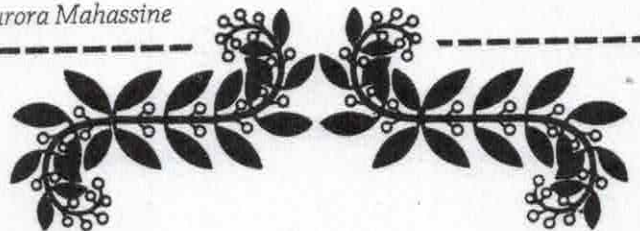
We are so grateful for the sunshine - even if it means the butterflies are leaving.

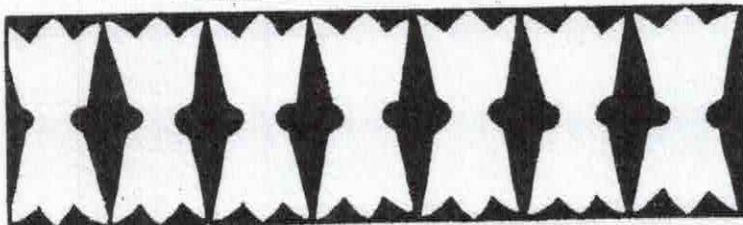

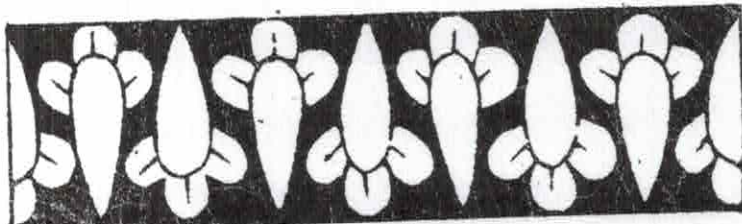

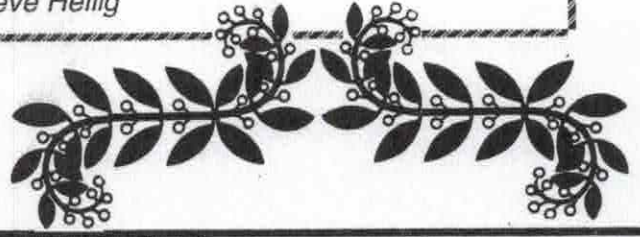




Dear Friends:

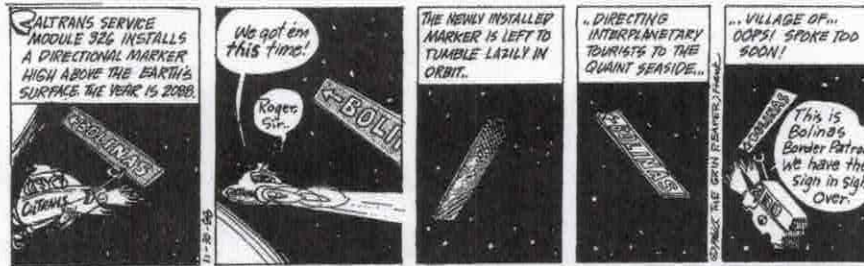

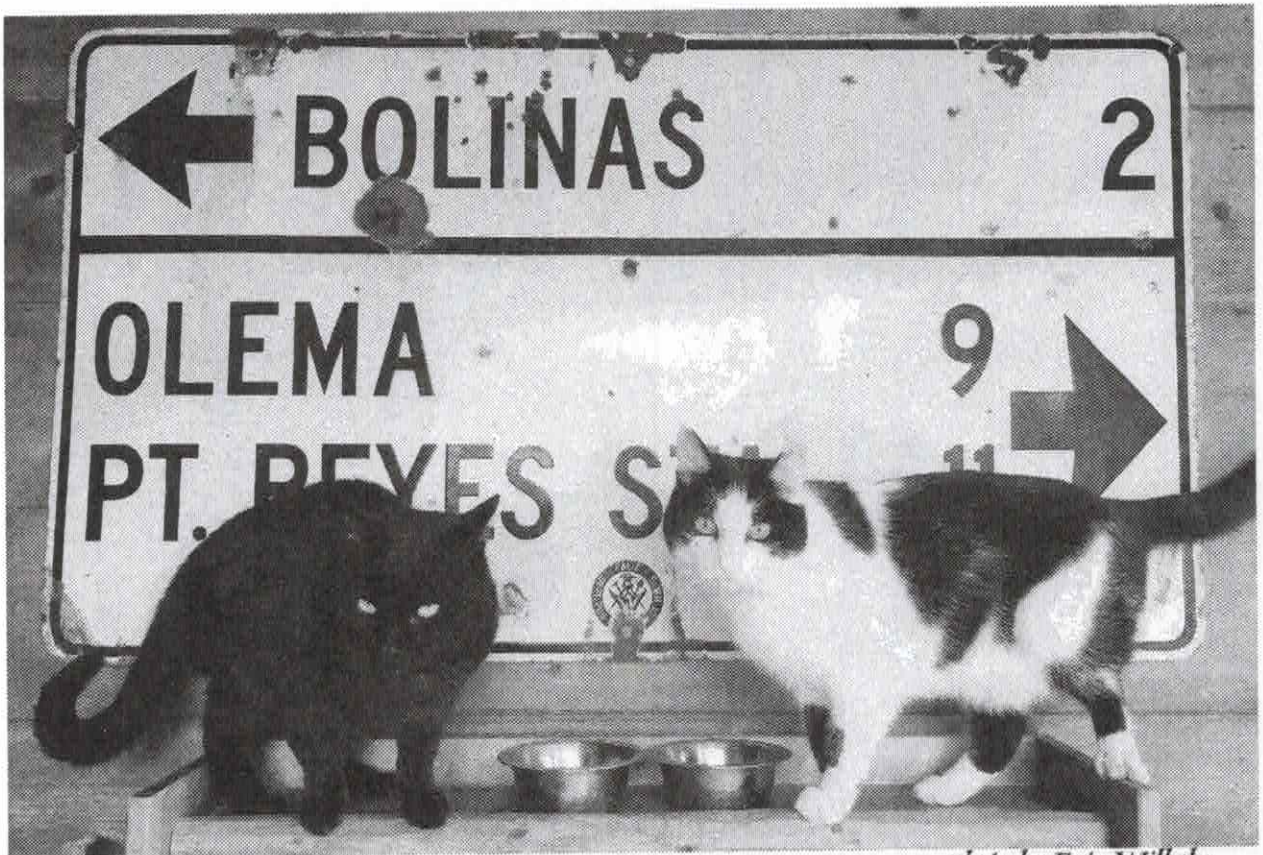

Community Expression:

Downtown Park:

1. Update on additional help for staff / landscapers re: Park maintenance. Possibility of splitting a landscaper with the BPUD & the school 4 times per year for projects. Also discussed possibility of asking for funds from downtown merchants to maintain restrooms. Still need to explore the school community service idea.
2. Status of new hand blower in Men's restroom. Should be installed by April.

Mesa Park:

1. Status of remaining signage (Skate park signage, handicap signage, no overnight parking, no fires) and clean up of vandalized signs. Clean up of vandalized rules signs did not work out, have ordered new ones. Also discussed no illegal dumping & signage for that.
2. Skate park follow up items – concrete clean up, planting of grass seed & plants. Landscape completion. Still pending.
3. Snack shack renovation ideas – Toby to present budget. \$2800 - \$3200, schedule for mid to late April. Will vote on at March meeting.
4. Status of clean out and removal of trailer. Has not occurred yet due to weather. Michael will move out all old equipment and have someone remove the old leaking trailer.
5. Mesa Park cape weed removal status? Michael is working on it, pending plan as discussed with possible landscaper solution earlier in meeting.
6. Discussion on basketball court re-asphalt and fencing bids. Charles prefers to speak to the kids directly rather than install a fence or possibly create a path leading to the track. Will also explore grant options for this.
7. Sewer hook up fee follow up. Still pending answer from BPUD for clarification on the 1/3 hook up fee.
8. New picnic tables / shade structure options. Pending options, but Michael will explore with a grant possibility.
9. New mower & belt replacement costs. \$3,599+ tax for new mower. Expect maintenance one time per year for \$150 unless people are using it that are not designated & untrained.

Just received our Measure A funds, which are not yet reflected in the totals below.

Ban Fur

As we know, people all over the world, and perhaps especially in California, care about animals. In 2018, the citizens of this state overwhelmingly voted, for the second time, to protect animals raised for food. Numerous pieces of legislation have been passed at both the state and local level to protect companion animals.

And the state is now moving quickly to ban the sale of fur. In just the last couple of years, Berkeley, San Francisco and Los Angeles have passed measures banning its sale. Currently, San Diego residents are working on passing their own fur ban. I am writing to urge everyone to contact their state representatives and support AB 44, the bill to ban the sale of fur in California.

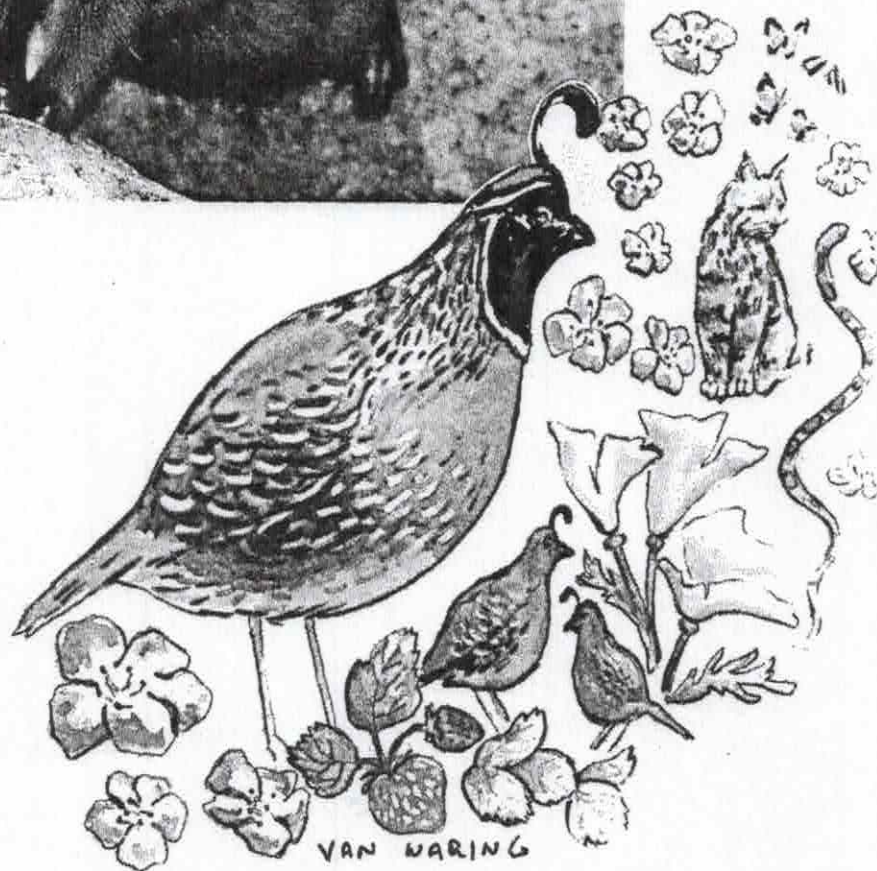
The fur industry is extremely cruel to animals. Minks, who are wild animals, who love to roam great distances and who were designed by nature to swim, are housed in tiny filthy cages. They are commonly driven insane by the misery and will even chew off their own limbs or kill their babies. The slaughtering process is gruesome, with animals either orally or anally electrocuted. Sometimes they are suffocated or, in China, beaten to death or even skinned alive.

There are no federal regulations to protect animals raised for fur in the United States. China, where a lot of fur comes from, does nothing to regulate its industry. Please join us in the fight to legitimize and normalize compassion for all animals, including those raised for their fur, and support AB 44.
