John Barrow died May 11, 2013. He was my first friend in Bolinas, when I arrived in 1972. Our kids were the same age and in the same classes at the Bolinas School. There were memorable moments with them, riding horses on the beach and motorcycles in Middleton's field or hanging out in Dave Duffin's motorcycle shop at school, John was one of those quiet people who changed the lives of others in a positive way.

His influence is felt every day in Bolinas. Way back then, he and Art Carpenter decided that it was important for all our kids' education to know how to build things. Art, a master woodworker, and John, who worked at Art's Espenet workshop, transformed the old bus shed at the school into a woodshop. John and Art would teach students what they could do with wood. I remember John saying: "It's easy. Everything is a box: a house, a musical instrument, and a dresser. You just make that and go from there!" It was the start of the Art Shop Program at the Bolinas School. There is a carving on the door of the Quesada building that John did during those creative, crazy years.

He was also one of the first settlers in Paradise Valley. He lived with his family down by Pine Gulch Creek until he and Lea built their house. My family has lived in that same house for many years. When we first moved to Paradise Valley, we didn't know much about farming but knew we all wanted to "get back to the land." John bought Bessie, our giant Jersey cow. He milked her for years. She was a free-°©-range cow. He would call Bessie, and she would come clopping along, running as fast as she could, from wherever she was in the Valley. Sometimes, I would take over the milking chores. Bessie would wait until I finished and invariably put her dirtiest back hoof into the bucket of fresh milk. I always took it very personally. John thought it was hysterical.


John was a wonderful woodworker, painter, carpenter, cartoonist, and lover of the arts. He saw beauty everywhere, from the torn posters on walls to the glories of the soft Marin hills and sea to the far away wonders of Machu Picchu. He was born November 21, 1931 in New Haven, Connecticut but grew up in Berea, Kentucky. As a youngster, he was influenced by the amazing crafts produced in the region. He attended art school in Philadelphia, where he deepened his appreciation of fine craftsmanship. His father, John, was a college librarian, and his Mom was an extraordinary craftswoman herself making everything from tables to quilts.

He came to Bolinas in 1970 and met Lorraine (Tui) shortly after he arrived. They were together for many years and had four children, John, Jesse, Celia, and Claudia. We lost Claudia at a young age in a tragic accident. In 1976, he married Lea and had another child, Ted. He and the family left Bolinas in1978, heading to Austin, Texas. After caring for elders in the family for many years, they returned to California in 1997. Landing in Grass Valley, John finally realized his dream for a large painting studio. In 2010, tempted by the lure of the big city, they bought a house in Berkeley. He was always interested in politics and drew political cartoons. He loved jazz, classical music, and learned to play the cello at 75.

He and Lea created an extended family that included Tenzin, Sonam, Pema, and Julia. He loved this family as his own. When Julia was in my art class, she would always tell me stories about "Grandpa John".

He is survived by his wife, Lea; his children, John, Jesse, Celia, and Ted; and grandchildren Orrian, Delano, and Lianna Willis, and Emily Barrow. We will truly miss this amazing person who we were all so blessed to know.



Secretly we call her Saint Martha but she can be quite irreverernt which I find very attractive . Hope to see you in the SWIRL




REBELS WITH A CAUSE Saturday May 18, 7:00
