Gallery talks at 2 ~Reception 3-5 PM

Did you know: Not so many thousands of years ago San Francisco Bay was a river valley and the coastline was beyond the Farallon Islands?

Mammoths, camels and saber tooth cats were among the mammals that roamed our region.

On March 30, Bolinas Museum invites you to the opening of four new exhibitions. In the main gallery "*Changing California: Historical Ecology of the Bay Area*" addresses our Bay Area history from the Pleistocene Epoch to 250 years ago when condors still sailed overhead, and grizzly bears ruled this land.

The exhibition was inspired by Laura Cunningham's award winning book *State of Change: Forgotten Landscapes of California* (Heyday Books). Laura is a biologist, artist and author who spent 30 years of tracing the historic ecology of California. The exhibition uses **fine art**, (including a piece by Arthur Okamura) **history and science** to share a glimpse of how life and our familiar landscape evolved in this region. The Bay Area scientific community enriched the exhibition with facts and artifacts, including **treasures from California Academy of Science**. Also, locally found fossils, which have all been identified thanks to the efforts of biologist Peter Pyle. You will be surprised to learn facts about the two million year old fossilized sand dollars we sometimes find here.

The exhibition also considers human caused near-extinction of some species, and contemporary environmental activism that is helping species rebound. I learned so much while creating this exhibition- I promise you will be surprised and fascinated by the information, objects and art.

In the Coastal Marin Artists gallery: *Thomas Quinn: Wild and Elusive. Nationally celebrated Point Reyes painter Quinn paints with such nuanced realism that the viewer has an almost visceral sense of the presence of his bird and animal subjects.* Inspired by ancient Chinese and Japanese art, each image is distilled to essence.

The museum's photography gallery presents *Diamond Nights, California*. Marin County photographer Beth Moon has traveled the world photographing the world's oldest trees. **This selection is majestic ancient California trees under vast night sky, presented in luminous, large-scale prints.**

Permanent Collection gallery the selection includes new gifts of art from Tom Killion, and from Nick Monsma, a Russell Chatham and a:Gottardo Piazzoni. In the history room is a display of delicate seaweeds that were pressed in Bolinas 130 years ago. These exhibitions are brought to you through the efforts of a lot of volunteers and the Bolinas Museum staff.

With these exhibitions, we hope to catch your attention, broaden your perspective, stimulate your imagination and inspire your curiosity to learn more.

Opening March 30. Don't miss the informative gallery talks at 2 PM, and reception is 3-5 PM, and like admission to the exhibitions, the event is free.

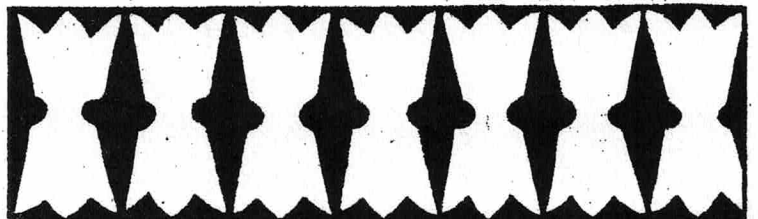

Bolinas- Stinson Union School District Monday Morning Meeting April 1, 8:45, Bolinas Campus Library (True, no April Fool's trick even though it's way early and short notice)

As one Trustee of our 5 member School Board, I am inviting Community members of Bolinas and Stinson Beach to give input to the Board by attending a short morning meeting this coming Monday to participate in a conversation regarding the direction and goals for our School District in the coming years.

The reason such an opportunity presents itself at this time, is that there are presently three openings (that is a third of the teaching staff) for teaching positions at the School. There is a teaching position that opened last fall that has not been filled, an additional position the District added last month, and we have had the recent notification that our highly regarded middle school teacher, Don Jolley, will be retiring at the end of this school year. Don brought many innovative flagship programs to our school in his 31 years of teaching in the District and his interdisciplinary approach to experiential learning, his deep regard and respect for his student's capacity to learn, and his diligence at presenting our middle school learners with in-depth study of our local environment, along with an expanded look at the larger world and universe, will be impossible to replicate. With his students he has studied the night skies, flensed whales that have washed up on our beaches, trekked desert landscapes with constructed pinhole cameras, travelled to the mountains and over them looking for fossils of flora and fauna, charted and drawn maps of the school to the open spaces of Utah, and developed poise, confidence and comportment in our budding adolescents through ballroom dance – and so much more.

So the question is: What are we looking for in hiring a teacher to fill that important role? Also, what are we looking to incorporate in our program for our younger students that can be brought in through these new teachers? We have a robust program that incorporates the State Common Core Standards in math/science, language arts, (reading and writing), history, humanities, along with P.E., a vibrant pre-school program for 4 year olds, and an outstanding music and visual and performing arts program. What do we want to underscore in hiring new teachers that will continue to inspire our students? What skill sets are we looking for in potential employees, i.e. Spanish certification, tech tools, experiential learning experience, sustainable community and environmental stewardship values and experience, social-emotional development training, critical thinking and creative problem solving skills, diversity and equity values, skills for educating the whole child to become independent thinkers and lifelong learners, to name some that come to mind.

These are things we value, as written in our Vision and Mission statements. There is room for community input to add to that conversation. If you can't attend, you can submit your comments to our administration and the

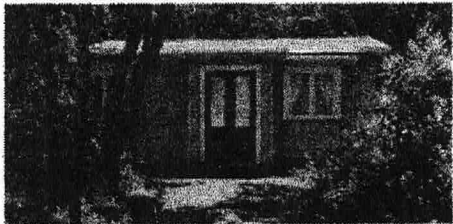

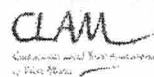

The Wife (2017)

I can see most definitely why Glenn Close was a best actress nominee for this film. Her performance was stellar. As for the subject matter, as a fiction writer myself, I could totally relate. After an 18 year journey writing *The Brower Legacy* I still wonder if my characters are developed enough, if I gave them a solid voice, if their journey was really over. It's not easy. All you have to do to be a writer is write, as they say, but, there are struggles. That was so wonderfully shown by Jonathan Pryce and Glenn Close as a couple married over thirty years, sharing a love of the written word.

When Joe (Jonathan Pryce) is recognized for the work, Joan (Glenn Close) accompanies him for the journey with their son David (Max Irons, son of Jeremy Irons), also a writer, and a very eager reporter out to write the ultimate biography, portrayed by the illustrious Christian Slater who has come out of semi retirement to show his same intense talent and mischievous grin he had back in the days of *Heathers* and *Pump Up the Volume*.

This is a powerful film, one that makes you think. Every artist has a muse, whether it's a person, a place, or a memory of where the desire to create started. After my second book I was a bit blocked, but just seeing this film inspired me again

TSUNAMI EXERCISE

On Saturday, March 30th at 10:00 a.m. the Bolinas Fire Department and Bolinas Disaster Council will be conducting a VOLUNTARY TSUNAMI EVACUATION drill for the Downtown and Gospel Flats area.

We will be using AlertMarin to place a call to all landline home numbers in these areas with a prerecorded message at approximately 10:00 a.m. Saturday March 30th. Alert Marin will also send text messages to all registered cell phones in these areas. We encourage everyone to participate as the evacuation from these areas will likely be the same during a real event.

If you choose to participate, please proceed in your vehicle to the Bolinas Fire Station on Mesa Rd. At the fire station you will find information on emergency preparedness from the Fire Department, Disaster Council, and West Marin CERT.

During a real event, we will use Alert Marin to deliver incident-specific information or potentially life-saving instructions. To receive "Alert Marin" texts and find out more about Alert Marin, go to www.AlertMarin.org

While this exercise is focused on the low lying areas, all citizens of Bolinas are encouraged to stop by the fire station to pick up information about Emergency Preparedness.

During the exercise you may see emergency vehicles moving throughout your neighborhood to simulate an actual response. This is not only great practice for us but it also allows us to familiarize ourselves with your neighborhood and identify potential hazards.

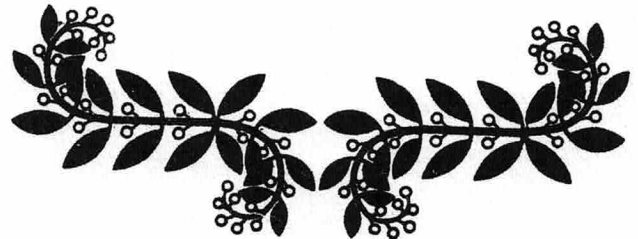

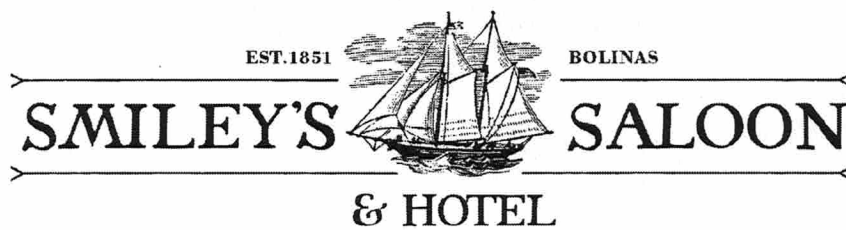

Community Notice re. Restoration & Renovation of Smiley's Saloon Building
March 28, 2019

After 4 years spent in planning and permitting review, we have just received our building permit for construction work on the Smiley's Saloon Building. Starting May 13, we will begin restoring failing parts of the building (i.e. the foundation) with essential life-safety upgrades and replacing the residential kitchen with a commercial kitchen. Below is a summary of information about the work and an upcoming Community Q&A on Sunday April 7th at 11am in the Bar.

In 1983-84, owner Bob Glenn closed the bar for a significant period of time to retrofit the building, restoring it from the hunting lodge/pizza parlor look of the 1950s-1970s to the classic look it has today (see the photo collage from the Bolinas Museum showing how the bar has changed over the years). No major structural work has been done since then.

When we purchased Smiley's on 1/2/2015, we conducted multiple inspections and were aware that there were many critical structural upgrades and life-safety repairs that would need to be performed to keep the Saloon thriving for many decades to come. The foundation must be retrofitted for earthquake safety and structural support must be added to address the 6 inches of sag in the middle of the building. This work then triggers essential ADA upgrades, particularly wheelchair accessible bathrooms and entrance. Our old ship saloon is taking on water with burst pipes below the building, leaks in the roofs, ceilings, and damaged old plumbing throughout. The electrical is unsafe, and our mechanical appliances are all failing. The list goes on, but suffice to say, the building is badly in need of major repair.

In order to help the business thrive and also serve a broader swath of the community, we are also planning to convert the upstairs residential kitchen into a commercial kitchen of the same compact footprint. This will enable us to serve a menu of "fast casual" fare (order at the bar). The inside of the main bar will look much as it does now, but we will be refinishing the floors, repairing wainscoting and adding a new door on the left wall to provide wheelchair access to an outdoor patio where food and drink can be enjoyed. Behind the building, under the back deck, we'll be excavating to add a walk-in fridge and other mechanical and storage. A new catwalk will extend from the upper deck to give a new entrance to our office and the upstairs apartment. (See attached 3D drawing and plans).

Budget and regulatory constraints disallow any major changes to the hotel, aside from basic repairs to replace rotten wood. The hotel will be offline throughout the course of construction, through the end of 2019, as it will be used for provisional storage, office and operations. We are working hard to minimize the number of days the bar will be closed, and we plan to run the bar on limited hours while work is happening outside and behind the building.

We are working hard to minimize disruption to daily life in Bolinas, and we thank you in advance for your patience. We have leased space from the Bolinas Community Land Trust, new owners of 31 Wharf Road next door to us, and we will stage equipment and vehicles from that area, so there will be minimal impact in the street. We will also not work on weekends, and we'll do our best to continue to serve as your local watering hole while the work is occurring. We're very excited to offer even more libation, entertainment, and food once the work is complete!

We will be hosting a Community Q&A on Sunday April 7th at 11AM in the Bar. Please stop by if you have questions or comments.

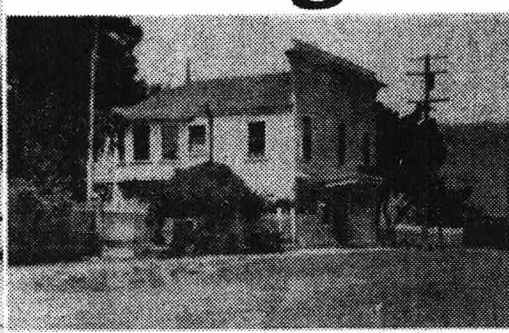

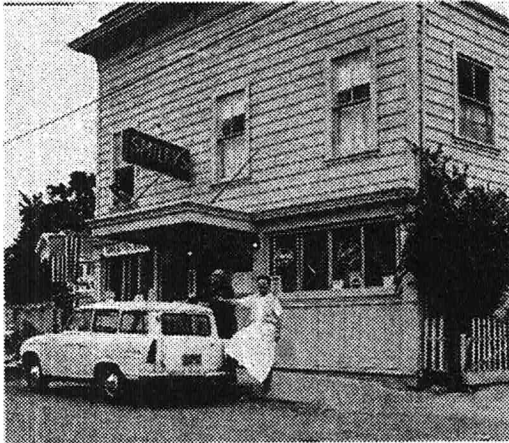

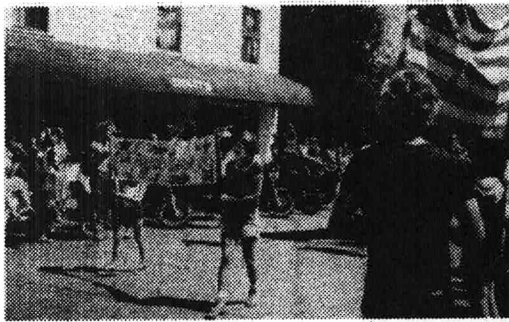

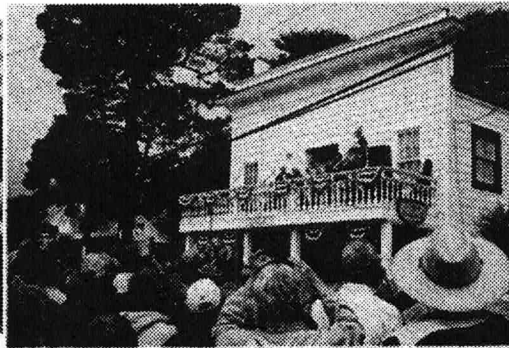

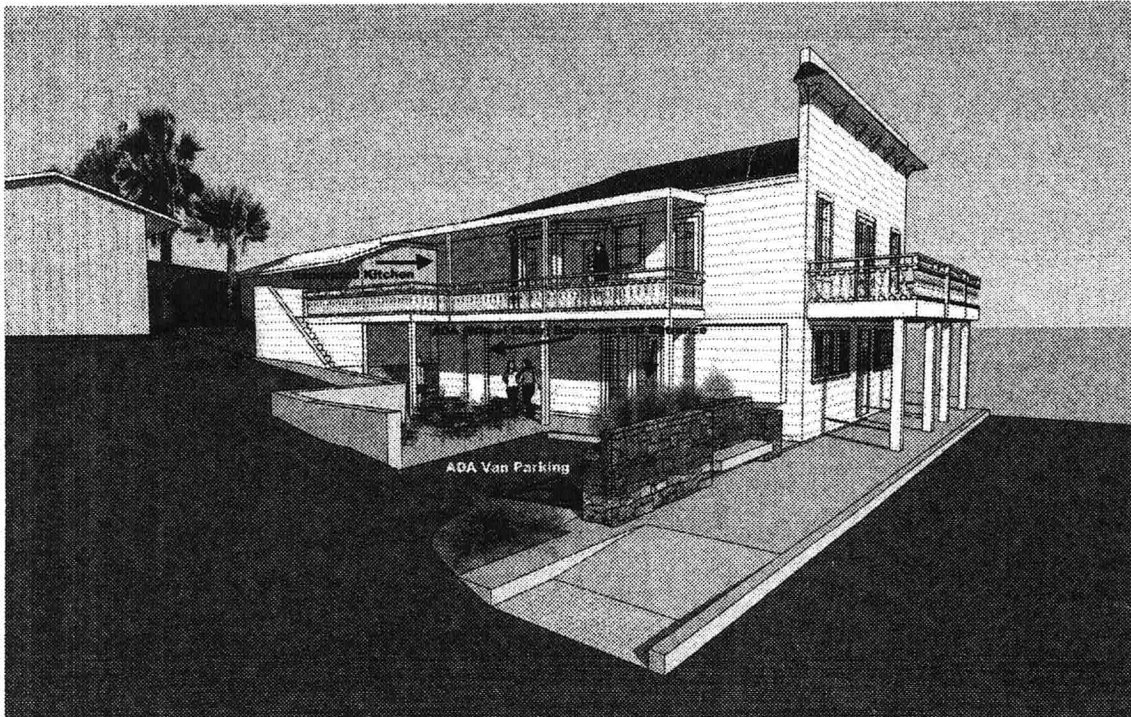
