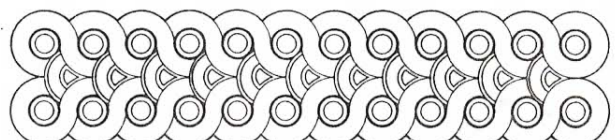
The terms of 3 BCPUD Directors expire this year.\*\* If you would like to run for one of these seats in the November 5, 2013 election, you must declare your candidacy during the filing period, which opens **July 15, 2013** and closes **August 9, 2013 at 5:00 p.m.** The appropriate forms are available from the Registrar of Voters office at the Civic Center (Room 121) and must be filed there. If any of the 3 BCPUD Directors whose terms are expiring at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period for **non-incumbents only** will be extended through **August 14, 2013.**

**\*\* News Flash:** one of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year has publicly declared his intention to run for reelection and another of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year has publicly declared her intention *not* to run for reelection.

The last day to submit measures for placement on the November ballot is **August 9, 2013**; the last day to withdraw a measure from the ballot is **August 14, 2013.** The last day to submit ballot arguments is **August 19, 2013** and the last day to submit rebuttal arguments is **August 26, 2013.** In each case, the pertinent documents regarding measures on the ballot must be received by the County's Election Office by **4:30 p.m.** on the deadline date.

### Farming In a Changing Climate

Spring is the season of the bluebirds. It's the return of the white pelicans and the osprey. Spring is when the winds blow in from up the bay, and clear the air – sometimes maddeningly, for weeks on end. The grass in the pastures is so green that the sheep get bloat and horses founder under buckling legs, enticed by the irresistible, fresh food surrounding them. For lovers of novelty, spring provides something new every day: iris bulbs shooting up into blossoms, flowers everywhere to look at and sniff, baby deer, baby birds, and many baby people. Maybe it rains one day and then it is hot and dry the next.

This is a season of unpredictability. Despite its beauty, to love spring in West Marin isn't always easy - especially for anyone working the land. The wind can blow too long and hard, driving people and animals alike a little crazy. But most disconcertingly, the schizophrenic spring can be a difficult time for farmers and ranchers, who have always had it hard because the nature of weather is not predictable. But certain weather patterns used to be predictable: in coastal northern California, winter and early spring were normally cool, summer was warm and foggy. It usually rains in late fall and wintertime, with a bit in spring.

Predictability of these general patterns is helpful for farmers. How can one plan what to plant when the weather is going to be unpredictable? Last March, we had beautiful, purple-sprouting broccoli on our little farm in Point Reyes Station, just getting ready to sprout up. Then, after a relatively droughty winter, it rained for almost 3 weeks straight in March, making up for the rainfall that hadn't come. We needed the rain, but not all at once! First, our broccolis were flooded, killing off half of them. Then, we

had a very warm April. The broccoli bolted and the aphids settled in. After that, 4 rows of bok choy went from their cute, little choy stage to their inedible, bitter form within a couple of days. And from there they went into the compost pile.

This year it rained all of December. For the second year in a row, we received 2/3<sup>rd</sup>s of our average rainfall in one fell swoop. Then we didn't get much for the rest of winter or spring. The frosts that came in January probably helped keep the cucumber beetle population down, which has been good for our plants so far this year, with exception of the flea beetle, who seems to be enjoying the combination of warm weather and newly planted kale. But because of

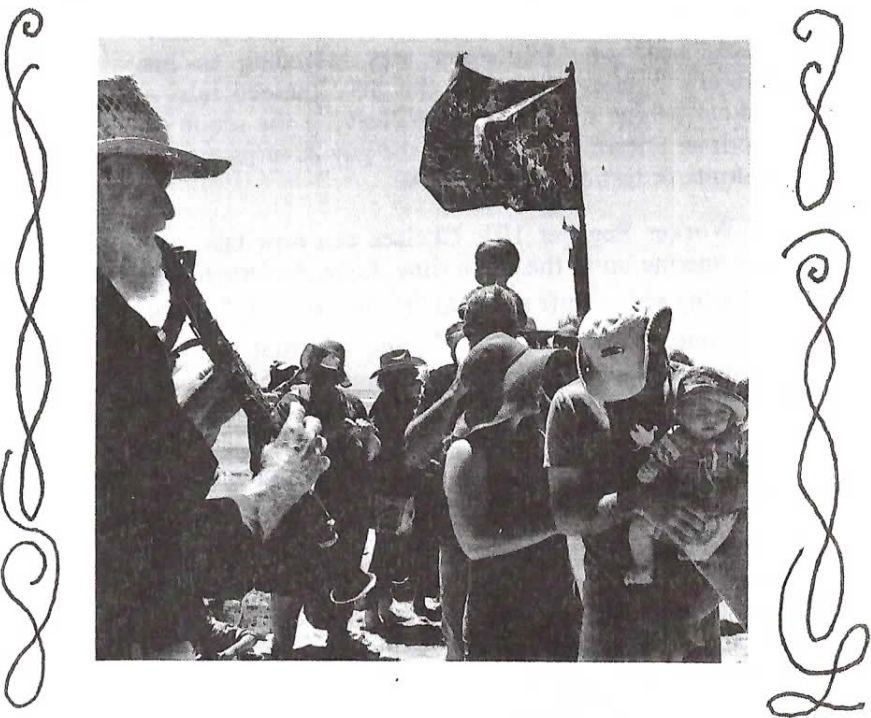

PLANTS FOR THE COASTAL CLIMATE



all the dry, winter weather, we were able to get our fields ready about 2 months earlier this year, compared to last year. 2 months is a huge difference! The warmth we had early this spring has been difficult to navigate. The lettuces have grown quickly and with a week of 80+ degree daytime temperatures, the threat of bolting always looms. Once again, we've had to pull our broccoli and cabbage before harvest due to the overly-warm air temperatures that came early this spring.

Having grown up with the bay area's coastal climate, I don't recall such extreme spring weather. The most major difference I've noticed is the extreme change from cold to warm within days. Cold fronts come, sometimes with rain, but they don't last long. A day or two later it warms up. The old timers might say that it's a foolish farmer who believes in predictable weather patterns. But wasn't there a time in recent history when farmers could plant their broccoli and expect at least that the wintertime weather wouldn't usually get too hot? After all, isn't it strange when the temperature is over 80 degrees, year after year, here during the day in February? Similarly, it is not supposed to be close to 90 degrees Fahrenheit on the northern

California coast in April. Is it? In fact, for the last 6 years, we've had 3 April's with daytime temperatures between 87 and 91 degrees in Pt. Reyes Station.

Consensus is building for the understanding that these unpredictable weather patterns are symptomatic of a changing climate. Climate change theory and its human-causes are now being borne out by a lot of data. What will these changes mean for small-scale (and large scale!) organic farmers and ranchers attempting to improve, strengthen and localize our food systems? I'd like to think that we are adaptable enough to build a robust, local, and organic food system, even with the climate transforming all around us. And more than ever, we are challenged to pay close attention to nature. In my optimism, I think maybe helpful clues can be found when watching the animals, insects and plants? Perhaps the early return of the bluebirds that I worked with last year while they perched atop the fava bean stalks and watched for cucumber beetles, gave me the sign that it was time to plant those tomato seeds in the greenhouse? Then again, what do bluebirds know? I've seen birds migrate in on warm winds, too early in spring, only to suffer through a nasty cold snap later in the season. The reality of climate change for those intimately living with natural patterns is being felt and notes are being taken. What's to be done about all this is another matter.
