Remembering the First People . . .

There is a midden site, remnants of a shell mound left by the Miwok people, on top of the east side of the ravine, cut by the creek we call Arroyo Honda.

The calcium carbonate in the soil there differentiates that area from the more acidic, native soils surrounding it, with bits of shell and bone still visible; hence, an open circle of grass, with one lone Coyote Bush in the center.

While the area on that side of the creek, known as Miwok Meadows, was disturbed by those who occupied this land a few decades ago, the vegetation in the ravine, itself, was left intact, protected by it's own extreme angle.

Near to the midden site, there is a very old CA. Buckeye tree, who was alive when the Miwoks inhabited this place, and who remembers them. The stones, and the very Earth, herself, still hold the memory of their songs, their stories, their ceremonies, their beautiful way of life here.

On Sunday, after offering our gratitude to the Water on the bridge crossing Arroyo Honda creek, we'll circle up on the midden, and Sky Road Webb, a Miwok descendant, will hold the space for us to remember them, too.

And, we'll also be remembering the Dream from which they emerged into this dimension. As did we all.

If we keep our hearts strong, and the earth survives this current era, those of us living here now will be remembered as Ancestors of this place.

May the land, trees, water, stones, and those who follow us find us worthy of being remembered well.

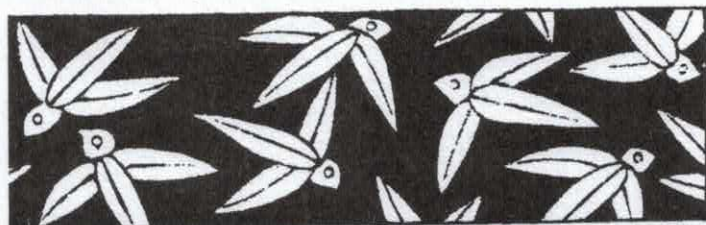

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BCPUD MEETING RE:
COASTAL COMMISSION PROPOSED POLICY C-PK 3

The meeting was well attended overflowing with more than 60 people packing the firehouse room..

The issues were the "commercial core" and the Brighton overnight parking issue. Kristin Drumm gave handouts describing what the Coast Commission policy was and then gave a power point presentation of what that planned. I found I was confused because what the handout said and what she said in the presentation were so different. I am going to call her to clarify and will report later on that.

At the end Supervisor Rodoni said that he urgently wants the plan to be completed and amendments can be made later. This concerns me as the leverage is lost and the CC is more likely to resist changes they don't want.

It became very clear that their interests are visitors and it is up to us to hold ground and take care of our needs. It is the Supervisors that can do that and we need to support them. Also our excellent BCPUD Board with Jennifer Blackman are part of the discussion and taking our interests to heart.

The downtown parking issue was next up and there was much discussion from both sides of the issue. Ananda Brady strongly expressed the concerns of the people in their vans and the locals who live on the street holding for a compassionate outcome. The parking committee has been focused on this although according to Rodoni what they are asking for the County cannot do because of the laws. They also asked for resident passes.

Rodoni's solution was to make 72 hour parking on one side for a year trial. After 2 and a half hours on these issues the meeting ended with the BCPUD stating that there would be a town vote on the issue a good solution.

There are a couple of very important resolutions coming up that people need to be alert and actively involved with if we don't want to be severely limited. Stay tuned!

I really want to thank our wonderful BCPUD Board for their guidance and the compassionate intelligence they bring to the forum! How fortunate we are to have them represent us.

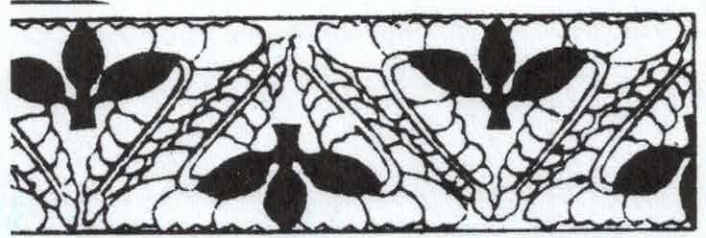

Bolinas Community Land Trust & MUSSEL

A recently posted letter from a group calling themselves MUSSEL expressed concern about Bolinas Community Land Trust plans. Bolinas Community Land Trust (BCLT) was founded by locals to address our concern that skyrocketing housing prices, vacation homes and short-term rentals threaten affordable housing- especially for young families, people like teachers and our aging population of long-time residents. Having been both a renter and a landlady I understand this worry. The current BCLT staff, board and membership have dynamic vision and skills to accomplish long-term goals. Their task is daunting, rife with headaches and challenges, but they have tenacity, heart and integrity.

Remember, Big Mesa was sparsely populated until the 1970s building boom -- accelerated by the flood of young newcomers. Seeing the potential demise of small town lifestyle, they also led the way to the water moratorium, which our community diligently protects. Thank God / Goddess that BCLT managed to purchase the two available water meters, a house and several lots. All could have gone to McMansions.

MUSSEL is concerned about growth in the area bounded by Overlook and Aspen, Poplar and Alder, and the 430 Aspen house. Since that was my house and neighborhood for 16 of the 45 years that I have lived in Bolinas (until 2016), I would like to comment.

Take a look on Google Earth to understand the situation. The map MUSSEL presented shows the legal road Larch between Poplar and Alder, that is currently used as a private dead end driveway to the Abbott house. Larch edges empty lots that divide the housing on Overlook and Aspen.

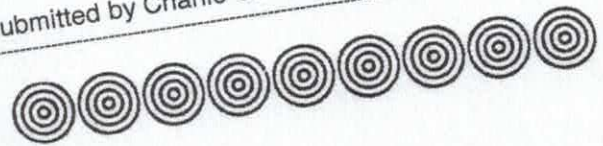
On Aspen Road, between Poplar and Alder there are 8 houses, a few odd buildings, large yards and empty lots. Currently 2 houses are empty, 2 are rentals, 1 is occupied part time- - there are about 13 occupants? On Overlook near Poplar, there are 2 houses and what, 3 residents? Also 1 house across the street. The BCLT proposed housing options (which will take years to come to fruition) are two lots across from Poplar, a house that will be bequeathed to BCLT someday, 430 Aspen and someday on an empty lot near Alder. It is not a crowded area! MUSSEL lists 57 residents in the area, so look at Overlook between Larch and Alder --that is where the density of homes, residents, probably unpermitted 2nd units are, and some MUSSELL members.

Too many vehicles? While I lived on Aspen, of the 8 houses--2 households had 5 vehicles each! There were 20 cars in half a block! The number of residents and cars has since diminished, so a few new additional cars are hardly a traffic burden.

MUSSELL is worried about 430 Aspen, now owned by BCLT, potentially housing 6 people. That is two more than when I owned the house! In 2016, tired of endless maintenance and worry about the severe fire hazard of the lots next to me, I found the perfect buyer, an accomplished artist and full-time resident. But months into ownership she, who had terrible migraines, experienced serious memory loss. Yet her architect carried on with hundreds of thousands of

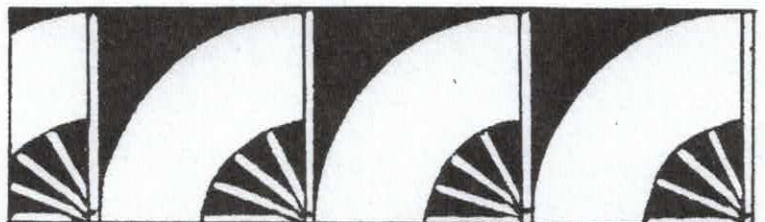

dollars work on the property. Then, with a new oversize structure and a half remodeled house, the county red-tagged the property. Selling seemed impossible. Having BCLT buy the property was a blessing for her and for our community. I am so happy that 430 Aspen will become a warm and happy home again; for a small family, a person in the apartment and one more in the studio building- parking on Overlook. The next door neighbor is fine with with these plans.

It is important that we are all able to express concerns and ask questions, and without the divisiveness that is so common in our nation right now, have open conversation. I wonder if MUSSELL members attended the last informative Land Trust meeting to get answers? I have found BCLT people to be transparent, thoughtful, remarkably capable and deeply dedicated to preserving our town's diverse population and providing carefully crafted viable options. I am grateful for their skill and vision.

**2018 ELECTION NEWS! DEADLINES FOR
CANDIDACY AND FOR BALLOT
MEASURES! PLEASE READ!**

The terms of three (3) BCPUD Directors expire this year. If you would like to run for one of these seats in the November 6, 2018 election, you must declare your candidacy during the filing period, which opens **July 16, 2018** and closes **August 10, 2018**. The appropriate forms are available from the Registrar of Voters office at the Civic Center (Room 121) and must be filed there. If any of the three BCPUD Directors whose terms are expiring at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period for **non-incumbents only** will be extended several days (the specific date is not yet available).

The last day to submit measures for placement on the November ballot is **August 10, 2018**; the last day to withdraw a measure from the ballot is **August 15, 2018**. The last day to submit ballot arguments is **August 20, 2018** and the last day to submit rebuttal arguments is **August 27, 2018**. In each case, the pertinent documents must be received by the County's Election Office by **4:30 p.m.** on the deadline date.

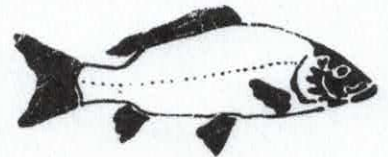
I am optimistic that this meeting will offer an opportunity to assuage some of the concerns about local development raised in this paper and online.
