**UPDATE ON BOLINAS PAVING PROJECT
(WHARF, OLEMA-BOLINAS AND
HORSESHOE HILL ROADS)**

**AVAILABILITY OF
ASPHALT/CONCRETE GRINDINGS**

As a reminder, the County's contractor, Ghilotti Brothers, will begin the paving project in Bolinas on Monday, September 9, 2013. The paving will begin at the end of Wharf Road (which will take approximately three days), and will proceed out Olema-Bolinas Road and Horseshoe Hill Road. The total time estimated for digouts, grinding and paving in Bolinas is approximately two weeks.

Ghilotti Brothers will be delivering the asphalt concrete grindings from this project to the Mesa Park parking lot. Once the deliveries are complete, the grindings will be available for use by Bolinas residents to improve the public rights-of-way on the Mesa. (The asphalt concrete has been tested and the lab test results of the material were all below applicable contaminant limits.) Local contractors are available for hire to haul and spread this material to improve Bolinas roads. An updated notice will be published to confirm when the grindings are available.

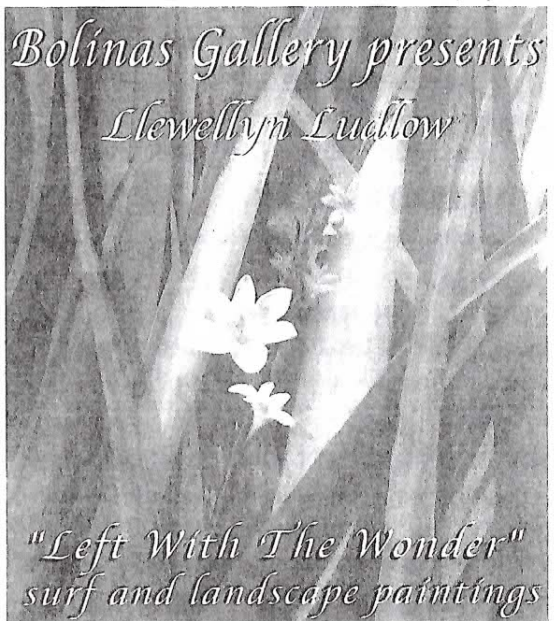

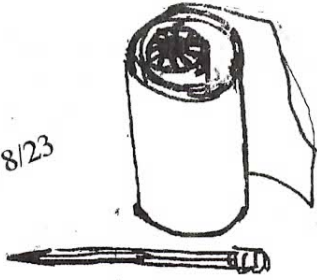

Stinson beach shoreline will be closed for a week, what with the whale burial and the Great White sighting.

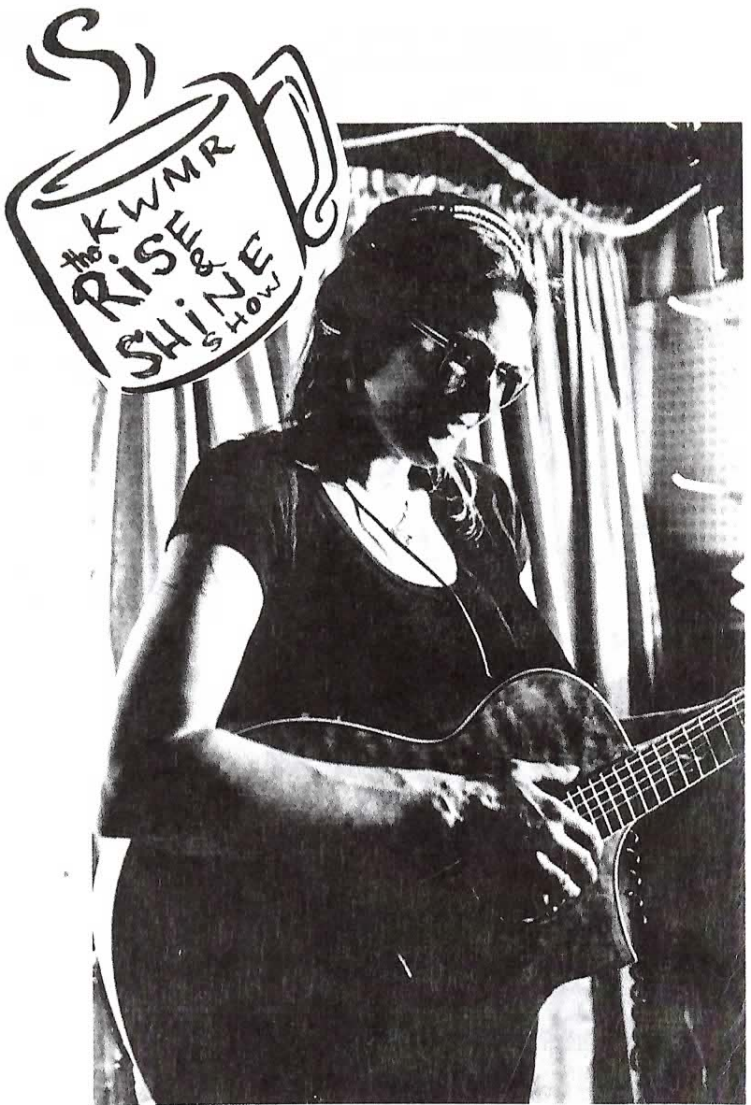
The thick sandy beach is accessible because we are sooo confident that a shark will not come out of the water to grab a snack.

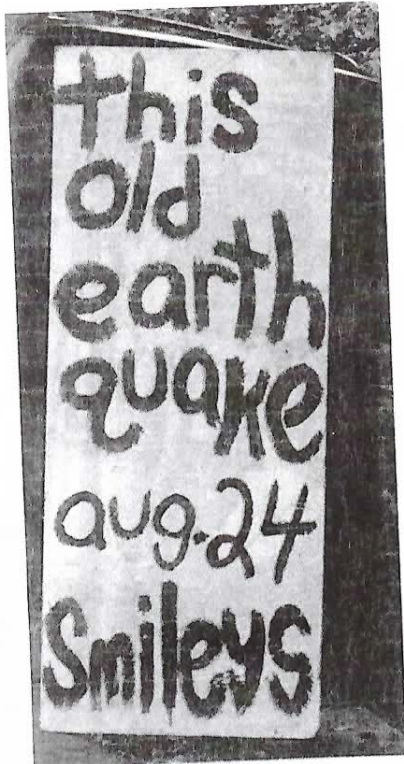

Marrakech, Morocco

Journal entry:

"Here I am again, on the train. The train should leave any minute now (insha'Allah) and I'll be on my way from Marrakech to Casablanca. Someone once recommended that I write down what it looks like here because it is different, and even though I've become so used to it, I do not want to forget the feeling of being here.

To begin, The Amal Center, the organization for disadvantaged Moroccan women where I interned and volunteered for a month. Such a bright feeling when walking in—the burnt orange Marrakech red outside walls, the small green lawn and children's play area, the deep red and gold seats lining the walls of the dining room, and the turquoise, magenta, green, and orange colors of the inside rooms. Then, entering the kitchen: all of the women, sitting on the stairs or on the little rainbow colored, wicker stools, peeling almonds or chopping parsley or folding Moroccan briwates pastries.

I can't believe I'm already leaving, heading home for the states. On The Amal Center, the organization for disadvantaged Moroccan women where I interned and volunteered for a month: I feel so lucky that I got to be part of something so wonderful and help with this project at its beginning!

When I first visited The Amal Center, there was only construction and cinder blocks. There was truly nothing. By the time I left, the center was a functioning organization, with twenty to forty customers a day eating at the restaurant that the women run! Watching it develop and grow was one of the most inspiring things I have ever been a part of. This project is truly something bigger than the sum of its parts."
