Bolinas photographer wins Pirkle Jones grant

The Pirkle Jones Foundation, established by the late Mill Valley photographer Pirkle Jones, has named Bolinas resident Eli Geller as the third recipient of a grant from its Visual Artists Support Program. The program supports promising emerging and mid-career artists living in Marin County. Photographer Geller will receive a grant of

The PJF Visual Arts Support Program grant aims to recognize, encourage, and nurture artistic imagination and drive, commitment to the creative process, aesthetic standards, and artistic potential.

Upon notification of the grant, Geller wrote, "I am completely amazed and filled with gratitude by this opportunity. This is a monumental affirmation as an artist. I am looking forward to a wonderful year as a photographer, and to cultivating and expanding my universe in art and life."

After a 2013 sold out show at the Gospel Flat Farm Gallery in Bolinas, Eli made the decision to pursue photography full time. He was inspired to be an artist after watching a film about the life and work of Ansel Adams. This led to his discovery of and dedication to the alternative photographic process called "lith printing". He notes, "The process allows me to express the numinous, mysterious beauty that I see. I am especially moved by the raw, untouched natural world. Every 'lith print' is one of a kind, through them I am constantly reminded of the tremendous beauty that surrounds and enfolds us, and that Nature is the greatest artist of all."

From Nancy Blanchard over the phone:

John Barrow: A Recollection

It was 1967 & I'd lived in Bolinas just a few months when one day I remarked to John that it would sure be a plus if we had a bulletin board here; there had never been one, let alone a newspaper of any kind. I mentioned it had been very popular back in the Fifties near the university of Chicago to have a giant tree covered with notices.

A couple of days later, John said to me, "Raise 40 Dollars & I'll make a board." "OK" I said, but I thought to myself it was sort of a lot of money. I wondered how I'd manage to raise it.

Yet how easy it turned out to be! Everyone I spoke to contributed a Dollar, so I soon had collected the amount, which helped me know me community; it had been nothing but a pleasure.

Shortly afterwards John had not just made, he had CARVED the most beautiful bulletin board in the world...

We mounted it immediately on the Pepper Store where it has resided to this day, 46 ½ years later. If you peer closely at its surround, you can still make out the words:

"COMMUNITY BULLETIN BOARD- Every Man, Woman & Child in this Village may enjoy, share & be responsible for this Board."

What a guy... Good Bye, John

From a letter to his Father about Paradise Valley.

The external pitfalls are something I should use some ribbon on because I know our stand must worry and interest you. Me too. What we are doing is civil disobedience. I feel like neither a criminal or a revolutionary. Our county (by no means uniquely) has been (is being) massively despoiled by developers. Many acres of delicate and beautiful land is cut, divided, and rendered useless (in any real way, by our lights) by greed. We (mankind) must learn to use our land more wisely and sensitively. And this is exactly what we want to learn to do with this valley, for ourselves and as an example.

Our disobedience will be directed mostly toward the building codes. I see (we see) building codes as a mass of legislation developed to protect buyers from dishonourable sellers, builders, realtors etc., to fatten manufacturers of materials and lastly to protect those who live in buildings. Our motive is not profit, and we believe in our honour anyway. Our charter makes it impossible for us to realize profit from our buildings. We will live in our valley and farm it, so who is better qualified to establish standards for that life than us?





ELECTION NEWS! DEADLINES FOR CANDIDACY AND FOR BALLOT MEASURES! PLEASE READ!

The terms of 3 BCPUD Directors expire this year.** If you would like to run for one of these seats in the November 5, 2013 election, you must declare your candidacy during the filing period, which opens July 15, 2013 and closes August 9, 2013 at 5:00 p.m. The appropriate forms are available from the Registrar of Voters office at the Civic Center (Room 121) and must be filed there. If any of the 3 BCPUD Directors whose terms are expiring at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period for non-incumbents only will be extended through August 14, 2013.

** News Flash: one of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year has publicly declared his intention to run for reelection and another of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year has publicly declared her intention *not* to run for reelection.

The last day to submit measures for placement on the November ballot is August 9, 2013; the last day to withdraw a measure from the ballot is August 14, 2013. The last day to submit ballot arguments is August 19, 2013 and the last day to submit rebuttal arguments is August 26, 2013. In each case, the pertinent documents regarding measures on the ballot must be received by the County's Election Office by 4:30 p.m. on the deadline date.






