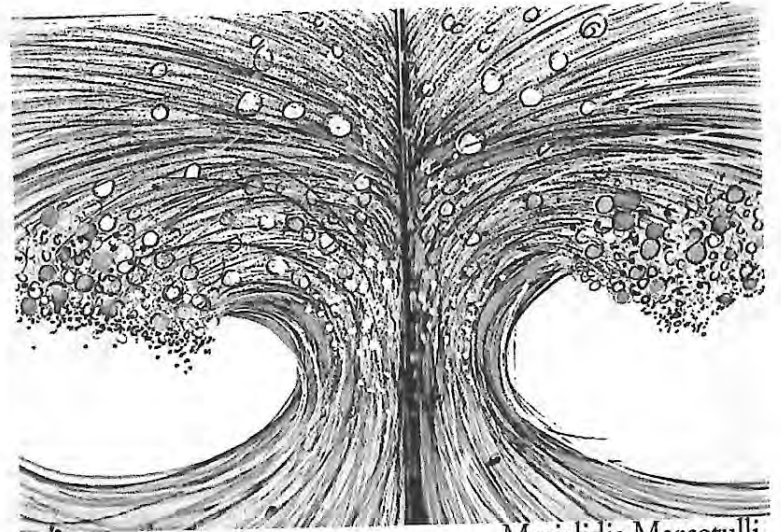

Good Reasons to Save Terrace Avenue at Surfers Overlook before it falls into the ocean.

- 1** Bolinas would lose a beautiful and culturally important road. Who doesn't enjoy looking out at the ever-changing ocean from Surfers Overlook? For many of us, using Terrace and seeing the ocean is a simple but important part of our day. Are we willing to lose that tradition?
- 2** Emergency access to all of Bolinas could be deeply compromised. In the last 5 years, Mesa Road east of the firehouse has been closed 5 times for up to 13 hours due to downed eucalyptus trees and power lines. If Terrace Ave. is closed, as it was with the slide at Overlook, no one, including the fire department, will be able to leave the Mesa. That means the school, Horseshoe Hill and the downtown will wait while emergency help responds from Pt. Reyes or Stinson Beach. We need BOTH routes for our First Responders.
- 3** Mesa and Overlook Roads would get ALL the traffic to and from Town. Who wants more traffic? These two roads already get a lot of traffic and they would get a lot more if drivers couldn't take Terrace.
- 4** We'll eventually have to replace the existing sewer main with an expensive fix. The community's sewer main is located under the road at surfers Overlook; if Terrace fails, the sewer must be re-routed and a pump station installed.
- 5** Bolinas, a famously "can do" Community, will suffer the indignity of not being able to take care of itself. We saved the Lagoon from commercial development, we prevented rampant development on the Mesa, we rebuilt the School, installed the Groin to save the Beach, built a new Firehouse and Clinic...

We've done all these things to preserve and protect our Community. So now we must Save Terrace Avenue. We've answered the call before, and we can do it again. Bolinas takes care of itself.
