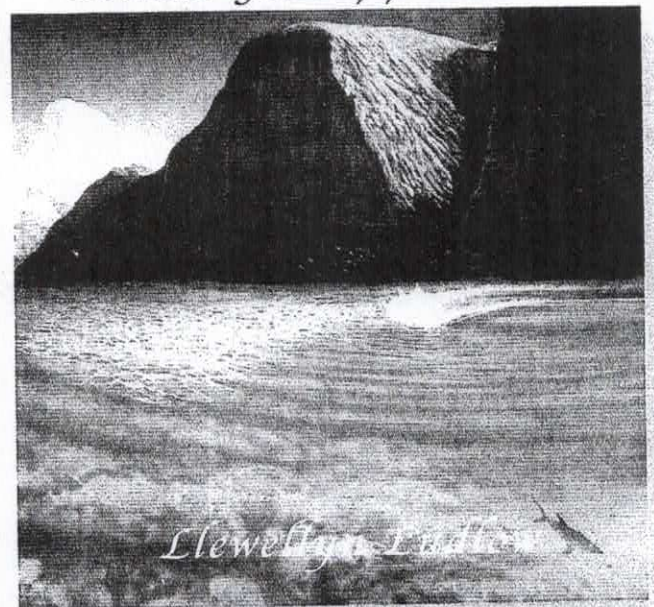

Tales of a Part Time Crossing Guard or "Stop, in the Name of Love"

My job search after living 14 years in Mexico was very humbling. I had to dig out my resume (is that what they are still called?) from the basement, find out if my old references were still in good standing, let alone alive, and find some clothes that would be fine for interviews. When I didn't get my perfect, made for me job as a therapist at a nearby elementary school, my heart broke and I vowed, "never to fall in love (with a job) again." I saw the roadside ad for Crossing Guard and thought; I'll do that. I can do that.

I'm someone that sinks below sea level without some semblance of routine. When I have something to help me organize my days, I am able to get my head out of the ground and look around and see what else is out there. Yes, I can walk the fourth mile every day and stand there. Good for my meditation practice.

Just when I decided to apply, I saw someone out there. Shucks! I can't even get the crossing guard job. But, the head honcho called and said he'd get me on board. He is a retired businessman who rides his bike and wants the streets safe for kids to do the same. During the process he got in a bike accident and got all scraped up. He minimized it. He is a super kind man. I was happy to get the job. That same week, I got two other jobs, directing a play in Baja and working on the library bus, the FLAGship. Both came from the universe. Not from resumes, interviews and references. And, none in my career field, but all use the skills in some way or other.

Anyway, I have now worked only once a week with occasional fill ins, and it is a great experience. I keep meaning to count the number of cars that pass by during the hour-long shift, but I get too distracted and there are too many these days to count. I love just Stopping as my sign says. Oh, we get a sign, and fluorescent yellow cap and vest. I experience the change in seasons and time. The light changes. The birds sing or don't and fly. I measure time by the happenings: 2:45 I start, 3 the bell rings and the kids get out. 3:15 the two busses leave, Marty one way Ben the other. Ben waves his cool peace wave, both buses need to compensate for not enough room to turn out of the driveway. 3:30, the busses return empty of kids and down comes the flag. 3:40, the last crosser crosses, a teacher who walks to and from school.

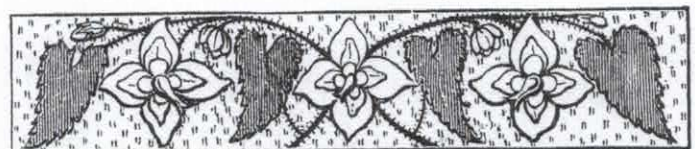
Kids cross. They have learned to get off their bikes or skateboards. Some do a testing half walk half ride. They tell me things. "I had to stay after to play Hotel California," "She left cheese in the Music room and we have to get it so it doesn't smell up the room," "I have such a hard time getting my teen to get ready in

the morning," and even a girl curtsying and saying, "Pleased to meet you." Of course I curtsyed back. Some parents talk, most are in a rush. Teachers leave. The maintenance man comes and chats before he goes to Stinson School. The PE teacher wheels out his equipment. I marvel at this way of nurturing injured or aching backs, One kid often leaves behind a binder, book or lunch box and comes back to get it. The Guatemalan workers cross diagonally on their bikes. I try to stop traffic for them, but really we aren't required to do that if people don't cross at the crosswalk. "Buenas tardes." I then tell them about my ESL class (another job I recently got) on Wednesday nights.

I would say that 90% of the people who drive by wave. It is so interesting. I feel like I am in Mr. Roger's Neighborhood. Something about the presence of a crossing guard is comforting. There is order. All is right with the world. Like a postman or milkman or bus driver. The uniform. Even though our duties are minimal. We are not police. We do not direct traffic. We aren't supposed to. We are not supposed to wave people on. We are supposed to use our voices to direct them. And, use our sign. STOP. I see people slow down just when they see me.

I think having a crossing guard even at a place without a lot of foot traffic is valuable. It makes people become mindful for a split second of what they are doing. Driving. Moving fast. "Oh, yes, I am driving." And, oh, there are kids here and a school and trees and egrets and birds and people who I know and appreciate. Oh, yeah. I forgot in my fast moving insta-text hurry. Now I too feel a camaraderie with all the crossing guards I see when driving in the Canals and by Tam. I even attended the annual Crossing Guard barbecue, All Marin County Crossing Guards. A woman from South Carolina, Barbados whose kids are in college in NY, a mix of ages and ethnicities. All of us a bit eccentric. And all the bus drivers too. If I had gotten my "perfect meant for me job" I probably wouldn't feel connected to all those folks. And, isn't that what jobs and life are all about? So, yes, I love this job and I love to watch all of you hover and scamper and crawl and drag and bounce along your paths. I love the chance to cross paths with you and to sometimes encourage you to STOP.

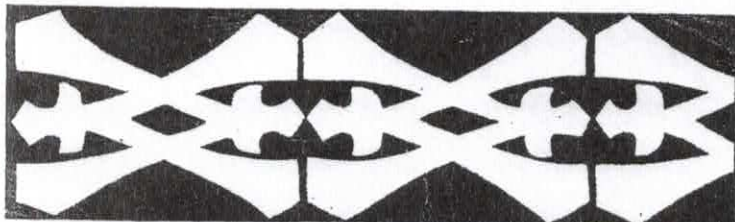

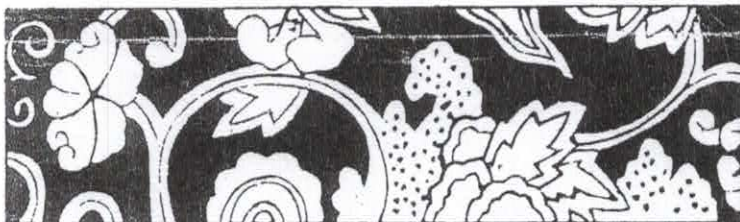

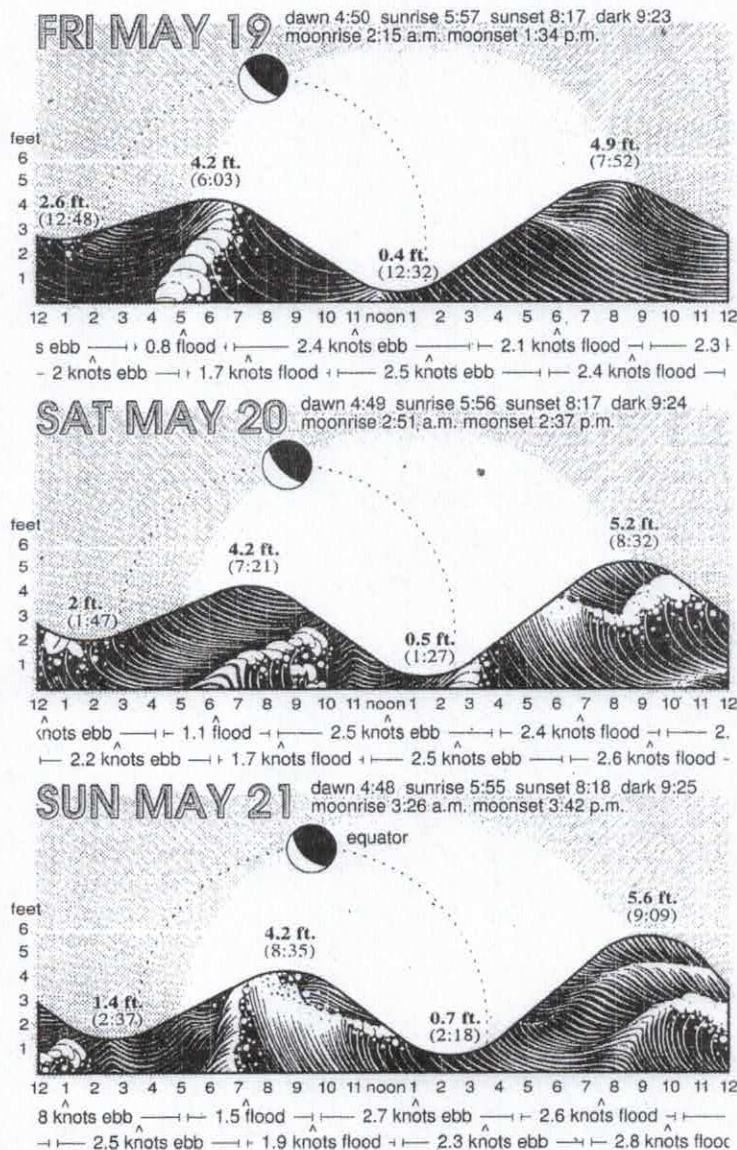
