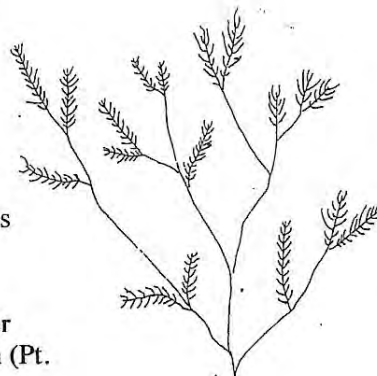

CALLING all REPORTERS to HEARSAY NEWS TV!



Remember when Radio Free Bolinas used to broadcast Bolinas Public Utility District Meetings "live" from the studio upstairs at 240 Elm Road so that we could listen at home to local government at work on our behalf? Remember how exciting it was to drive to Elm and Maple and sit in the car in the parking lot listening to the broadcast, so that when something of deep personal interest came up, we could hear the car door slam as Mark Maser (for instance) stormed into the meeting, or Gregg Hewlett stormed out.

I've been thinking, maybe now's the time for "HEARSAY NEWS TV."

It's pretty straightforward. Anyone – for instance, a reporter with a cell phone -- can easily and simply broadcast a meeting or other event "live" and in "real time", which can then be viewed elsewhere in real time on a cell phone or computer or tv set. You just need to know the address of the broadcast. No recording is made. Nothing has to be downloaded or uploaded. It all happens "live". I have been playing with an app named PERISCOPE which broadcasts through the @hearsay_news TWITTER account, and it's pretty easy to do.

Consider the common good and the positive public work currently being done by numerous governmental and social agencies and individuals in town – the BCPUD, The Bolinas Stinson Union School District, The Fire Protection District, The Whitecaps, The Community Center, art galleries, book clubs, classes, birdwatchers, plein air painters, surfers, music recitals, and public gatherings of all sorts, including town hall meetings -- which might could find a wider and appreciative audience of shut-ins, isolates and other homebound residents, new and old, via HEARSAY NEWS TV.

I have some organizational thoughts on how to make this technology work to the benefit and betterment of our community. If you are interested in any aspect of this possibility, shoot me an email – bolinashearsaynews@gmail.com. Try to talk me out of it. This is only the beginning.

ELECTION NEWS! DEADLINES FOR BCPUD BOARD CANDIDACY! PLEASE READ!

The terms of two (2) BCPUD Directors expire this year. If you would like to run for one of these seats in the November 3, 2015 election, you must declare your candidacy during the filing period, which opens **July 13, 2015** and closes **August 7, 2015 at 5:00 p.m.** The appropriate forms are available from the Registrar of Voters office at the Civic Center (Room 121) and must be filed there. If either of the two BCPUD Directors whose terms expire at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period for **non-incumbents only** will be extended through **August 12, 2015.**

Problem with AT&T internet switch in Bolinas

If you're having a problem with internet download speed in Bolinas in the evening, but not in the morning or after midnight, it's not your computer. After having any number of AT&T service reps try to tell me over the phone that there's something wrong with my computer or my modem, I finally got a service tech who told me the real deal.

I was told that AT&T has got an obsolete switch near the firehouse that can't handle the amount of internet traffic for Bolinas in the evenings. (A lot of people try to stream in the evenings.) This isn't a new problem, it's been going on for more than a year now. AT&T management knows about it but they haven't felt like spending the money to replace the switch. As I understand it, they've got fiber optic that comes to the switch, which can handle the traffic, but the switch can't handle it.

Additionally, everyone in Bolinas who gets their internet service through their landline, it doesn't matter what company you use, the service goes through AT&T's switch and has the same overload problem. That's what I was told.

What you need to do if this is bothering you, if you're getting your service from AT&T, is call up AT&T's billing office to complain that you're not getting the service you're paying for. First run a download speed test on speedtest.net, or a similar program (not on AT&T's speed checking program, which overstates the results) in the evening or whenever you're getting slow service and tell them the speedtest.net results compared to what you're paying for. For example, I just ran it and I got 1.6 mbs and I'm paying for 6 mbs. Which, by the way, it's like that every evening, sometimes even worse. If you want to build a stronger case, you can get the results from several evenings, and compare it to your morning results. Tell them that they need to replace their switch out here. And ask for a partial refund until they do (which they did give to me, by the way). If enough people complain, maybe they'll eventually replace that switch. If you're not getting your service from AT&T, you should still complain to your provider and ask for a partial refund on the grounds that you're not getting the service that you're paying for.

If anyone gets more news about this, I hope you'll keep us updated. Internet service has become pretty much of a basic public utility for a lot of us.

Water covers 71% of the Earth's surface
 96.5% of Earth's water is in seas and oceans
 1.7% of Earth's water is in groundwater
 1.7% is in glaciers and ice caps
 Only 2.5% of the Earth's water is freshwater and
 98.8% of that water is in ice and groundwater
Less than 0.3% of all freshwater is in rivers, lakes, streams and the atmosphere.

Arroyo Hondo Creek - our main water source - is only 3 1/2 miles long, and provides us an annualized average of about one gallon of water per second.

Of the small amount of freshwater on the planet, we have this one stream delivering water to
 593 household connections (i.e. water meters)

Very precious, this creek.

and a History Exhibit**

Bolinas Museum is opening three new exhibitions and a history exhibit this Saturday, June 20th. Two of the museum's galleries focus on an internationally recognized Marin artist, Larry Sultan (1946-2009). While Sultan settled in Greenbrae here in Marin County and often summered in Bolinas, his best-known photographs capture seemingly mundane scenes of the suburban Southern California world of his childhood. He used an almost documentary style, yet his photographs suggest complex layers of human relationship beneath the surface. Larry Sultan's photographic works are in the collections of prestigious museums across the nation from the Whitney Museum in New York to San Francisco's Modern Art Museum.

Given Larry's love for Bolinas and the series' nautical theme, the Bolinas Museum is pleased to share Sultan's seldom seen 1995 body of work titled *The Sailor Who Fell From Grace* in the Bolinas Museum main gallery. Inspired by photographs found at a Bay Area flea market, Sultan used humor with found or constructed imagery to create a visual narrative of a wayward sailor. Complete with a self-portrait of the artist as the sailor the series explores the gray areas between reality and fiction--a concept that Sultan worked with throughout his creative life.

During Sultan's teaching career at the San Francisco Art Institute and as distinguished Professor of Photography at California College of the Arts, he influenced three decades of students and many went on to become successful artists themselves. The Bolinas Museum photography gallery exhibition *Self Made* presents work by former students and friends of Sultan. Organized by guest curator Jessica Ingram, who is an Associate Professor of Photography at the California College of Art and an accomplished artist herself, it includes Tammy Rae Carland, Liz Cohen, Dru Donovan, Jim Goldberg, Doug Hall, Gregory Halpern, Michael Light, Abner Nolan, Nigel Poor, Larry Sultan & Mike Mandel and Lindsey White. Their handmade or ephemeral objects are creative acts exploring forms that reflect informality or looseness--and the pleasure and fun in the making.

In the Coastal Marin Artists gallery, Bolinas Museum presents *Songs From The Wood*, new work by Inverness artist Rick Yoshimoto, curated by Charles De Lisle. Living in Coastal Marin for thirty-seven years has deeply inspired Yoshimoto as a sculptor and ceramicist. He makes plates of hand-foraged clays, stools carved out of ancient redwood stumps and burls, found stones shaped into tools, and rubbings on paper, all with a deeply felt sense of the natural world around us.

The new exhibit in the history room, *Getting Here From There*, co-curated by Elia Haworth and Dewey Livingston, traces the story of getting to Bolinas by trails, schooners, horseback and wagons, stages, ferries, trains, early automobiles, and how the roads we drive on today were made by hand in the 1800s.

Everyone is invited to the always interesting Preview Talks by artists and curators at 2 PM followed by the opening reception from 3-5 PM. Receptions and Museum admission are always free to all. For more information please visit bolinasmuseum.org

WATER CONSERVATION REMINDER!!! PLEASE DO WHATEVER YOU CAN TO REDUCE WATER CONSUMPTION.

As we all know, California is in a serious drought. With our limited local water supply, Bolinas residents are accustomed to conserving water and you all have done a remarkable job of conserving even more during these especially dry years. However, we are starting to see consumption creep up: *in the past two months, the town consumed more water than it did during the same two months last year.* This is not a good trend, particularly as we enter the summer months.

So, please do whatever you can to reduce your water consumption. For example, please handwater your garden and do not use an automatic irrigation system (which are prone to failure and tend to result in over-watering). Please only run your washing machine and/or dishwasher when completely full. Please limit showers to 5 minutes or less. If you have friends or family visiting this summer, or if you are a homeowner renting out your house on a temporary basis, please remind visitors of the need to conserve.

Please feel free to call our office for conservation advice (415-868-1224), and thank you for doing what you can to reduce your water use.

Michael Lerner invited me to attend last week's talk at the New School. Michael was in conversation with Kate Hoepke from San Francisco Village about seniors and housing.

"Maybe you could write something for the Hearsay," Michael suggested.

"On assignment for the Hearsay News!" I said to myself and I grabbed my note pad and press pass and went out to Commonweal for the talk.

San Francisco Village is a non profit that helps seniors stay in their homes and communities. The Village provides services, connections and information to help seniors navigate the uncharted waters ahead (visit their website at San Francisco Village.)

I enjoyed Kate's stories of the success and proliferation of hundreds of Village models across the country. But I was initially put off by her "business model" approach. The phrase "value proposition" kept popping up as well as other business terms like marketing and fund-raising.

But then as Kate went on to describe the burn-out rate of volunteers, I saw the effectiveness and efficiency of paying people, providing jobs and working within the system.

Kate also spoke about the role of the leader. Here again I was initially put off by the top down approach, the traditional hierarchical model.

But Kate didn't use the word "leader, boss or CEO" Instead she spoke of a "visionary curator" - Someone who collects and organizes the resources and tools. Someone who maintains the network, oversees the marketing and fund-raising.

"Visionary Curator" keeps resonating in my head. I like the sound of that job title. It suggests a scholarly but imaginative approach to the phenomena we call Life, aging, and death.

Go ahead, add "Visionary Curator" to you resume. Join us.

We can all be Visionary Curators.

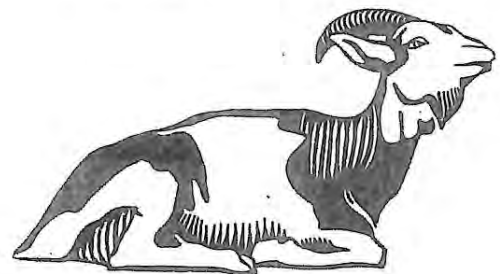

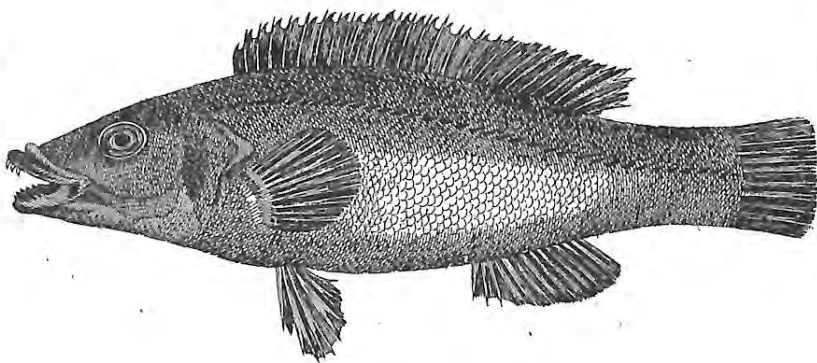

Hannah and I are off on our great adventure a week from today. All of the paintings are wrapped and packed, wall labels made and the giant bible lovingly prepared to head back to the Black Forest and whence it came, when my great-grandfather had to escape for his life in 1941.

For this latest exhibit I will present my biblical illustrations painted on driftwood from the beaches of Northern California in the very sanctuary my family used to worship. It is now a museum.

Sometimes you look for confirmation if you are doing the right thing. For my exhibit last year in Bolinas I had 18 paintings which is significant because in Jewish thought the number 18 is represented by the letter "chai" and means life. A common Jewish toast is "l'chaim!" which means "to life!" It is said at celebrations in anticipation of all good things to come.

For the exhibit opening this month there are 22 paintings. This is the number of letters in the hebrew alphabet and is also rich with meaning.

The story is told that once the Baal Shem Tov, the great Chasidic teacher, was leading a prayer service. Within the congregation there was a simple shepherd boy, who could barely read. He didn't know any of the prayers. But as the Baal Shem Tov led the congregation, the boy was so moved that he wanted to pray. Instead of the words of the prayers, he began to recite the letters of the alef-bet. He said, "Oh God, I don't know the words of the prayers, I only know all these letters. Please, God, take these letters and arrange them into the right order to make the right words." The Baal Shem Tov heard the boy's words and stopped all the prayers. "Because of the simple words of this boy," he said, "all of our prayers will be heard in the highest reaches of Heaven."

May the letters form themselves into words...and may we find within ourselves the means to speak to God.

This is how I feel about my paintings. And it is much like what Leonardo said:

"Painting is poetry that is seen rather than felt, and poetry is painting that is felt rather than seen."

It is my hope that my humble offering is pleasing and that others find meaning in it as I have in its creation.

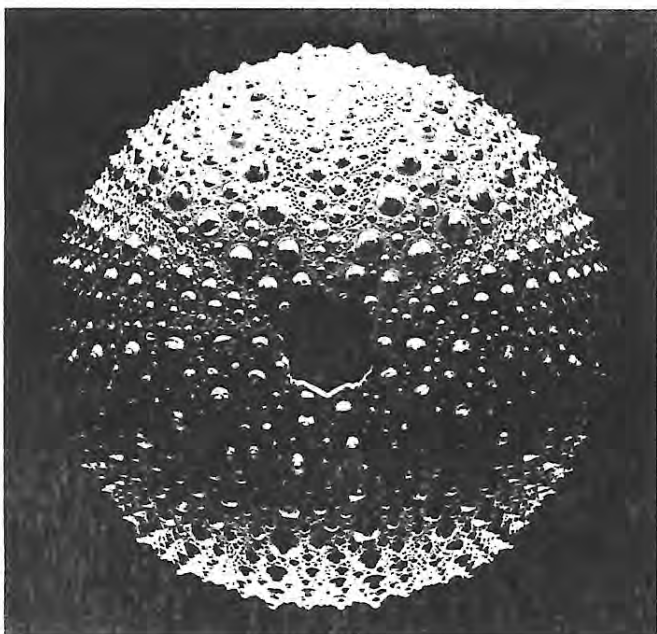
