



Timothee Chalamet of LadyBird and Call Me By Your Name has done another star worthy performance as 18 year old Nic Sheff, a young man with incredible talent as an artist, a writer and offers of admittance to several colleges. The strong bond he has with his father David (Steve Carell) is tested as Nic faces a battle with drugs, threatening everything and everyone he holds most dear.

This is not what I would call a feel good film, but it is raw and about a real family with real struggles, relatable.
