



There I was peacefully sleeping in my cozy bed when I was jolted awake by a quick, but surprisingly loud, earthquake. As is my usual response to an earthquake, I jumped up, screamed "Earthquake" and started to run towards the kids room with the idea of grabbing them and getting under a door jamb somewhere in the house. All this happened within second's as my brain was whirring faster than my body. The earth thankfully stopped moving and my next task was to check the USGS website to see if it was The Big One somewhere else. Phew, not this time! I then logged onto my Facebook account and of course there was a ton of frenetic activity on that site as well. Seems like everyone posted that they felt the quake and gee how scary it was. The posts about not being prepared for The Big One (or the small one even) echo my sentiments exactly. I am definitely NOT prepared. I think I have some really old cans of beans lying around and maybe a can or two of tomato sauce. Don't think that's gonna help me all that much (unless I want to make some kind of bean and tomato dip after my house gets demolished. You never know when you need a good bean and tomato dip).

So, this got me to thinking. Maybe we need to start getting prepared. I know, what a novel and unique concept! With that in mind, I contacted the good folks at the Bolinas Fire Department and the Bolinas Disaster Council, and asked what could be done to get individual families in better shape for what very likely MAY happen in our backyard some day. Anita Tyrrell, the fabulous fire chief in Bolinas, gave me some links to websites that sell emergency supplies and kits and contain preparedness information. As well, the Bolinas Fire Department has disaster preparedness manuals available to anyone who would like one and is always willing to discuss what can be done to get yourself ready for an emergency out here in the bucolic, but cut off from the rest of the world, coast. Their phone number is 868-1566 and you can feel free to check in with them any time you want.

Maybe we can find someone locally to provide kits for those of us that are not able to order online or get over the hill that easily, but in the meantime check out the following websites for more information on preparedness and how to purchase emergency supplies and kits (it may not be possible to get someone to sell them locally so get your kits now, before it ends up being too late). It will make those 5:30 AM leaps out of bed that much better. If we are hit with the Biggee, you'll know what to do and have the stuff needed to make it through as safely as possible.



My friends and I are putting together a women's self defense workshop. The 2 main teachers are men who I have known for years and have done martial arts training with. They have been teaching women's self defense classes all around the Bay Area and are well versed in the down and dirty survival techniques that we all need to know as independent women moving around in the world.





Search for "Raul Midón" on YouTube, and you'll find a clip of the New York-based vocalist, guitarist, and songwriter appearing on "The Late Show with David Letterman" in 2006. Performing "State of Mind," the title track from his 2005 debut album, Midón unleashes a silky, soulful tenor and dazzling percussive guitar style—a syncopated flamenco- and jazz-infused approach in which bass, harmony, and melodic lines emanate from the fretboard in one slap-happy storm. If that weren't enough, Midón busts out his improvisational mouth horn technique, in which he creates a bebop "trumpet" solo entirely with his lips, earning himself a spontaneous burst of mid-song applause from the audience in the process.
