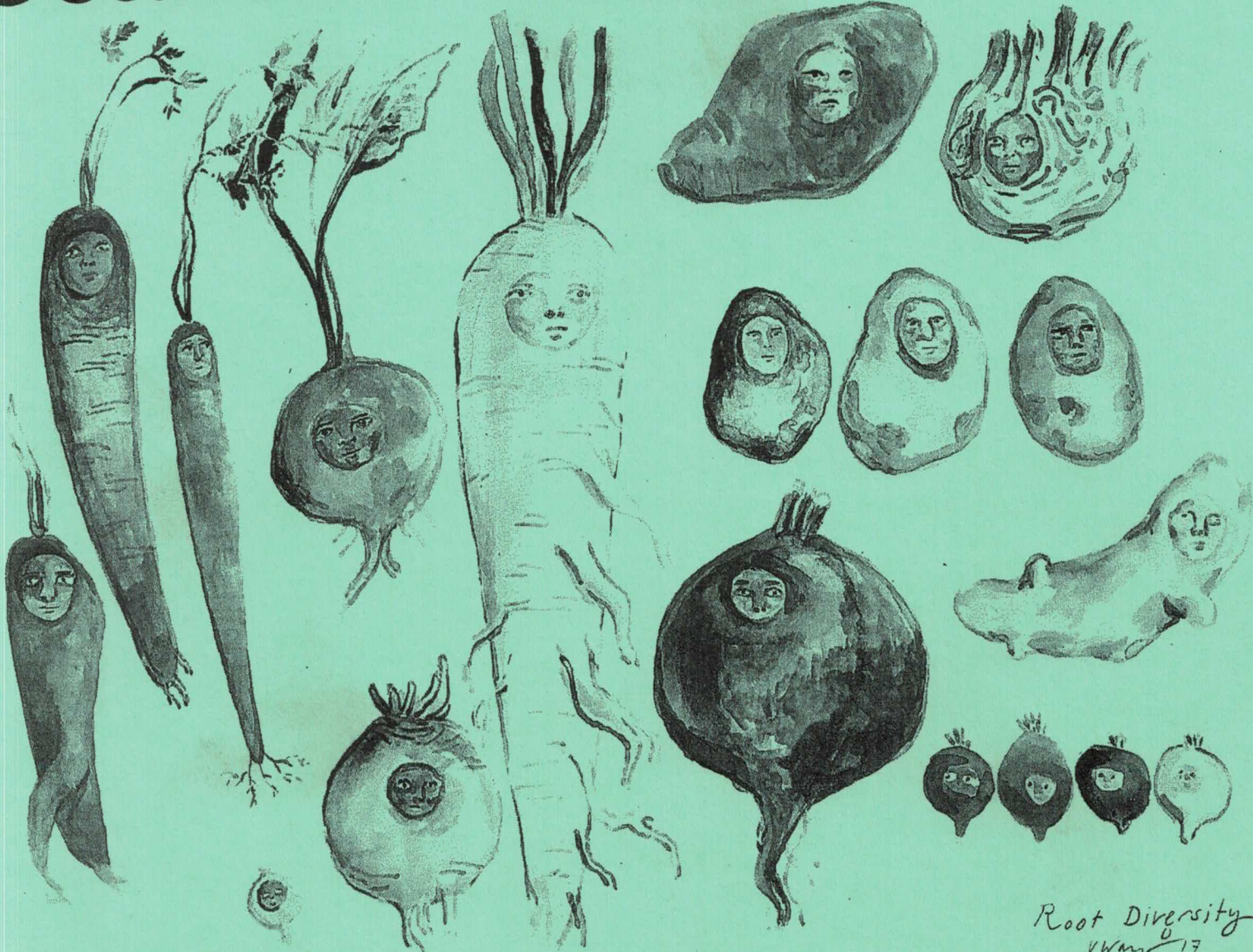

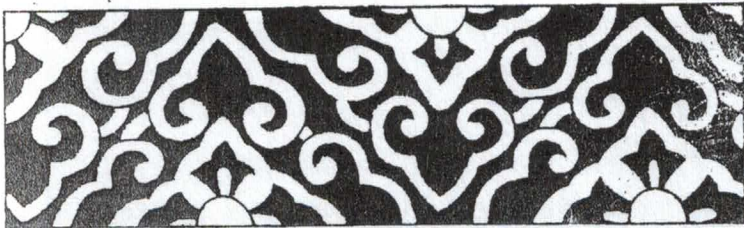

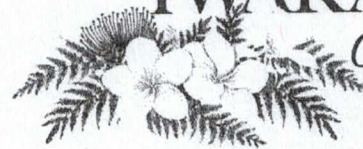

AFTER THE BROOM PULL WAS OVER

Sunday, April 23, 2017



Last weekend, on a beautiful Sunday morning, encountering no traffic over the bridge, I drove over to Bolinas after a drinking a cup of Equator coffee and eating one of Um Muhammed's delicious brownies in Tam Junction. I picked up three broom pullers (baby, mama and papa sized) at Judith Larner's to bring to the on-going Spanish-Scotch broom pulling event on the knoll below the treatment ponds. I met Meg on the way. She was coming from the knoll, wondering where the rest of us were.

When we finally all gathered at the right spot, a quick decision was made to focus, not on the broom growing around the fence at the top of a Murch garden (my idea), but to take out a big, in-your-face broom plant surrounded by and surrounding poison oak, cotoneaster and a coffee berry bush. Ken quickly commandeered to great effect the new Japanese saw I bought at Judith's to cut down the many thick branches of the flowering bloom. I worked on the thinner branches of cotoneaster, while Juliana took on broom further into the field. Tish's passion was to weed around the young native plants we had found and flagged at the last event. Meg was rewarded for her hard work by uprooting an impressive system of woody cotoneaster underground stem and roots. Janjne worked with all of us, giving good advice based on years of working in gardens and restoration projects.

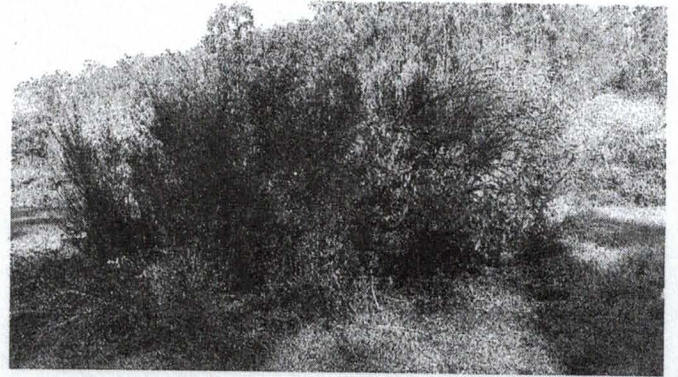
While you might not be able to see much of our handiwork if you don't walk into the tall grass, you will definitely notice the difference between the growth around the old (cypress?) snag before and after when you walk up the steep path and turn your eyes to the left. The coffeeberry (*Rhamnus* or *Frangula californica*) and wild cucumber (*Marah macrocarpus*) are revealed in all their native glory. Amen!

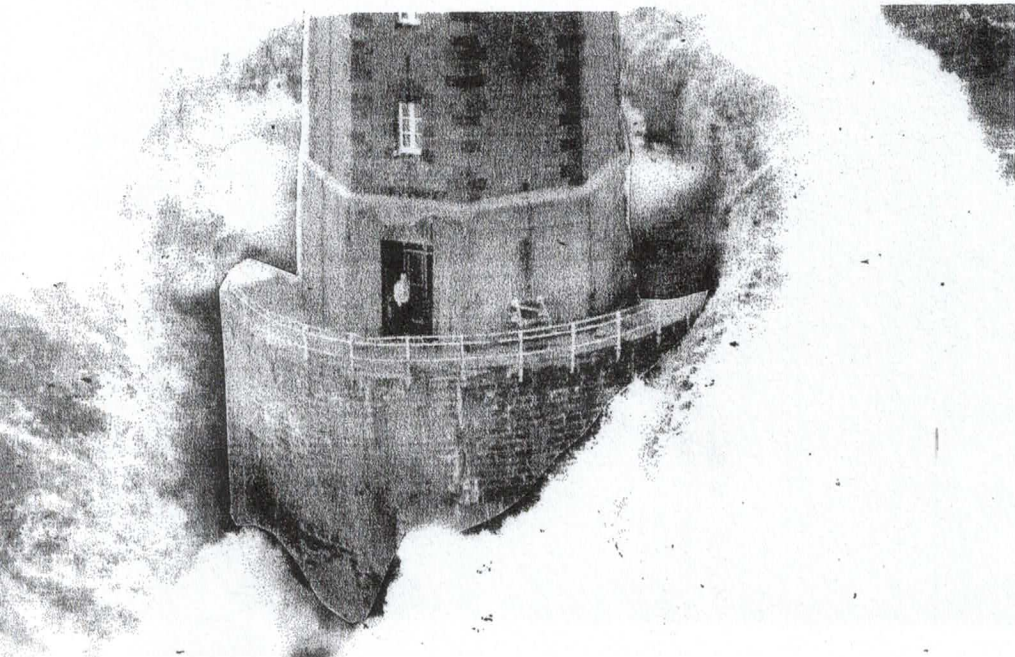

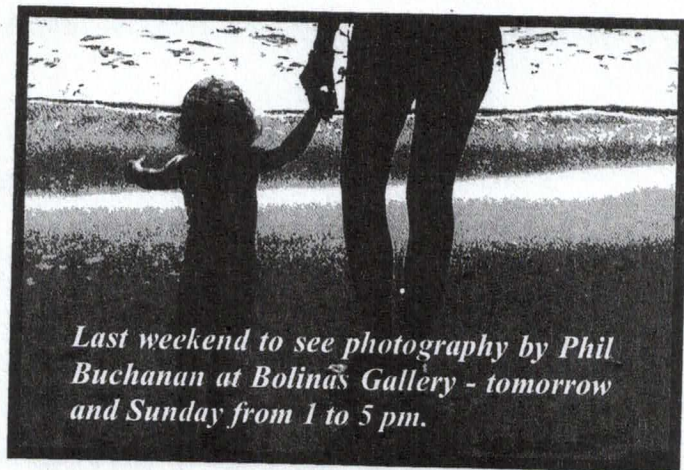

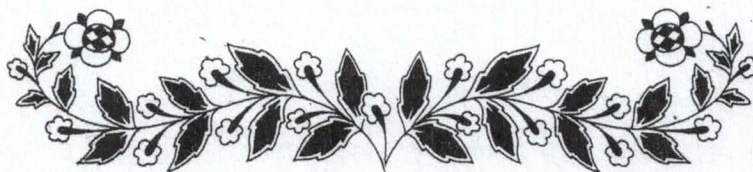
BELOVED
