Dear Friends,

I hope to see you at the event in Pt Reyes on July 25th, and a special thank you to CLAM for organizing the event and inviting the BCLT to be co-sponsors.

Together with CLAM, the BCLT has been working with the County of Marin for years on the development code, the Local Coastal Plan and the Housing Element, requesting consistency in language and removals to barriers to affordable housing. On July 9, the Planning Commission passed the draft Housing Element, despite large and highly organized groups opposed to affordable housing. The next step in when the Draft Housing Element is presented to the Board of Supervisors on August 20, 2013 at the Civic Center (time to be announced).

I encourage all affordable housing advocates to attend, and share your stories about how important affordable housing is and how it IMPROVES through economic and social viability our lives and and our communities.



If any of the 3 BCPUD Directors whose terms are expiring at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period for non-incumbents only will be extended through August 14, 2013.


