Our Friend Terry

Terry was a very private person but he really liked interacting with the people who would come into the hardware store. He always said the store was his social outlet. As he took care of old friends or customers he'd never met, he'd talk about baseball (his favorite) or movies, art, literature, music and more. He was a voracious reader – history, poetry, philosophy, science fiction & fantasy, mystery – Parker novels. He loved jazz. He could talk to anyone about pretty much anything.

Everyone went to him for advice and even though we were capable of answering at least some of the questions, many wanted to consult *only* with Terry or have him mix their paint or cut their glass. There was something really comforting about having Terry help you at the hardware. He made you feel like he was always glad to see you and appreciated the chance to work with you to solve a problem.

At the end of the day, he loved going home to his place in Paradise Valley. He cut his yard (more like a field) by hand with a long scythe and chopped his own firewood for the woodstove he would only light on the coldest of days. He was up at 5am and reading in bed by 9pm. He was very disciplined about his schedule. He walked to the store most days and I often conjure up the image of him crossing Gospel flats with his iconic gait and book bag slung over his shoulder on the way to work.

A year ago, Terry was diagnosed with esophageal cancer and moved to our house. So began a year of endless trips over the hill for radiation, chemotherapy, operations and hospital stays. He made friends with all his nurses and they went out of their way to see him. He had an amazing attitude about his illness and never got angry or depressed. He just continued to calmly enjoy what he could about his life with the utmost grace and strength. Although he wanted to beat the cancer, he wasn't afraid of dying. He said that a lot of people he loved had preceded him, so he knew he'd be joining them. He told me he had no regrets – that he was content with his life and felt it had been a good one.

Terry's recent art show at the Bolinas Museum was a real highlight for him. He got tons of cards and notes from people who loved the show and had no idea of his artistic ability and just how talented he really was. It meant so much to him to read people's reactions and their comments on what they appreciated about his work. He particularly loved the fact that young people really responded well to his whimsical, intricate, accomplished work. He was a true artist. Some of Terry's original botanical drawings that he did while he worked for

Dennis Breedlove at the Academy of Sciences, are in the Smithsonian.

He finally made the decision to stop treatment a few weeks ago because it was making him so sick. We got Hospice involved to help and he began to spend most of his time in bed and was very tired and weak, but not in much pain. On Monday the 19th he quickly began to need more care than we could give him at our house so he moved to Sam's House in downtown Bolinas that afternoon. We sat with him until almost 9, when we left for the evening, expecting to see him in the morning. Rosie was with him when he quietly died about 25 minutes later. I feel as though he waited for us to leave and then slipped away.

Terry loved puns and had a wry, ironic sense of humor. He loved tools, toys, old comics, cartoons and old movies. Felix and Little Lulu. Then there was Elvis, and of course, Buster Keaton. Terry was very humble but very great. It was an honor to have him as my friend.

His loss feels immense and I keep looking for him in the plumbing room or waiting to hear his cowboy boots clomping into the store so I can spend a great day working with him and learning hardware, laughing at his corny jokes, watching him work so happily with his customers and enjoying what he has to say. We all miss him terribly.

Thank you to the devoted friends who supported Terry during his illness in so many ways. Thank you to those stalwarts who took turns driving him to all his many appointments, to those who brought us food and flowers and to everyone who wrote notes full of good wishes and asked after him. All were so appreciated and made a real difference to him. Thank you to June for checking on Terry when I couldn't be at home and thank you to Rosie and Julio at Sam's house for making his last few hours full of love and comforting care.

There will be a memorial for Terry in September after the summer craziness is over. Probably close to his birthday on the 22nd. Actual date and place details TBD. We will let you know.




Annual Bolinas Museum Benefit July 3rd Cocktail Party! Monday July 3~ 5:30-7:30.







Bolinas Museum Gallery Talk Jon Goodchild & His 1960s-70s Photographic Collection with Leslie Acoca Goodchild Saturday, July 1~ 4-5 PM ~ Free


Don't miss this opportunity to revisit an old friend of Bolinas and a significant time in contemporary history. In the 1960s and 70s music and publications were the voice of an era of youth driven innovation that rocked the world and still influences us today. Jon Goodchild, who later became part of Bolinas, was a creative force whose aesthetic and graphic designs helped launch the music and cultural revolution of the 60's and 70's. British born, he was the seminal art director for London's outrageous Oz magazine, British Rolling Stone, and San Francisco's Rolling Stone magazine- this year celebrating its 50th anniversary--and later, Straight Arrow Books. During his career, Goodchild collaborated and became friends with hundreds of writers, artists, musicians and photographers who became world famous such as Hunter S. Thompson, Martin Sharp, Mick Jagger and Michael Zagaris.

Over time Goodchild accumulated over 300 original 1960s-70s photographs by now renowned men and women photographers. His collection has been carefully catalogued for eventual sale. A selection of of these images are currently on exhibit in the Bolinas Museum's photography gallery, including an photo of the Grateful Dead as young guys with slightly long hair, Bunny Wailer (Livingston) a founding member of the Wailers, and a portrait of Goodchild taken by Annie Leibovitz in Yoko Ono's living room wearing the shirt that is displayed next to the photo. There is also a somber photo of the rock and roll venue Fillmore East hung with black cloth in mourning for the four students who were shot by National Guard during a demonstration at Kent State University. These photos were selected for the power and interest of their images.

When Goodchild moved to Bolinas in the 1970s, he found kindred spirits in a vigorous community and lent his huge talent to many projects- including the Bolinas Community Plan. Along with his fellow Oz magazine cohort Jim Anderson, he created memorable covers and art for Bolinas Hearsay News. While living in Bolinas he met and married a dynamic young woman, Leslie Acoca, his wife of seventeen years. Their most enduring "work of art" is their daughter Rhiannon Hawkes Goodchild and her children. Jon died in 1999, but his legend lives on and it is appropriate that these rarely seen photographs are being shared in Bolinas.

For this talk, Leslie Acoca Goodchild will bring personal insights into Jon Goodchild and this photographic collection. Leslie came to Bolinas in her early 20s, freshly graduated from Yale, with her then husband Michael Lerner. Her son Josh Lerner grew up in Bolinas. Leslie was instrumental in founding Full Circle School and Commonweal in Bolinas, before becoming a psychotherapist and passionate advocate for girls. Her work was supported and encouraged by husband Jon, a feminist in his own beliefs. She is nationally recognized for her many projects, and is the recipient of the International Hero of Compassion award from the Dalai Lama. Most recently her work as founder and executive director of National Girls Health and Justice Institute has touched thousands of lives by bringing healthcare to incarcerated girls and women.

Join us in the photography gallery of Bolinas Museum at 4 PM. The talk is free to all.



A Story of Transformation for Humanity by Vivienne (Verdon-Roe)

Remember what happens to the caterpillar? Could nature be showing us the process we are now experiencing? (Similarities between the caterpillar and humanity are highlighted bold!)

After a period of ravenous consumption, a caterpillar becomes too bloated to move. It attaches to a branch and hangs upside down (everything is turned on its head) and forms a chrysalis. Unable to move, the caterpillar begins to fall apart, becoming goop. Tiny cells which had been dormant in the caterpillar (junk DNA in the individual; visionaries in the collective) begin a process of creating a new form and structure, something completely new and amazingly beautiful. Biologists in a stroke of poetic genius called these cells "Imaginal cells".

But the transition is not easy. .

It must be pretty scary for the caterpillar to feel itself falling part and becoming goo. It must feel like it's dying. And of course, it is, because the truly astonishing thing is that there is NO STRUCTURAL SIMILARITY between a caterpillar and a butterfly.

At first these Imaginal cells are regarded as threats and are attacked by the caterpillar's immune system (just as new ideas in politics, science, medicine and social behavior is seen as threats and attacked by the establishment). But the unique new cells persist and multiply and pretty soon the caterpillar's immune system cannot destroy them fast enough. More and more of the imaginal cells survive. They begin to recognize each other and cluster together in friendly little groups. They begin resonating at the same frequency and passing information back and forth until they hit a tipping point.

At this point something extraordinary happens. Collective intelligence emerges. The Imaginal cells begin acting not as discrete individual cells but as a multi-cell organism - and the butterfly is born.

The Imaginal cells have become a community that can cooperatively share the work. Each new butterfly cell can take on a different job. There's something for everyone to do. And everyone is important, all contributing to the life of the whole. So each cell does what it is most drawn to do. And every other cell encourages it to do just that.

A great way to organize a butterfly! A great way to organize a society!

What died was an old way of being, and it died in order for something new and wondrous to be born.

May it be so.
