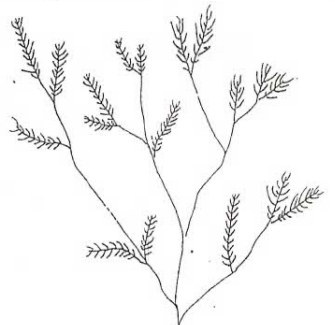

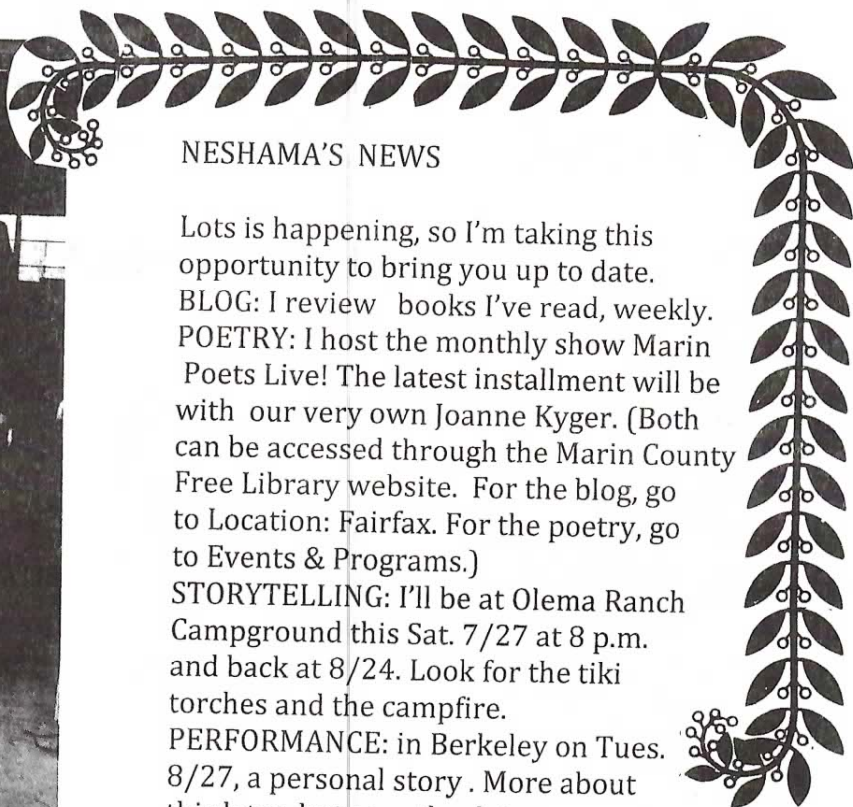

READING TO JOHN



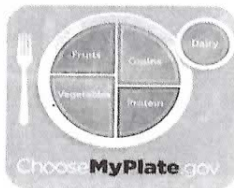

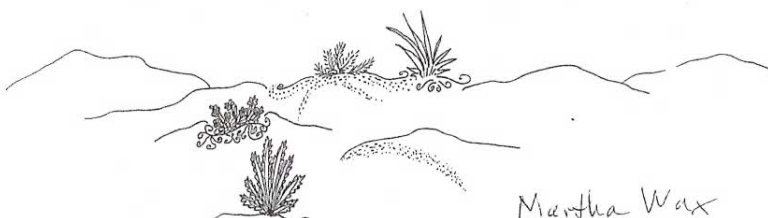

UPDATED ELECTION NEWS!

DEADLINES FOR CANDIDACY AND FOR BALLOT MEASURES! PLEASE READ!

The terms of 3 BCPUD Directors expire this year.** If you would like to run for one of these seats in the November 5, 2013 election, you must declare your candidacy during the filing period, which opens **July 15, 2013** and closes **August 9, 2013 at 5:00 p.m.** The appropriate forms are available from the Registrar of Voters office at the Civic Center (Room 121) and must be filed there. If any of the 3 BCPUD Directors whose terms are expiring at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period **for non-incumbents only** will be extended through **August 14, 2013.**

**** UPDATE ON BCPUD INCUMBENT DIRECTORS:** one of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year has publicly declared his intention to run for reelection and two of the three incumbent BCPUD Directors whose terms expire this year have publicly declared their intentions *not* to run for reelection.

The last day to submit measures for placement on the November ballot is **August 9, 2013**; the last day to withdraw a measure from the ballot is **August 14, 2013.** The last day to submit ballot arguments is **August 19, 2013** and the last day to submit rebuttal arguments is **August 26, 2013.** In each case, the pertinent documents regarding measures on the ballot must be received by the County's Election Office by **4:30 p.m.** on the deadline date.

I first moved to Bolinas in 1974, when I was 8 years old. I came from St. Paul Minnesota. My mom was invited to be a guest professor at USF so we packed up a Volkswagon van with stuff and dogs and cats and me and headed west! After three long weeks we arrived in SF and started looking for a place to rent. No one seemed to like the idea of renting to people with animals or children and after about a month of looking, and staying in our van my folks were about to give up and head back to Minnesota, but as luck would have it, they ventured into one last realtor. This small decision ended up having huge consequences!

This realtor took one quick look at my folks, took note of our three huge dogs and two cats, and the adorable me and said you need to go to Bolinas! They love children and dogs there! Well seeing that there was nothing to lose, that's what they did, headed to the coast along a winding road over a mountain through the woods until reaching the little town of Bolinas. Needless to say we found HOME!!!

In Minnesota everything from my name to my Mother's world views kept me at outcast status with any potential friends, all that changed when we found our new home. Schehera was definitely a normal name in my new school. Imagine Bolinas in the 70's ... Downtown in front of the stores were hitching posts, and back then if you were a girl of a certain age (like Sand up) you had a horse.

We would ride our horses everyday, to the store to get food, the liquor store to get our sugar, to the beach to race up and down the sand bareback and fast, then swim our horses across the lagoon. In those days our hang out, where we spent every free minute, was at Ben's barn- those of you that have been here awhile will remember dear old Ben and his dusty mobile home at the entrance of our home away from home, the barn. If those old planks of wood could speak I'm sure our hours of laughter and tears would be fondly remembered!

Yes those early years, a wild child dusty and healthy! Ok, so honestly adolescence is a little harder in this small town, we started having attitudes-12 & 13 years of age attitudes) and if you're not careful the stuff that comes next. My folks took a stand and got me off the streets and into tennis; Which was a good thing because one, I was really good and two, it gave me really great skills of focus and discipline which still serve me today!

I moved away from Bolinas when I was 17 back to Minnesota where I worked doing various things from set design to silk screening and being a barista in between. Back in those good old days where one could get a decent job just practically walking in off the street!

After a few years I came back to Bolinas, but I still needed more of life's big experiences so I left again and ended up In Santa Fe, the next HOME of my life. In NM I grew up finally, healing the wounds of the darker side of my childhood. I went to massage

school, learned Permaculture, built a Strawbale house, and got married and had my one and only beautiful son. I often say all good things happened for me in New Mexico!

My husband and I lived on some wild and beautiful land in the house we built which was off the grid completely for two years, at which point the rattle snakes became a worry for me every time my two year old went running outside butt naked (which most two year olds like to do!) I knew he needed to run, but with the occasional three foot rattler in the yard, that made me nervous! So I decided to head to Bolinas for a 10 day visit and let this boy run free on the beach. Well that 10 day visit has turned into almost 18 years!

When I arrived in Bolinas I felt the loving embrace of the town I grew up in, in a whole new way. I was a young mama, and really is there a better place for a young mama and her child? I quickly connected with all the other young mama's and did what you do-meet on the beach, sun bathe and watch our kids ply, go to dance class, walk to the plaza and let our kids play- how could we leave? My son is almost 20 now and is still best friends with just about everyone of those kids he grew up with since age 2. So many chapters of my life, and now I finally really understand what community means to me.

Community is something I became a part of through time and endurance, tolerance, acceptance and effort, and love. Most of all, time. Having spent now most of my 46 years of life here, some great, some so hard I blocked them out for awhile, and the most special ones of all, being a mother and raising my son here, I've come to love Bolinas in a very deep way.

This is an amazing community! As the world at large goes through it's highs and lows we can celebrate all of our abundance, of food, of beauty, of art both visual and musical, of friends, of challenges, the ocean etc. Where is there better? This is in response to Cory's writing- which by the way, Ghost Dog is one of my favorite movies!
