I met with Sherm & Lydia several times in their home on Mesa Rd to negotiate the purchase of their 11 acre parcel surrounding the Fire House (which, incidentally they gave to the Town) on behalf of the Town so we could have Mesa Park (known in the early years as Firehouse Park).

I never felt any of the animosity from either of them that you refer to & I was one of those early '70's arrivals. Incidentally, so was your Dad.

Sherm was recalled (along with others) because of the plan to create a huge marina and amusement park in Bolinas Lagoon. I had the plans for this for a while (given to me by Francis Stewart) and I think they now reside with the Bolinas Museum.

To characterize folks like Bill Niman, Orville Shell, Mimi Harris, Jack McClellan and others as "over-the-hill hippies" does a great disservice to them and the others who helped keep Bo from becoming just another resort destination. Incidentally, why is the term "hippies" almost universally used in a derogatory sense? Among many other instances, weren't the folks in the streets of Chicago during the Democratic Convention protesting the Vietnam War, "hippies"? I think so!

You're too young to remember the Oil Spill. Oh well, you can read about it at the Museum.

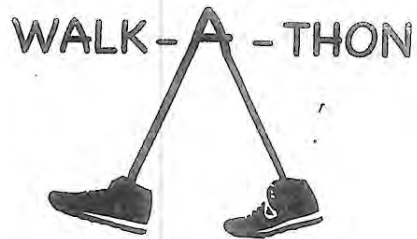

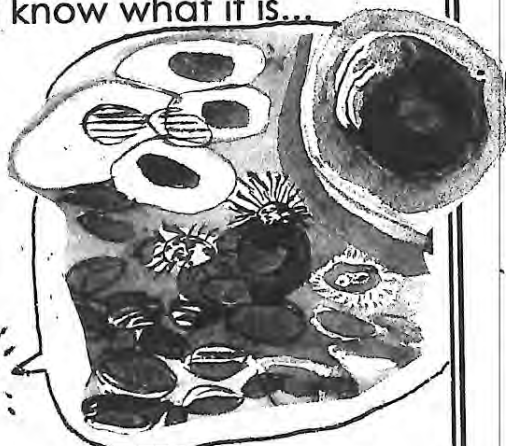
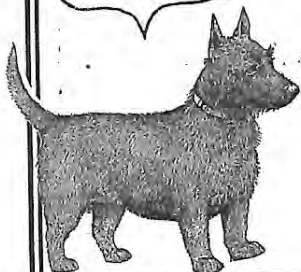

For those who love the choral arts and happen to be over the hill on this Sunday, May 3rd at 3 p.m., There is a free concert from Singers Marin at the Marin Headland's Hostel on the North side of Sausalito.

Wings of Song is an all-women group that will be singing popular fair, both classical and popular. Second up is Just Voices, a sextet that I am singing with, who will be performing the ethereal music of Eric Whitacre (check on line for his Lux Aurunque) and a couple jazz standards like Gershwin's Embraceable You and Hoagy Carmichael's Skylark (on line singing The Hong Kong Blues) + a beautiful version of Shenandoah. The concert will last approximately one hour with light refreshments served.

Directions are: Take Highway 101 South to the last exit for Sausalito (before the GG Bridge): Alexander Avenue. As you come off the exit, take a right. Follow the road as it curves back under the highway, and take the first and immediate left you encounter, Bunker Road, where you'll come to a one-way tunnel, with a 5-minute red light. Drive through the tunnel and continue on Bunker Road into the Headlands. After about 2 miles, you'll come to an intersection at Field Road; there'll be a sign on your right that points the way to various locations including the hostel. Turn left and then take your first left unto Bodsworth Road, left onto Simmonds Road, then a slight right onto Rosenstock Road. The house on top of the hill is the hostel! Limited parking is on the far side of the building – with additional parking just before you get to the Hostel.
