frequency and duration of exposures may be more important than power density of the RF radiation.

In a courageous move to preserve local government control, Federal bill HR 530 was introduced January 14, 2019 in the House of Representatives by California Congresswoman Anna Eshoo, to invalidate the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) September 26, 2018 ruling to accelerate the deployment of 5G small cells throughout the U.S. Congresswoman Jackie Speier has co-sponsored the bill.

Representative Eshoo stated the FCC had 'failed to listen to reasonable input from communities across the country, cowered to industry interests, and failed to put the public interests first." In a January 15, 2019 press statement Eshoo added, "Having served in local government for a decade on the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors, I understand and respect the important role that state and local governments play in protecting the welfare of their residents,"


