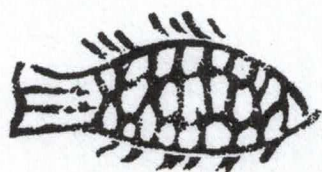

**2018 ELECTION NEWS! DEADLINES FOR
CANDIDACY AND FOR BALLOT
MEASURES! PLEASE READ!**

The terms of three (3) BCPUD Directors expire this year. If you would like to run for one of these seats in the November 6, 2018 election, you must declare your candidacy during the filing period, which opens **July 16, 2018** and closes **August 10, 2018**. The appropriate forms are available from the Registrar of Voters office at the Civic Center (Room 121) and must be filed there. If any of the three BCPUD Directors whose terms are expiring at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period for **non-incumbents only** will be extended several days (the specific date is not yet available).

The last day to submit measures for placement on the November ballot is **August 10, 2018**; the last day to withdraw a measure from the ballot is **August 15, 2018**. The last day to submit ballot arguments is **August 20, 2018** and the last day to submit rebuttal arguments is **August 27, 2018**. In each case, the pertinent documents must be received by the County's Election Office by **4:30 p.m.** on the deadline date.

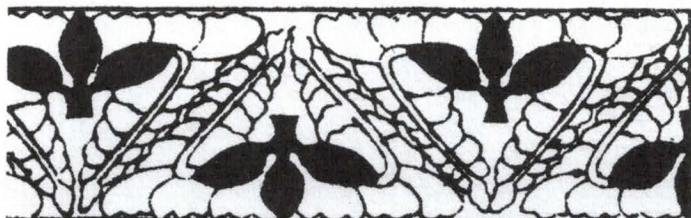

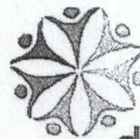

Requested Q&A's from June 25th meeting held by MUSSEL at the Bolinas Commons with BCLT Board Members

Dear members of MUSSEL,
Below are the answers to the questions asked during your requested and third meeting with the BCLT held on June 25th at the Bolinas Commons.

Thank you for your questions and concerns. As a small organization trying to do big things for our community, we appreciate the opportunities to respond to concerns and clarify our mission.

If you would like additional information please contact our staff, attend scheduled board meetings or any of our public outreach meetings. We especially encourage you to be present for our upcoming *Community Housing Meeting* on Saturday July 28th at the BCC from 4:00pm-6:00pm. There will be a lot of information presented pertaining to our proposed projects as well as other housing related work being done in Bolinas and West Marin. Time will be allotted for group discussions, questions and conversation.

How do you see us participating/collaborating in the planning process (for example, we'd like to see plans before hand to give input before they go to the county for review)?

Whenever possible, the BCLT will create opportunities for the community to weigh in on any significant building projects. Current BCLT policy is to present plans to the community once we know a project is viable. Viability tends to be different for each project depending on the circumstances. For the Lots on Overlook, neighbors will be notified by the County once plans have been submitted which gives the neighborhood the opportunity to review and comment. The reason we are unable to give neighbors and community members a chance to see plans ahead of time with our Overlook Lots has to do with

environmental constraints. We have to submit plans to the county to open the discussion of viability. Once this step has been taken the BCLT will better understand the parameters and more transparency will ensue. For properties with existing homes, like 430 Aspen, we are always available to hear the concerns and suggestions from the community. That being said, with any project that includes design review, the county will alert the surrounding neighbors and offer a time period for them to review and comment.

How do we plan to address things like noise, environmental impact, maintenance of dirt roads, traffic, CEQA?

Noise: Any noise complaints at a BCLT property can be handled with BCLT management or directly with the neighbors.

Environmental impacts: Environmental mitigation is dictated at the county level. The BCLT also has an environmental committee in place which includes board members and community members to ensure our landscaping is in-line with native habitat restoration.

Maintenance of dirt roads: The BCLT will participate in each neighborhood's chosen structure of maintenance of dirt roads.

Traffic: All of our projects are required to have off street parking. Included in our leases associated with dirt road properties tenants will be reminded to respect a 5mph speed limit of their given roads.

CEQA: CEQA is determined at the county and state level. If any project the BCLT was involved with did not comply, it would not be approved by the county.

What are you doing to house the elders or the single people in the community rather than families?

Although our focus is on family housing currently, all three of our proposed projects include units for singles/seniors. Our strategic plan delineates all categories of housing and will be available for community review soon.

How will you attempt to maintain the quality of life values of the Bolinas Community Plan as well as all others? Can you show to be in line with the goals there?

Our strategic plan will show our deep respect and dedication to the Bolinas Community Plan, we encourage everyone to review it when it becomes public.

Can story poles go up early so the community gets a good idea what the buildings will look like well before they go up?

Story poles are required by the county to go up as soon as a planning project has been approved, we will be compliant. They will remain up until the building permits have been issued. This is usually a 6 week to 6-month period. We are unable to put story poles up without permission from the county.

If another house came up in this neighborhood that was viable would you purchase it?

We have already turned down two others and at this point our plate is full. We are pursuing projects in other areas of Bolinas that could be viable, but they are a long way off.

(everyone agrees that projects will be talked about in terms of density by number of bedrooms from here on out rather than number of people) Can lots be subdivided, and if some will be sold, which will be sold (the houses not the land)? How does this structure work?

Subdividing: Lots cannot and will not be subdivided.

Sold units: Any homeownership will be done through a limited equity housing co-op structure. (The BCLT will always own the ground lease, owners will own the structures.) At this time, we have not determined which properties will include home ownership. We do know that 430 Aspen will not.

How many additions could a new owner do on the property they buy if any?

The properties units will be deed restricted.

Is Steve still updating the buildable lot map and can that be shared with the community?

Yes and yes. Updating this map is a long process so we cannot determine when it will be completed, hopefully soon.

Waitlist process, tenant selection, how do these things work with in the BCLT system?

The BCLT operates an open waitlist, anyone who is interested in being on our waitlist, from within Bolinas or not, is able to submit an application. If an applicant does not meet our income requirements they are alerted and removed. When a unit becomes available we start at the top of the list and go through it until we have an applicant who matches the unit size, income requirements for the unit, living preference (shared living space, or private for example) and timing. If the person is interested in the space and their information is accurate we move forward with lease signing. The BCLT is strictly held to fair housing laws as well as many compliance rules and take the wellbeing of our tenants and the surrounding neighbors very seriously.

What improvements to the infrastructure will be done including landscaping? How will Landscaping effect water?

The BCLT has a commitment to using native plants in all landscaping which will be overseen by our environmental committee. Due to our water meter restrictions, catchment systems will be used to ensure water use will be reserved for human habitation.

What are the building code processes?

This is a long and complicated process, and it varies from property to property. We are currently working on writing it out. In the meantime, our Executive Director Arianne Dar is happy to explain it to anyone interested. We will try to answer this question clearly at our upcoming *Community Housing Meeting* held at the Bolinas Community Center Saturday July 28th 4:00 – 6:00pm. Status of plans: proposed numbers of bedrooms, water usage, septic?

Planners (including Steve Matson and septic): Steve Matson is an architect, and current board member and Bolinas resident. We consult with engineering, geo-technic, environmental, surveying and septic subcontractors.

BCLT Statement of Practices

Mission

The Bolinas Community Land Trust is a local non-profit organization dedicated to creating, preserving and sustaining long-term affordable homes in Bolinas.

Issues Driving our Mission

- 1 The quality and nature of the community of Bolinas is endangered and the need for creating full time, affordable homes for long-term residents is greater than ever.
2. The extremely high demand for real estate in Bolinas has driven up property values, making the acquisition of property extremely difficult and very expensive.
3. The popularity of short-term rentals has drastically diminished the availability of long-term rentals. Many houses have become vacation or second homes and remain empty most of the time.
4. There are 584 existing water meters, all of which are currently in use or privately "entitled". Very few buildable parcels of land exist and all are privately owned.

Principles of Practice:

1. We will pursue opportunities to acquire available properties whenever possible and reasonable, and wherever they arise.
2. Due to the cost of permitting, building, renovating and purchasing homes, the BCLT will seek out the projects that are the most financially affordable and likely to succeed.
3. The BCLT is committed to our projects being financially viable and self-sustaining.
- 4 We will strive for projects whose funding include support from large donations in the forms of: grants, property, cash, legacy gifts or partnerships.
5. We accept gifts of money, property, and in-kind services. Projects will be based on their merits.
6. We are currently prioritizing family housing. However, this is not to the exclusion of homes for seniors and singles.

7. While seeking to be as transparent as possible with the community the BCLT will present plans for projects after they have been determined to be viable.

8. Members of the community with related skills will be invited to join a small committee whose task will be to study each of our projects and make recommendations that mitigate their environmental impact.

9. The BCLT is committed to following all Coastal Commission and Marin County zoning codes, the Water Moratorium, the Bolinas Plan and the Gridded Mesa Plan.

Current BCLT strategies to fulfill its mission:

• The BCLT recognizes 3 principal ways of creating new affordable homes:

1. Purchasing existing homes as legacy gifts, in partnership and through direct purchase.
2. Building second units on suitable properties where homes already exist.
3. Partnerships with homeowner residents of all income levels and in all neighborhoods of Bolinas.
4. Building from the ground up with water meters and appropriate land.

Protocols for Community Interface:

- When acquiring homes, we will notify the whole community within two weeks of the acquisition.
- When acquiring land we will notify the community once a purchase has been completed.
- When we know the details of a project and are certain of its viability, we will present it to the community in a public forum.
- We invite community members to attend our regularly scheduled board meetings to voice concerns and submit questions they may have about our on going projects.
