For fiction, I'm reading *The White Book* (Han Kang)

I'm also reading a collection of new young queer fiction. I want to know how kids are dealing with it today and to pay attention to what's going on. I'm currently reading *We the Animals* (Justin Torres) a fabulous coming of age book. Also, a collection called *Lot: Stories* (Bryan Washington) which I found out about after reading a story that was published in the New Yorker. That's how I got interested in it.

Do you like to read paper or ebooks? Audio books?

Paper, I exclusively read paper. Why? It's a book! I love and adore books, always have and always will. Once on a plane, the steward came up and said, omg, you read books, most people have devices.

Are you a browser in the library or do you know in advance what you are looking for? If so, how do you find out about them?

I mostly know what I am looking for and I read reviews in the New York Times, New Yorker and the New York Review of Books. When I am in the library I like to browse the new non-fiction and the 7 day books.

Ramblings of a West Marin naturalist

Spring is here and all the naturalists are going out in to the field. Here in Bolinas, we are lucky enough to have our very own Audubon Canyon Ranch's (ACR) Martin Griffin Preserve around the bend with bountiful wonders for a West Marin naturalist. Buckeyes are dressing themselves with leaves again, the California newts are crawling out of the ponds, and the moss are going in to hiding.

Since February, the folks at ACR have been training a new cohort of wide-eyed naturalists who will invite the public to join every Saturday from May through July and some weekends in October. The training is 8 weeks and accessible to naturalists at all stages of learning and curiosity, and emphasizes experiential learning and interpretative programming. Naturalists learn about the birds, the trees, the flowers, the insects, all the critters and creatures that call the delicate ecosystem of the Preserve home. The Preserve sits on occupied Baul-n land, perched just above the Bolinas estuary, also sometimes called the Bolinas Lagoon.

On this slow fog Friday morning, we held our first "Dawn Chorus" of the season, where we invited folks to join us in the early, early morning, before the first drop of light, to awaken on the land of the Preserve and experience the ecological soundscapes of the morning sunrise. This weekend the Preserve is open to the public in celebration of Mother's Day, on Sunday from 10am-4pm. Please come out and bring your mama, moms, or whoever.
