

BCLT Weekly Report:

Happy Friday our fabulous friends! As you are well aware, the BCLT is busy bringing more affordable living opportunities to Bolinas and making community sustainability our top priority.

Here's a quick update on what's going on behind the scenes and what we've been working on this week. Enjoy your Hearsay read, get your toes in the ocean and soak in these long summer days. Cheers!

Properties and projects:

- We are currently waiting for coastal permits to come through for 430 Aspen and once they do, we can apply for building permits. The property will consist of a one bedroom main house and a one bedroom second unit. Thing are moving forward!
- Progress has been made on our septic program and we are in discussion with the Environmental Health Department of Marin County and the State Regional Water Quality Control Board to try to work out the details.

Repairs and upgrades:

- The Gibson House is freshly painted and we think she looks beautiful, what an improvement!
- 6 Wharf has been power-washed and is so fresh and so clean! We are currently looking into several energy efficiency upgrade opportunities for this property and are excited to see what we might be able to do to make 6 Wharf greener and more efficient.

Grants, fundraising and finances:

We have received a grant from the West Marin Fund for \$5,000 to help with our outreach program. This grant will give us more room for educational opportunities, events and meetings with and for you, our community! It will help us continue to improve our efforts of transparency.

Community engagement:

Last Sunday we held a community discussion with our Low-Income Advisory Committee to have a conversation about what community means, what we value about Bolinas and in what ways there could be better support for our low-income residents. It's always a nice experience to share with each other and be reminded of the things that matter. From this discussion we decided some opportunities for education around tenant rights and services that are available in Marin for the varied kinds of low-income residents in Bolinas could be a big help, and we are excited to make this possible.

General news and upcoming events:

- We have a new office at 22 Brighton Ave!! When the Commons decided to call things quits, they contacted us and offered us the space, and we are beyond grateful. We are thrilled to have a space that will accommodate our staff and help us accomplish the big projects we are working on. We will be in the space starting early next week, come say hi!
 - If you haven't noticed our gas prices have been lowered, if you're in need of a fill, please come to Bo-GAS and support your local gas station.
 - Upcoming: We will be in the 4th of July Parade, look for us and afterward stop by the gas station to buy a new and exciting limited edition BCLT T-shirt or sweatshirt with art by Lucian Moon. July 27th we will be putting on a second showing of HOME II Bolinas stories worth telling, at the Community Center, we can't wait to share this special experience with more of you, keep your eyes peeled for posters and info which will be out next week!














HOORAY! HOORAY! JAZZ CAFE!

To Judy Molyneux, whose new oceanscapes graced the hall with the power of wildness.


To the outstanding Bolinas audience, who responded to our music with such heart and sophistication. (The musicians remarked, "What a great audience!")

Get the Holiday Memo on Water Safety, Fireworks Ban

Have fun on the Fourth of July in buoyant and non-combustible ways

San Rafael, CA – Some safety messaging sounds like a broken record, but sometimes the repetition saves lives. The Marin County Fire Department, Marin County Parks and first-responders from local agencies are preparing for a busy summer and Fourth of July holiday by urging everyone to practice water safety around the ocean, bay and pools, and practice abstinence on fireworks.

When it comes to fireworks, it should be easy to remember: All forms of fireworks are illegal in Marin. The fireworks ordinance will be enforced to reduce fire risk, protect natural resources and – most importantly – to preserve personal safety.

All illegal activities and behavior issues witnessed by Marin County Parks rangers will be reported to law enforcement or fire agencies, and enforcement will take place whether or not an incident takes place on private property or at a County government property. A misdemeanor offense of using or possessing fireworks in Marin could cost an offender \$410 – that's \$100 for the base fine plus \$310 in penalty assessments and surcharges.
