From a 2015 NPR interview with an Iraq War vet

It's not like there's a victory parade.
It's not like there's some kind of completion to the thing.
You just go over there and you come back,
and it's still going on over there--
And it's like it never happened.
Nobody here cares that much--it's still going on,
but nobody's paying much attention....

So you try to put it behind you. But it's hard--
I mean, like--we were there, and....

We saw some things....
We did some things....

And there isn't a day goes by
I don't think about the war.
There isn't a day goes by I don't try
to not think about the war.

Best advice I got was from my platoon sergeant:
We had been out already that day,
and we were about to go out again,
and it was night and it was scary.

And he and I just sat and talked--
about being scared and all...
And he told me his father had fought in Viet Nam,
and his father's advice was--
when you're about to go into an action--
You just take all your thoughts, all your worries, your doubts,
And you put'm in a shoe box....
and you tell yourself,

"I'll deal with that later..."

And I feel like...that's what I'm doing about the war.
I mean...I know there's some stuff inside
that's gonna hafta be dealt with sometime.
But for now I just try to put it all in a shoe box,
and I tell myself,
"I'll deal with that later..."

But it's hard. I mean...
I stay in touch with some of the guys
in my platoon, and other vets--and...
This buddy e-mailed me the other day,
and he said....

"Tell me....
Is it normal to want to blow your brains out?"


Thirty or so years ago when Sara Pusey was Superintendent/Principal and I worked as a Maintenance Person/Bus Driver at the Bolinas/Stinson School, Don Jolley was exploring biological variations in nature and stars in the skies while re-assembling whale skeletons and teaching species differentiation and evolution to his 8th grade Biology Class. One sunny day with my permission he borrowed all the tools from my maintenance shop and spread them out randomly on the outdoor basketball court:

Hammers, pliers, ratchet wrenches, axes, spades, shovels, screwdrivers, wheelbarrows, razor knives, vise grips, nail pullers, wonder bars, weed whackers, rasp files, measuring tapes, sledge hammers, rulers, scissors, pruning shears, pipe wrenches, paintbrushes, machetes, chalk string, riveters, ball-peen hammers, squares, levels, hedge shears, staple guns, electrical tape, wire cutters, nippers, wood saws, coping saws, sanders, hacksaws, chisels, drill bits, etc. He must have scattered more than two-hundred individual tools randomly across the court.

He told the kids to arrange the tools in some meaningful kind of order that made visually obvious the relationship between and among them.... which came first, for instance, two crossed chopsticks, followed by a pair of pliers, followed by channel-lock pliers, followed by vise grips, followed by whatever came next ... illustrating an evolutionary sequence of relationships between and among the tools: Domain, Kingdom, Phylum, Class, Order, Family, Genus, Species. He told the kids there was no right answer to the puzzle presented by the tools, but the best arrangement could probably be explained.

I never looked at those tools the same way again.

A Review (not a critique)

Last weekend, the Presbyterian Church began its 3rd Sunday Series of concerts in support of restoring the literal foundation of this historic building. The church has opened its doors for the community as a venue for concerts beyond their religious mission. Finally, there is a grand piano in town in a hall with great acoustics to create all sorts of possibilities for the town.

Sunday's concert featured the ebullient pianist Bill Quist, who was 'bought' at the Community Center's silent auction, creating essentially a double benefit by the generosity of Nancy Zacher. Mademoiselle Ann of La Ville de Chien had also successfully bid for a Bill concert which will happen later in the summer. Sunday's event brought in a symbolic amount of cash; one patron on social security dropped a check for \$500, was overheard by excited producers. Meanwhile, it was a cheery hometown crowd that did include 'all' with Bill's \$1 - 10,000 suggested donation. Almost needless to say, it would be lovely if some of our heavy hitters (once again) join in another worthy community project.

As for the concert itself, it was certainly a surprising choice for a pianist to choose repertoire that was composed before the piano was even invented! Bill began with a great variety of contrasting J. S. Bach pieces along with some light-hearted commentary. The church's new grand piano served well in the any sounds of music produced.

The concert continued with Bill moving from the piano to the organ for 2 pieces, as well as utilizing the second lighter piano when he sang (and scat-singing a la Swingle Singers) his novel duets for one. The gorgeous double violin concerti of J. S. Bach and Antonio Vivaldi worked surprisingly well as a vocalize. I was a great reminder of the beauty of the Baroque Era.

The highlight of the concert clearly was when the wildly talented Molly Maguire joined Bill in a Renaissance love duet of Claudio Monteverde as well as a Handel duet of great harmonic mysteries. Before her solos, Bill reminded us all of the breadth of music Ms. Maguire makes - as conductor, composer, arranger, creator of shows, a kind director, understanding teacher and singer in practically all music forms. For this concert, Molly was a stunning lyric soprano for a new version of Danny Boy (Jake Heggie) and an ethereal version of Joni Mitchell's original Woodstock. What a joy to be a part of these two artist's collaboration.
