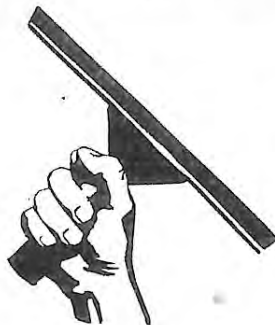
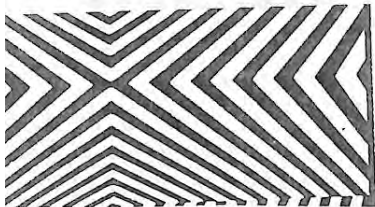

A Report from the Road from Ananda Brady

Primary objective: to bring the gypsy wagon as setting for fortune-teller, belly dancers and musicians, to Woodside elementary school, a small town south of SFO, for a fund-raising event that I was hired for. My friend and collaborator Jessaiah, who initially proposed to me the Woodside offer, organized the music and dance program for it, and put together a tight personal escort team of her close friends to prepare the wagon for its final push down the coast to its destination. These have delightfully become instant close friends to me too. With two of us dedicated, along with everything else, as being our chef and mechanic all of our basic needs are expertly met!

Secondary spin-off: relax for a month along the coast, camping and preparing for further performances.

The fund-raiser at the Woodside Elementary school came off splendidly, we were the real 'Bohemians' at their Bohemian-themed faire. But the plan has changed – only a bit – as I'd broken a wagon spring somewhere on the drive down the freeway and through San Fran, (I'm pulling it with my Dodge Chinook motor-home) and it had to be fixed. So now instead of being out on the coast, our merry band is camping safely behind a gate in a gloriously unkempt and secluded backyard beside Wildcat Canyon in Richmond, with a glowing fire-pit and the vardo (wagon) up on jacks awaiting the parts for its new suspension. I'm now meeting up with musicians, dancers and artists, of an expansive bay area network that revolves around the love of Balkan and middle Eastern music, you know, *Gypsy* oriented – and I can tell you, these people know what the hell they're doing, they're not just playing *at* it. We're living life in present tenses, working and playing (chores, caravanning, art projects, song and rhythm practice, choreography all being guided by Jessaiah) together with frequent outbursts of laughter from someone's outrageous and usually irreverent humor. We all know what has to be done, no one has to crack the whip, and if we have any leader it's the gypsy vardo itself, we're working for it and it's working its magic for us.

And by the way, a couple of weeks ago I received the news of my eviction notice from my home of the past fourteen years. It's the county's decree, not the landlord's – but I'm already mostly packed and out the door. If I'd have received this news with all the work that had to be done on the wagon *ahead* of me, instead of *behind* me it would have been a difficult task indeed. Instead it was enjoyable, bringing the wagon to life with the exciting prospect of a real road trip. I'd seen the possibility of an eviction for some time, but was hanging on to denial, I was way comfortable in my little home by the sea. But when the 'job' offer at the Woodside School presented itself I resisted, it set up a battle between me and lethargy – it would be a damn lot of work to get the wagon restored, not to mention getting it all the way down there. But a nagging voice at 3am told me that this was providence knocking, so I pried myself up out of my easy chair, and hallelujah, now I'm easy again – at being



in motion. (*Inertia* means 'the tendency of an object at rest to stay at rest, and an object in motion to stay in motion.')

Interesting. So with momentum, change is easy. I've leapt out and even though it's heart-wrenching to leave Bolinas and my home-base of many years, I'll never leave all my loving friends behind. (And I'll still be around, nearby) That little town and its people has played an unquantifiable part in making me whatever I am. It feels good to be floating again in my familiar old muse and I will pursue its course, come what may.

Update: Now we're in a hippie campground nestled behind an abandoned amusement park in the redwoods of Guerneville. We take our showers right next to 'Dr. Evil's Haunted House of Horrors'.

"SURFERS OVERLOOK" VS. "OCEAN OVERLOOK"

"Surfers Overlook"—why call it that? Someone pointed out to me that the huge influx of outside surfers to our town has not benefited our town at all, to say the least, so this lovely view should not be named after them. I agree. I actually cringe a bit whenever i see this name, and these days, it's being written constantly in our local newspapers.

Beyond the question of why the current name is referencing this particular group of humans, the name should not be referençing any humans at all! It should reflect that this view is of a super powerful *Nature* force—the Ocean--it's not about people, not about *any* people!

However, i realize it's hard for people to accept a significantly changed name for a place, once a name has been in use for a long time, regardless of how inappropriate that name is. So, i tried to think of an alternative that would retain some of the existing name in sound and meter, and be easy to remember, while re-directing the meaning towards the Nature aspect of this special view.

What eventually came to me is "Ocean Overlook". It has a much more expansive sound and feeling, as well as, of course, a much grander meaning! (And, serendipitously, it even combines the names of two of our main streets on the Big Mesa: Ocean and Overlook)!

So compare these two in how they make you feel physically, and what imagery you get, when you say them aloud:

"Surfers Overlook" (contract)

"Ocean Overlook" (expand)

It's not an accident that the long "O" sound is the vowel in the most famous chant we know of, "OM". Words and names strongly affect our thinking, so let's upgrade our consciousness by renaming this viewpoint "OCEAN OVERLOOK"!

**TOTALITARIAN INOCULATION BILL GAINS STEAM:
RAIN DELAYED VACCINE DEBATE RESUMES**

I had abandoned hopes of any retort from Heilig in our "ongoing vaccine debate". He lobbed a lone depth charge last year then clammed up like a mollusk until last week. If his May 22 letter passed as debate, it was an embarrassment to the UC higher education system. From his corny Dear Hearsay Readers entree to his Tricky Dick Nixon bitter vow to "waste no more Hearsay Space on this issue" it avoided evidence.

Mandatory Vaccinations: Totalitarian Inoculation, my argument to oppose Senate Bill 277 published on May 20, was submitted to the Hearsay five weeks before. The reference to CA Senator Dick Pan's delay of a committee vote for a week in response to informed opposition from parents was a clue. It has since passed through the Senate with a waiver for all exempted children currently enrolled to split off the opposition. The amended bill to force future school children to submit to mandatory vaccinations is now in the CA Assembly. Whatever your personal or religious beliefs about vaccines this bill will sink west Marin schools without improving public health. An editor chose to deep six that article until the "easily verifiable" fact that the "school board voted to support [Senate Bill 277] last week" became Heilig's soggy assumption of "an error regarding the school board's action." For the record, the school board voted to initiate a statement of support for the bill in April. The motion failed to gain a second for final approval at the May school board meeting. So don't call the school board, (unless you want a dedicated math teacher).

Board members dropped their support despite Heilig's claim that "nobody is likely to pay him attention anyways." Illogically, Heilig then worries that "someone might take him seriously" enough to follow through on "numerous death threats by unhinged people" against Senator Dick Pan, the bill's sponsor due to "inflammatory totalitarian rhetoric". Tell Heilig to ignore his "wise advisors in town" who told him to "not bother responding". This is unwise for Silence only signifies assent. Urge

him to respond with "reality based information from sources with real expertise and credibility" to correct "the half dozen or more mistakes and misrepresentations." As a medical ethicist Heilig should submerge "potentially harmful misinformation" for Hearsay Readers, especially unhinged ones.
