Bolinas Museum is pleased to join the San
Francisco Bay Area in celebrating the 50th
Anniversary of the Summer of Love with the
opening of this museum-wide program of
exhibitions and summer events that explore
the creativity of the 1960s and 70s. We have
asked Maria Muldaur to share her red-hot
music. Muldaur has collaborated with most of
the iconic musicians of rock, blues, country
and folk since the 1960s, and has a long
relationship with coastal Marin.

**Art We Wear: Culture & Expression 1960s
to Now.** In the 1960s, eschewing
consumerism and conformity, youths turned
2nd hand clothes into unselfconscious
personal expression as exemplified in the
book *Native Funk & Flash*. Out of this cultural
milieu, grew an astonishing national art-to-
wear movement. In this exhibition we present
exuberant "hippie" embellished clothing,
imaginative jewelry and garments by artists,
among them are luminaries of the national art-
to-wear movement and many from coastal
Marin.

**Witness to Revolution: Selections from the
Jon Goodchild Collection** Curated by Leslie
Acoca Goodchild and Elia Haworth. These
vintage photographs capture emerging stars—
who became international icons of music and
literature, taken by young photographers such
as Annie Leibovitz and Michael Zagaris. Jon
Goodchild was the seminal Art Director for
London's *Oz Magazine*, British *Rolling Stone*,
San Francisco *Rolling Stone*, and *Straight
Arrow Books*. He moved to Bolinas in the
1970s, where he married Leslie Acoca. He
created many of the designs that helped
define Bolinas' changing identity. Goodchild
died in 1999, but remains a legendary figure.

Sue Taylor: Hand-Knotted Rugs Taylor has
been making playful, labor-intensive rugs
since the 1970s. Trained as an artist in
university, she turned from painting to
textiles. Taylor hand-weaves rug backing on
a loom, she draws colored yarn through just
two linear threads at a time and knots it. One
knot at a time. Taylor has been a resident of
coastal Marin since 1968 and was featured in
the 1974 book *Native Funk and Flash*.

The reception and concert are free to all,
thanks to the generosity of community-
minded supporters of the Bolinas Museum!

The BCLT is in the process of updating our waiting list. We don't currently have any housing available but would like to add you to our list if you are someone looking for housing now or who may be looking for housing in the future. We will be maintaining a list both of people who are looking to rent and people who may be eligible to purchase a home at below market rate. If you are at all interested in getting housing from us in the future it is important that you get on our list. While fair housing laws will make it hard for us to prioritize based on solely on this list we may be able to use it to help determine occupancy in case of multiple qualified applications.

The BCLT does not act as match making service between tenants and landlords at this time however we would like to make our list waiting available (with tenant approval) to homeowners who are looking for long term tenants. If you have a home for rent please stop by and see who may be looking for a place to live.

Urgent Meeting re coming Electromagnetic Radiofrequency Pollution Increases!

My prayer last Sunday at the beautiful Baby Blessing was to protect our little ones from as much as possible from environmental toxins.

One of the most ubiquitous and increasing toxic exposures is from man-made radiofrequency radiation (RFR) in 2G, 3G, 4G devices – wi-fi, baby monitors, cell phones, radar in cars, etc. Coming soon is 5G - Millimeter wave frequencies (MMW.) MMW frequencies are used in crowd control weapons because they can cause extreme pain.

Throughout planetary evolution these frequencies have been infinitesimal and now are multiple trillions of times increased in our environment. Most creatures are not adapting rapidly enough to the onslaught. Trees, plants, bees, birds, animals as well as humans are affected.

Adverse health effects from microwave radiation have been noted in thousands of peer reviewed studies, including by the U.S. National Toxicology Program, <http://www.saferemr.com/2016/05/national-toxicology-program-finds-cell.html>. The World Health Organization's International Agency for Research on Cancer lists these frequencies as a probable carcinogen. <http://microwavenews.com/news-center/iarc-cell-phone-radiation-possible-human-carcinogen>

We stand now to have an exponential increase from the renewed installation of 'smart' meters and the forced wireless phone service by AT&T who wants to remove their copper wires.

Telecommunications industry written bills are moving through both federal and state legislatures to give them carte blanche over RFR emissions.

SB 649 in California has just passed the Senate and is now in the Assembly. This bill would remove all local authority over any placement or control of cell antennas. (see the article by Nina Beety.)

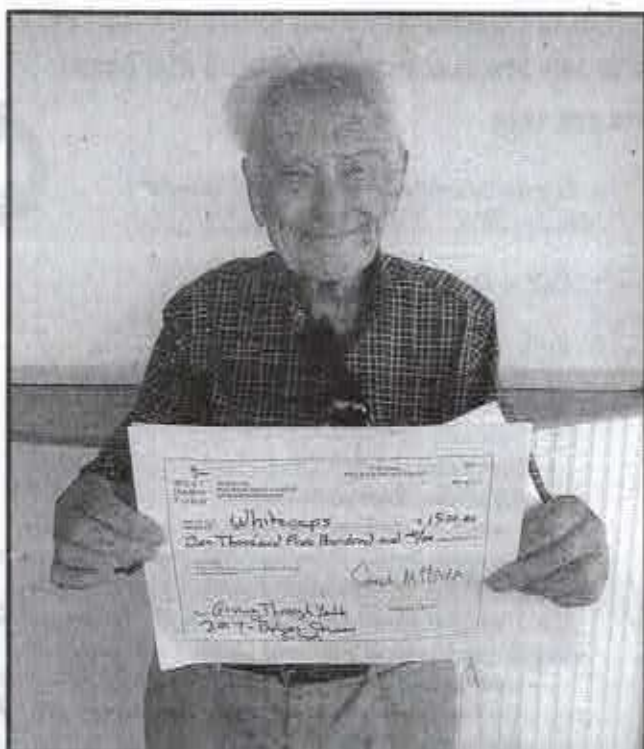
Please join us for a discussion about what we can do to reduce the threat from these exposures. Children, embryos, the ill and the elderly are most vulnerable, though middle aged women also suffer disproportionately.

Ill effects symptoms include sleep disorders, nausea, headaches, joint pain, tinnitus, irritability, etc.
