

I've been needing to confront her, this inevitable, as she's washed upon our shore. I intended to use one last shot of film to photograph, but there was no way to capture her, Death. She's elusive, in the stench, in the murky waves, in million microbial beings.

Somehow she Is and Was and Is Going to Be, all in the same moment, timeless. Death stayed with me, hauntingly, as I sang to the spirit of the whale a song a Tongvan man taught me, simply meaning,

"the waves come in, the waves go out,"

softly honoring her as Death and Decay patiently take their course on the shore.
