


Wear comfortable clothes, flat shoes or barefoot. Eat lightly at least one half hour before class.



Presented by the Inverness Garden Club, this is the second part of the Hungry Owls Project.



Pres. Buchanan called the regular meeting of the Bolinas Fire Protection District to order at 7:30PM. Vice Pres. Smith, Dir. Kimball and Dir. Chiera were present. Also present: Syd Bass, Chief Brown and Secretary Brown.

Chief Brown reported that she is waiting for Parcel address information to complete the fire prevention mailer to all property owners. She hopes the mailing will be completed in the next two weeks. FEMA grant monies from a past grant will be used to finance the outreach.

No update.

Training

Volunteer Firefighter trainings have been continuing on Thursday nights. Last continuing on Intrisday nights. Last
Thursday, Battalion Chief Mike Giannini,
Marin County Fire Department, conducted the
training on Documentation Key Points and the
new ePCR program that is being implemented. Wildland fire training is next on the training schedule. There will also be separate training for three new Volunteers; Rovon Sanders, Steve Gerrick and Peter Orner. The Officers

will meet prior to the regular training to discuss the training schedule, scene management, driver training and summer

Chief Brown noted that FF Rippe is regularly volunteering his available time after his regular work schedule to the Department. She appreciates the consistently high standard of effort that he regularly makes.

Volunteers
No update on BCPUD/BFPD Shared
Personnel. Chief Brown did contact GM
Blackman of BCPUD to resolve this issue.
Volunteers will train on BCPUD equipment
also for a fair exchange. Their goal is to resolve the issue as soon as possible.

Chief Brown reported that E285 was taken to Absolute Customs in Petaluma for body repair work. She clarified that the deductable for the repair was \$250 not \$1,000 as previously stated. She thanked FFs Rippe, Krakauer and Capt. Smith for their help in shuttling the engine back and forth.

Disaster Council

Chief Brown reported that she and Beth Carusillo met with Tom Jordan, Marin county Office of Emergency Services and Tessa Shvedoff, Red Cross Disaster Manager, on March 29th to discuss the status of disaster shelters in Bolinas. Tessa provided a great deal of information including how many shelter managers and workers would be needed during an event. Chief Brown has since been in touch with Phil Rollins, Marin Red Cross Disaster Team Lead and Shelter Survey Coordinator, who has scheduled a survey of Commonweal. Beth and Chief Brown will accompany him on the survey in April. She is also scheduling meetings with the Bolinas Community Center and with GM Jennifer Blackman of BCPUD on the same day regarding potential emergency Chief Brown reported that she and Beth the same day regarding potential emergency

Beth and FF Terry Donohue are attending a 3-day course in Santa Rosa on Emergency and Department Operations Centers. Chief Brown noted that FF Donohue will be an excellent addition to the EOC staff should one need to be activated. Chief Brown attended a planning meeting of the Mill Valley Evacuation Exercise on April 4th. She plans to work with other West Marin agencies and plan a similar drill. She met with Ann Eichhorn, the Southern

Marin Medical Reserve Corp Branch Director,

on April 11th. The MMRC is a volunteer group of medical personnel that would respond to various areas in Marin during a disaster. Chief Brown invited her to the next West Marin Disaster Council meeting to be held on May 23rd so she

may speak to the entire group.

Dir. Chiera asked who would take the lead if an evacuation was necessary from too large a fire in Bolinas. Chief Brown answered that the Fire Department/Disaster Council would be in charge until law enforcement would take over including the National Park Service, California Highway Patrol or the Sheriff Department. She spoke of the need for mutual training involving the Disaster Council and all of law enforcement to address our specific needs and area for a successful evacuation.

Building and Grounds

Chief Brown reported that the interior painting of the station is near completion. She expressed the need for a proper Building and Grounds Committee meeting in order to address all of the projects that are needed to maintain the station and grounds.

General Operations

Chief Brown announced that she and Sec. Brown will meet with Bookkeeper Kaaren Gann tomorrow to restructure the Chart of Accounts to align with categories in the budget. She would like to meet with the Finance Committee on May 2^{nd} . Review of financials by Directors will also be discussed.

Chief Brown met with Bill Barton, the new President of the Lyon's Club, and others to discuss July 4th planning. She passed on important information including traffic control points and advice about pounding rebar with tape to block illegal parking in critical areas. She is confident the day will go smoothly

Pres. Buchanan remarked that there were many medical calls last month. New homeless people in town were discussed.

Surfers' Overlook Repair/Terrace Avenue Dir. Kimbali reported that the next phase of the geotechnical investigation occurred on April 16th and 17th. The tides were low enough to allow for two drillings of exploratory borings done on the beach and one on Terrace Avenue. A full report from SAGE is expected soon. Dir. Kimball remarked that even though permits and funding are not currently secured the geotechnical evaluation would accelerate

the time for a repair to be shovel ready by 6 to the time for a repair to be shovel ready by 6 to 12 months, should Terrace Avenue become an emergency condition and expedited permitting and emergency funding become available. With the knowledge from preliminary findings complete, a repair could be started in a much quicker and efficient time frame.

Chief Brown thanked Dir. Kimball for his hard

Dir. Kimball thanked Syd for offering her skill set to the Board and for getting involved with Fire District matters.

MSC, Kimball/Smith (unan) to approve the Ethics and Brown Act Training Policy as amended.

The Board requested a slight word change in the document.

CONSENT CALENDAR
MSC, Chiera/Kimball (unan) to approve the Consent Calendar including the Minutes from the March 25, 2013 regular meeting, the the March 25, 2013 regular meeting, the warrant lists from March 19 – April 16, 2013 and the financial reports for February 2013. Dir. Kimball asked why expenses are down \$50,000 less than budgeted. He also asked when a vehicle will next be expected to replace. Chief Brown expects to replace the next engine in three years and estimates the cost at \$400,000. Large expenses are on the horizon but the District is prepared with funds in place. Secretary Brown said that mailings place. Secretary Brown said that mailings from the County may be slow due to another change in the financing system software.

Dir. Chiera expressed concern about the impending costs of a new MERA system. Chief Brown concurred that new costs could be detrimental for small and large fire districts. She stated that she also hears great concern from other departments at Chiefs' Meetings.

Chief Brown reminded the Board that the Mothers' Day Pancake Breakfast is scheduled for May 12th.

The Personnel Committee, consisting of Pres. Buchanan and Dir. Chiera will meet after the Finance Committee meets.

Chief Brown hopes and plans to have the draft budget ready for approval at the June meeting.



MESA PARK BOARD MEETING April 8, 2013 7:00 PM BCPUD Office

Call to Order: 7:07 PM

Members present: Dylan, Jane, Charles, Bryan, Patricia Hickey

Others: Angela Vernon, Chloe McClellum & Javi Alverado [interns for the Land Trust] Mechelle Cattell, Amber Di Stasi, Roger Peacock.

Community Expression: request for use of field for Children's Center fund-raiser. [Amber] We're holding our major fund-raiser on Saturday, May 4th, a walk-a-thon. It will be a short day. Need use of plug at snack shack to blow up bouncy house and for the music. [Charles] I will go and oversee the opening. [Jane] I move that we allow the Children's cnenter to use the Mesap Park facility for the fund-raiser walkathon on Sat. May 4, 2013. Patricia 2nd. All for, none against.

[Mechelle] We're proposing another family event. [Javi] Request use of DT park for a Spring Family Fair, a fund raiser for the Bolinas Community Land Trust. [Chloe] May 25 12-4: activities, a raffle, music between events. Would need a small microphone for announcements. We have volunteers for setup and clean-up; if necessary we can rent extra trash pick-up. BCLT can supply extra insurance if necessary. [Angela] We've had complaints about any amplification and prefer not to have it. [Charles] Neighbors need to be told about it, particularly the dental office. [Patricia] We have to check our insurance. I'll look into it. People who sell food have to have a license. [Jane] The county has now allowed home-prepared food as long as the cook has a certificate from the county, which includes some education on requirements. [Charles] What about parking? [Chloe] We don't anticipate a lot of out of town attendees. [Charles] You need to advise people to park up at Mesa Park and walk down the bike path if possible. [Dylan] It may put a strain on the rest rooms. [Bryan] We have limited budget for cleaning, so if you can have someone from your group check the toilets it should be done periodically through the day; [Charles] Contact Arn for use of cleaning supplies, and perhaps a small donation to the park for supplies. We need to cover event costs. [Bryan] Maybe \$20 or so for toilet paper & cleaning supplies. [Mechelle] What we've done at times is to donate the cost of the cleaning to the person who usually cleans up. [Charles] We can probably use the dumpsters up at MP. Other than the amplified PA, it sounds fine. Stuart has a megaphone. [Bryan] I'm very supportive and this is the sort of activity that we've been wanting the park to be used for. Do let us know how it goes, to educate us for future events.

Downtown Park: present budget; report on maintenance; request for process for projects

[Angela] I want to know who to bill for maintenance. We're going to be doing a major job on the lawn. [Dylan] How much additional time will you be putting in? [Angela] It's about a day, but it will need to be done periodically. [Roger] Angela is being paid from the project account. [Charles] I don't think we need to rush the process, until it becomes clear the best way to handle the on-going maintenance. Basically, Arn's salary is almost half of our budget. I think he needs to make more than one visit per day to be sure that the rooms are clean. [Dylan] He's on for 2 hours per day, and perhaps he should break that up into several visits. [Patricia] We should set a standard and make a list of things for him to check each day. We need goals, standards, and feedback. [Dylan & Roger will talk with Arn and make the goals clear. Laminate it and provide a checklist for each item.] [Dylan] I think it's also the board's responsibility to check them out when we're down there. [Angela] I've noticed that there is excess garbage on the weekends. By Monday that garbage should be gone. [Roger] Again, we need to have the ordinances. [Patricia] Jack Siedman said he would call the county and talk with them. [Roger] I'll call Jack and discuss this with him. [Patricia]

Every other public park in Marin has the same ordinances. [Angela] I discovered someone sleeping in the shed the back. There's a ladder that was removed from the corporation yard and used for someone to climb over the fence.

[Dylan] It's about \$28,000 for the future maintenance for the DT Park. We have over a year's worth of data to show this. After the projects are done, there will be about 2 years of funding available. [Roger] We're closing in on the stuff we have permits for, to get the final sign-off. [Bryan] Can you talk with Chuck O. about getting an estimate for removing the final tree work?

Maintenance Report: [Charles] The water crock should never be outside except for games, but it's heavy and sometimes gets left outside, which is how it got stolen. I suggest putting it in the pump house, placed at the door so people go and get water and then at the end the door is locked again. That way it won't have to be moved around.

Pool Development: none

Irrigation Report: progress up-date. [Bryan] Went to BPUD and cleared a major hurdle. The documentation is going in to the state. We hope the approval of the amendment will go quickly. We may have found more matching funds, and we're going to put as much money in as possible. We finalize that Wed. The coastal permit: we got word back from the county; not only do we not have a permit for this, but they also want us to go back and get one for the well at RR. We have the money for the permits, but the fact that we have to go through getting all these permits moves the project completion to spring '14. Once state gets the paperwork we should have access to funding within the next few months. All the data are on record for the Coastal Commission, so that may expedite things.

Treasurer's Report: [Dylan] Transfer funds for DT park needs to be made. For MP, this was an expensive month because we had to put in fresh dirt. Suki will have more now during the rain season, but once it dries up those charges will lessen. We have about one year of funding left. [Charles] There's a new grant funding source that would be appropriate for the park, ear-marked for children. [Dylan & Patricia are going to look into it.]

Approve Warrants: Patricia move to approve, Bryan 2nd. All aye.

Other: [Vic] Asked about the audit. [Patricia] Christine needs to go to the county with a board member and find out what the requirements are for the audits, now that the DT park funding is involved as well as MP. We need counsel. [Bryan offered to meet at the county with Christine.]

Up-date on election status: [Jane] We need to vote at the next meeting to get on the November ballot. Deadline for that is August. We also need to rally the folks who use the park to do outreach and publicity.

Approve Minutes: Dylan moves to approve, Bryan 2nd. All

Next meeting: May 13, 7 pm Firehouse room.

ELECTION NEWS! DEADLINES FOR CANDIDACY AND FOR BALLOT MEASURES! PLEASE READ!

The terms of 3 BCPUD Directors expire this year.** If you would like to run for one of these seats in the November 5, 2013 election, you must declare your candidacy during the filing period, which opens July 15, 2013 and closes August 9, 2013 at 5:00 p.m. The appropriate forms are available from the Registrar of Voters office at the Civic Center (Room 121) and must be filed there. If any of the 3 BCPUD Directors whose terms are expiring at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period for non-incumbents only will be extended through August 14, 2013.

** News Flash: one of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year has publicly declared his intention to run for reelection and another of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year has publicly declared her intention *not* to run for reelection.

The last day to submit measures for placement on the November ballot is August 9, 2013; the last day to withdraw a measure from the ballot is August 14, 2013. The last day to submit ballot arguments is August 19, 2013 and the last day to submit rebuttal arguments is August 26, 2013. In each case, the pertinent documents regarding measures on the ballot must be received by the County's Election Office by 4:30 p.m. on the deadline date.
