

Bolinas Public utility district learning how to run a farm



Gospel Flat Farms lease

Public concerns were aired at last week's Bolinas Community Public Utility District meeting about Gospel Flat Farms' lease of district land on the Big Mesa. Enough unhappiness was expressed that former director Jennie Pfeiffer asked the board to quickly get a handle on things so they don't spin into divisiveness. That advice seems to have been heeded.

The farm is leasing about four acres near the sewer ponds on the mesa. Mickey Murch is working this area. It's where the Sun Festival was held before it was moved to the beach. Another acre is the "community garden" at the Bolinas-Stinson Resource Recovery site along Olema-Bolinas Road. That's been worked for years by Mickey's dad Don.

A lease was signed in June 2011 for five years at \$100 annually with a five-year renewal at the farm's option. The lease says it's "expressly for the purpose of enhancing the quality of life in the community and meeting the goals [of] the Bolinas Commu-

nity Plan."

Mickey told the board in 2011 that he'd need at least three years of growing cover crops to make the soil on the mesa productive for agriculture and, in 10 years, for orchards. His plans were to dry farm and maintain livestock, goats specifically. The lease also allows him to have pigs, cows and poultry.

During the discussion back then utility directors agreed the town would benefit by the goats' weed eating, and illegal camping would be eliminated because of the ag activities. One director was concerned about erosion. Another said some residents questioned leasing public land to a for-profit farm. On the last point, Murch said he'd welcome other members of the public using the land to produce food.

About a month ago, residents Janine Aroyan and Ken Masterson raised some questions about the farm activities on the mesa. Director Jack Seidman told them to draw up a list for discussion.

At last week's meeting, Aroyan calmly described the issue as "how to integrate the public experience..." around the ag opera-

tion. She asked for increased setbacks from it to better experience wildlife. The lease allows a minimum range of 15 to 20 feet from pathways and driveways. Aroyan said this is "not much compared to what it was" given the public's interest in enjoying the mesa.

"To protect the public's quality of experience," Aroyan asked the district to retain an ag consultant to develop a management plan. She mentioned an individual who is known to the farming community. Bringing him in would show the change is not "antifarm," she said.

Masterson heatedly recited a short list of some of the "dozens of things" he contends are lease violations. These included some soil erosion; removal of oak trees, which he called "distressing," leaving only one; and inadequate care of acreage leased but not put into production.

Removing oak trees, Aroyan said, is contrary to the Community Plan. It calls for "a reasonable mix" of residences and small-scale agriculture, "respect for wildlife [and] vegetative uses," and protection of coastal resources, specifically pro-

tection of upland grasslands, and prohibiting alteration or removal of trees in major vegetation areas.

Masterson raised the issue of Mickey Murch's goats, saying they were not beir fed, adding that they "supposedly" have been removed. Other attendees were confused about whether they're gone.

Masterson's frustration extended to the option-to-renew and the low rent in conjunction with the use of public water which he called essentially "free." It sourced from a well on the BCPUD-owned Resource Recovery site below the mesa.

Another resident said ag use is what the community envisioned but issues have arisen about care of the public space in

cluding loss of bird habitat. Someone else asked that land that hasn't been put into production be set aside to restore native grassland. An additional comment was that agriculture is not the only public good for the land.

District general manager Jennifer Blackman said that "it shouldn't be up to the public" to raise issues that are the district's responsibility. She described having a positive meeting with the Murches a few weeks earlier and thought another would be productive. The lease should be adjusted after a meeting, she suggested, to meet the public's concerns. Directors authorized a committee of two board members (Amoroso, Seidman), several residents at the meeting, and the professional land steward, if he agrees.

By telephone this week, Janine Aroyan said the oak trees may have been removed from a different parcel. But the lack of information, she said, is part of what needs fixing. She's "very optimistic" all will be resolved and stressed that farming is part of the community.

Although not at last week's meeting Mickey Murch explained a few things by telephone. He's using the land as a "winter garden" for year-round production. He understands that "people see change" and try to figure out what's going on. He's talked with Masterson and Aroyan since the district's meeting and feels "we're all on the same side." He's open to a group meeting on the property.

He moved 12 goats from the family's main farm to the mesa, he said. They were happy until rains set in and they got "super wet." Not having anywhere else to keep them, he found someone to take them.

As for not feeding them, that is "so not a part of the story....They [the goats] just find something to complain about," he said; it's part of their nature. "It was never a matter of not taking care of them." There


are goats on the mesa now, belonging to a neighbor who has "a really awesome...goat-centered lease."

He would like to have animals in the future, chickens or pigs, to help maintain an orchard. He rotates chickens around the family's main farm. About pigs, he "can totally see how a neighbor would be concerned."

Murch said he didn't remove oak trees. He took down some plum trees and poison oak so he could plow. There is one oak at the end of one of his fields and he's plowing around it.

This week general manager Blackman said the meeting will allow a dialogue among everyone. She finds "a committed determination to find a common solution" among all concerned.
