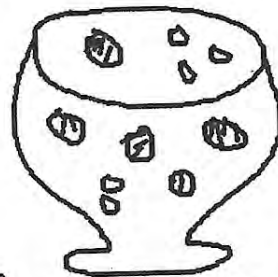

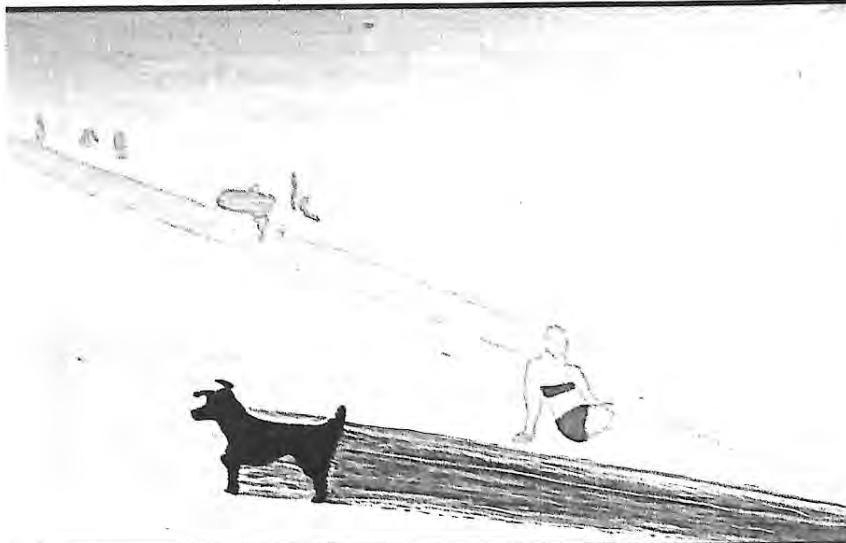

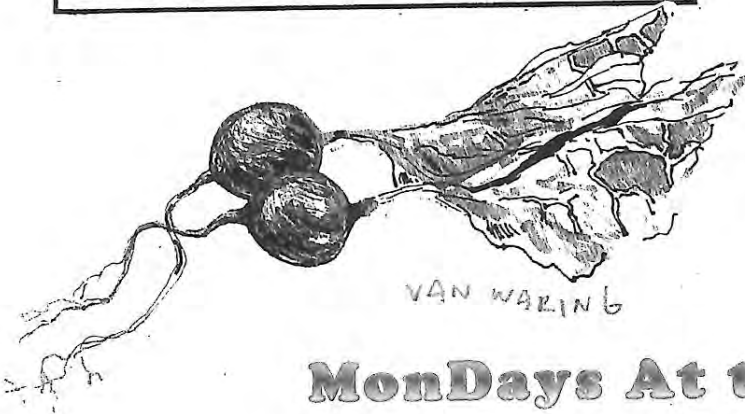

KNOW YOUR BO

By 1882, over 300,000 Chinese were in California. "The sight of labor battalions in pigtailed on Bolinas ridge in the spring of 1878" was commonplace. Samuel P. Taylor kept a crew of Chinese men busy at his paper mill on Lagunitas Creek. Hundreds trawled for shrimp off McNear's Point. Point Reyes had 500 Chinese potato diggers; and Chinese farmhands, houseboys, vaqueros and gardeners were commonplace in Bolinas. Sam Clark of Bolinas traded Ah Wo Sing a shed for laundering the family wash in Pine Gulch Creek. Within months, Ah Wo was doing half the dirty clothes in Bolinas.

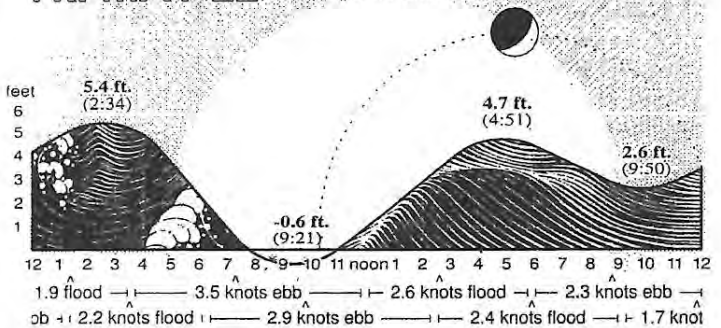

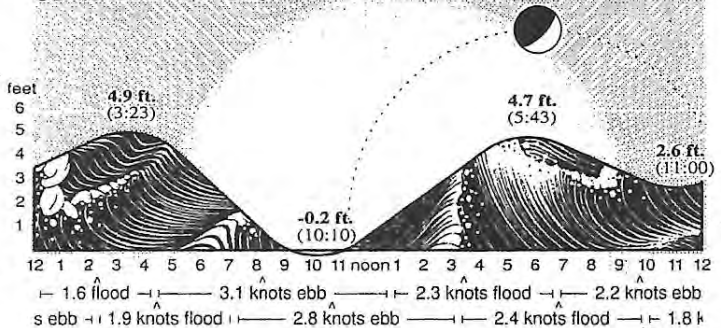

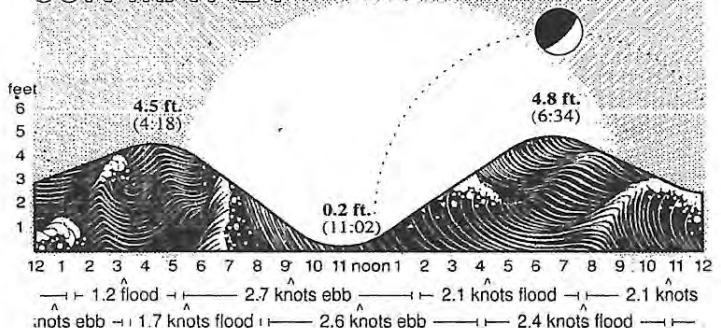
