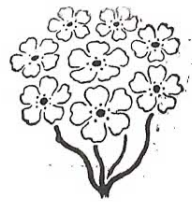


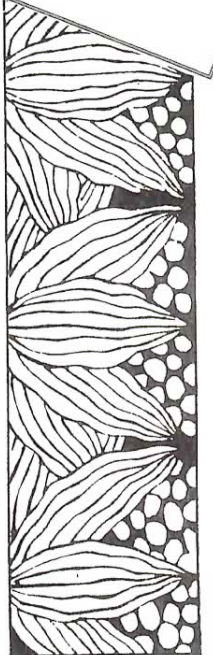

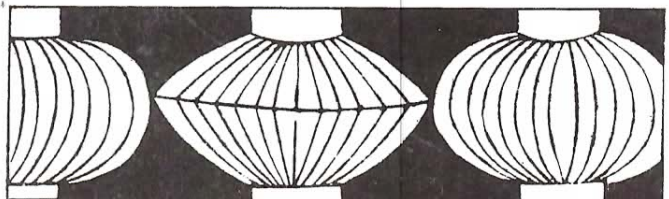

Bolinas Museum Opening Reception
New Exhibitions
Saturday June 29 3-5 PM
2 PM Preview Talk

Join us for this opening reception for three remarkable new exhibitions and a Preview talk by the artists and curators about each exhibition.

In the main gallery: **Keith Hansen: Birds of the Sierra Nevada.** Keith Hansen explains, "For any single state, California boasts the largest number of bird species recorded. The majority can be found in the mountain of the Sierra Nevada Range." This long anticipated exhibition presents a selection from the 70 illustration plates of Hansen's fifteen year project to create meticulously detailed portraits of 1,400 individual birds representing 320 species.

Hansen is a passionate ornithologist who leads national and international birding expeditions. His self-enforced standard of precision comes from his own acute eye for detail and being friends with some of the best birders in the world. Hansen's studio and gallery has been in the Bolinas Museum building for twenty-two years, facing the courtyard and fountain. It is a destination spot for human and bird visitors of all kinds. His list of birds seen or heard strictly from his gallery or its doorstep is the record for the most birds seen from a single room in all of North America!

In the photography gallery: **Consuelo Kanaga: Photographs and Paintings from the Collection of Susie Tompkins Buell.** Curated by Stinson Beach photographer Ginny Felch, this is a selection of powerful works by Consuelo Kanaga. She is best known for her honest and soulful images depicting individuals struggling for civil rights, beginning in the 1930s. Kanaga celebrated the human in every photo she took. Collector Susie Buell is well known for her passion for empowering women and she is a great supporter of this community.

In the Coastal Marin Artists gallery: **Andy Rappaport: Constructed Surfaces.** Curated by Terry Donohue. Mounted on aluminum, Andy Rappaport's vivid photographic images make art from the detritus of city walls from around the world. Messy and incoherent, these found compositions made from decrepit posters, signs or objects defaced with graffiti, paint, scribbling and the passing of time often hide beautiful visual stories...right in plain sight.

Also, the Bolinas Museum invites everyone to a free old fashioned Ice Cream Social in honor of the Bolinas Museum's 30th Anniversary July 5th, 2PM.

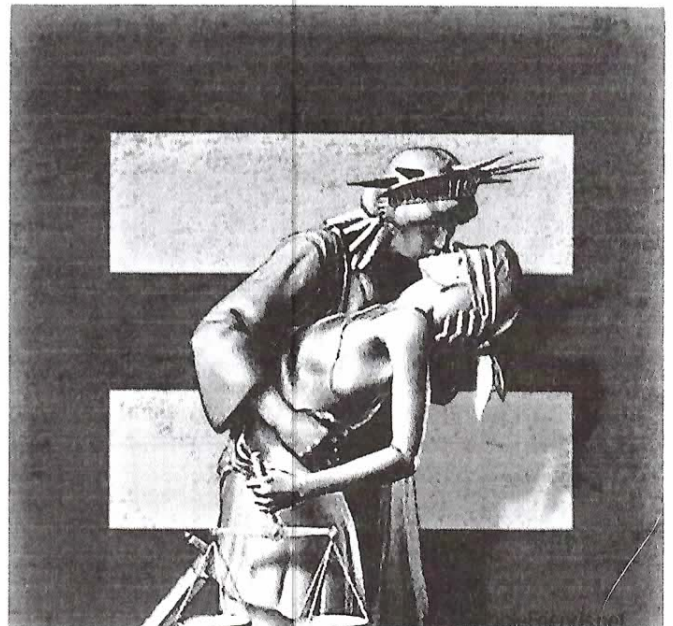
READING TO JOHN

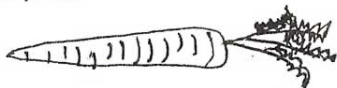

WHY DOES THE WATER TASTE AND SMELL FUNNY RIGHT NOW?

As we move into the heart of the summer months after a winter and spring with very little rainfall, we are turning to our emergency back-up sources of water – our Woodrat reservoirs – to supplement our water supply. (Please see our separate notice appealing to our customers for water conservation!) As the reservoir water enters our distribution system, many of our customers are noticing a taste and smell to the water. The taste and odor are a result of the different organic materials present in the stored water (as compared to our preferred water source, the Arroyo Hondo creek) and do NOT pose a health risk. You may also notice a slight discoloration; again, this does not pose a health risk. We likely will be using reservoir water to supplement our water supply until the rains begin again.

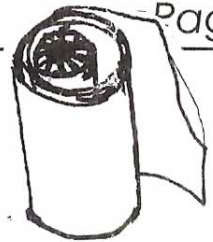

UPDATED ELECTION NEWS!

DEADLINES FOR CANDIDACY AND FOR BALLOT MEASURES! PLEASE READ!

The terms of 3 BCPUD Directors expire this year.** If you would like to run for one of these seats in the November 5, 2013 election, you must declare your candidacy during the filing period, which opens **July 15, 2013** and closes **August 9, 2013 at 5:00 p.m.** The appropriate forms are available from the Registrar of Voters office at the Civic Center (Room 121) and must be filed there. If any of the 3 BCPUD Directors whose terms are expiring at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period for **non-incumbents only** will be extended through **August 14, 2013.**

** **UPDATE ON BCPUD INCUMBENT DIRECTORS:** one of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year has publicly declared his intention to run for reelection and two of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year have publicly declared their intentions *not* to run for reelection.

The last day to submit measures for placement on the November ballot is **August 9, 2013**; the last day to withdraw a measure from the ballot is **August 14, 2013.** The last day to submit ballot arguments is **August 19, 2013** and the last day to submit rebuttal arguments is **August 26, 2013.** In each case, the pertinent documents regarding measures on the ballot must be received by the County's Election Office by **4:30 p.m.** on the deadline date.

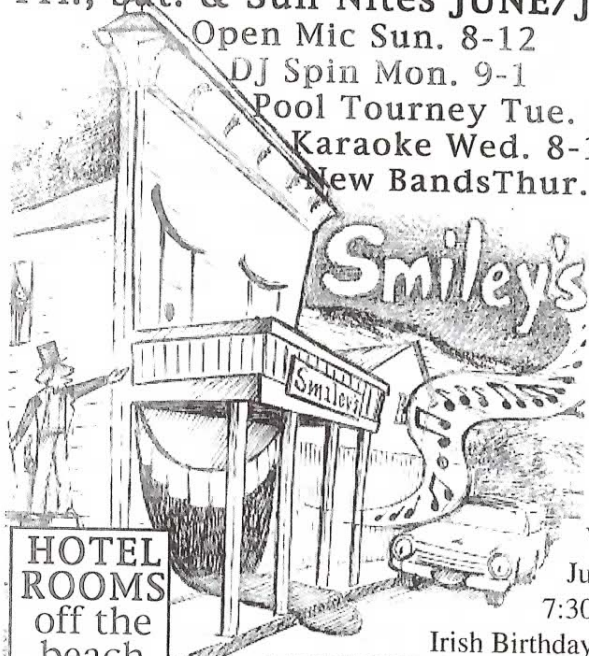

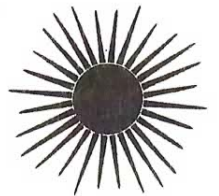

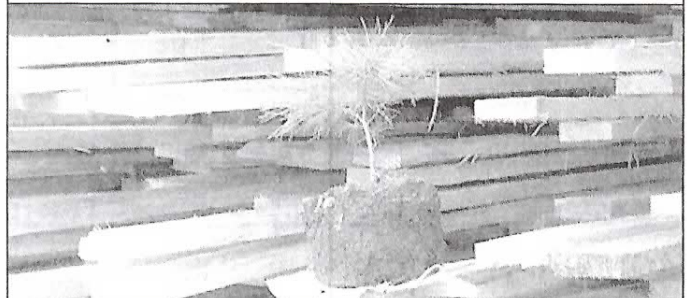

Come Jump In The Mud This Weekend!

Hello everyone! I'm so grateful to be back in Bolinas, my home away from home...

I'm here leading the construction of the **community wood-fired Barrel Oven** in the downtown Bolinas Park, along with sculpted earthen benches and support walls for a countertop.

A dedicated group of Bolinasians; Alethea Patton, John Glavis, Curly Rigg Juttah Hahne, and others have been stomping **Cob** (an earthen building technique utilizing clay sub-soil, sand, & straw to literally sculpt monolithic structures) and applying it to the outside of the amazingly crafted steel drum insert made by Wayne Campbell. The work is half way completed and we invite you to come on down this weekend to partake in this fun and creative project. *We are putting the heart of the fire into our downtown!*

Although this was initially promoted as a workshop, no one will be turned away for lack of funds, so please feel free to join us for as little or as long as you like.

Mud will be flying in the park this **Friday 11-4pm and Saturday/Sunday 9:30am-4:30pm** with a lunch break at 12:30pm.

The final step will be to earthen plaster the oven which will happen on Sunday.

Our original goal was to have the oven finished and fired up for the 4th of July, but the chimney would need to be installed and the roof sheathing completed, which will likely not happen in time. So, while the oven and all cob elements will be completed by the 4th, the community oven firing day will be determined on a future date.

Looking forward to seeing and dancing in the mud with y'all this weekend and celebrating in the street on July 4th!

WATER CONSERVATION NEEDED NOW!!

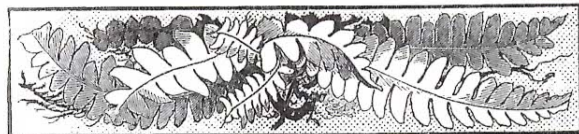
**PLEASE MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO
REDUCE YOUR WATER CONSUMPTION
IMMEDIATELY.**

After several years of historically low water consumption in the district, we are beginning to see water use rising to alarming levels. During the most recent quarter, consumption rose to the highest level in six years. As we enter the summer season, it is critically important that all customers use their best efforts to reduce their water use immediately.

Please, reduce or eliminate your outdoor watering as soon as possible. Please turn off automatic irrigation systems and hand water only, preferably late in the day or early evening to reduce water loss due to evaporation. Make every effort to use your household appliances such as laundry machines and dishwashers only when you have full loads. Limit the length of showers to a few minutes. Check your toilets and faucets to make sure you do not have any leaks.

Thank you in advance for your conservation efforts. After an unusually dry winter, this water-scarce community will need to do its best to conserve water now to avoid mandatory rationing later in the year. Please call 868-1224 with any questions. Thank you!
