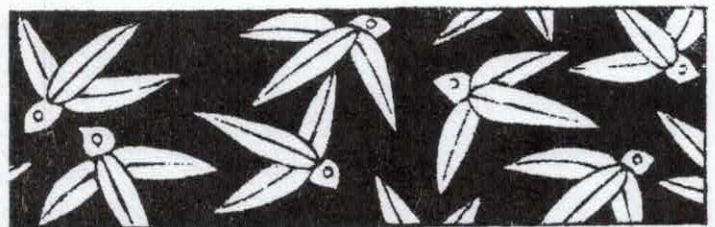

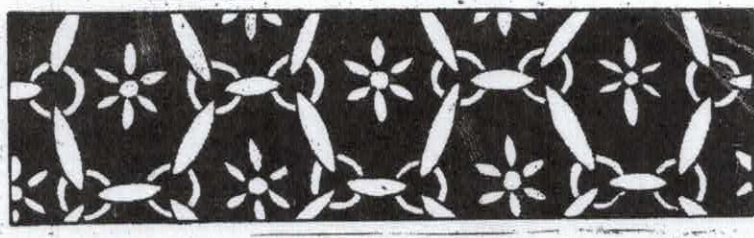

## BOLINAS READS: an interview with Tenaya Tremp

Tenaya Tremp is 16 years old and is a junior at Tam. She is an avid reader and gets many of her books at the Bolinas Library or requests them to be sent here from other libraries. She describes herself as follows: "I play tennis for the school team and I surf in Bolinas. I'm also part of the drama and journalism departments at my school. I've lived here since I was a baby when my family moved up from Laguna Beach, and though I spend crazy-long amounts of time in the car every day, I love it here."

**What are you reading now? Do you have a pile of books by your bedside (or somewhere else) that you are planning on reading? Do you read one book at time or several?**

Right now, I'm reading a book called *Aristotle and Dante Discover the Secrets to the Universe* by Benjamin Alire Sáenz about two gay boys growing up in Texas in the 1980s. I generally have a pile of about 3 books by my bed, both books that I've already read many times and completely new ones. I normally read multiple books from different genres at the same time, and I pick which one to read based off of how I feel. If I'm in the mood for a trashy romance novel, then I'll read that, but if I feel like something with actual content then I'll choose something else.

**How do you decide what to read? Do you browse in the library or look on the library catalog? Or maybe you hear about books from friends?**

Normally, once I finish a book that I like a lot I'll simply look up books similar to that one, or authors similar to the author of the book. I will often find one author who seems good and then just order all of their books at the same time. If I already have enough books, I add them to a list so that I can remember them for later. I don't generally hear about books from friends as most of my close friends are into types of books that I don't really like.

**Do you have any early memories of coming into the library here?**

I think my first memory of coming to the Bolinas library was coming here with my dad to pick out the book for him to read to me later that night. I don't remember if I ended up liking the book we chose or not, but I bet I did.

**How do you like to read, what format? Paper or ebooks, audiobooks?**

I prefer to read in paper because it is way more satisfying to hold and it's also easier to flip back to things that you missed or want to read again. I have a kindle also, though, that I use if I ever travel, but I never use it at home.

**What were some of your favorite early childhood books?**

When I was really young, I really liked the *Magic Tree House* series about two kids traveling through time in their tree house. Then I became obsessed with *The Ranger's Apprentice* series, a series about a boy in medieval England learning how to become this secret-agent type thing, and *Warriors*, one about cats. In middle school the big thing was the series about the Greek Gods, *Percy Jackson*.

**When did you start to read for yourself?**

I don't remember exactly, but probably when I was about 8? I still had people read to me also, but I think that's when I first had books that I read to myself as well as read-alouds.

**Do you have a favorite genre? Mystery, science fiction biography etc?**

Probably romance because it makes me feel all happy when I read it. :)

**Do you mostly read fiction or nonfiction?**

Mainly fiction. All the non-fiction books I've been given have reminded me of my school textbooks, which is most definitely not fun.

**What's the last book you recommended to a friend?**

A book called *Goodbye Days*. It's about a boy who texts his friends while they're driving, and in the process of answering his text message they get in a car accident and all three die. It was easily one of the saddest books I read but it was so good I could barely put it down!

**Is there a famous author that you would like to meet? (living or dead, could be back in time)**

Honestly, nobody pops into my head. I guess I like books more for the books than the author, so I don't really have a favorite. I'd probably have to say Mark Twain, not really for his writing, but simply because he seemed like a cool person to talk to.

**Do you have a favorite character? What kind of character draws you in?**

I think my favorite character would be Mark Watney from the book *The Martian*. He's an astronaut who get accidentally abandoned on Mars with no communication to Earth who has to survive. He's not only amazingly smart, but he's realistic in that he isn't perfect and he has a really funny, sarcastic humor. His qualities are pretty much everything that I appreciate in not only a character but also a friend.

**When and where do you like to read? What's your ideal reading experience?**

My favorite place to read is in a big, comfortable rocking chair that I have in my room. Curling up in it with a snack and a good book is the most relaxing thing ever.

**Lastly, Why read?**

I read because it's relaxing. It's one of those things that will never change, no matter where you are, what time it is, or what is going on. In the book, the world is unchanging, and I really like that about it.

### Fire Fighters Throttled by Verizon!

Have you seen the articles? Verizon stopped critical wireless service to fire fighters fighting the Mendocino complex fire until they paid more for service. They had to negotiate over a day while critical decisions had to be made and communicated in the beginning of the fire. <https://arstechnica.com/tech-policy/2018/08/verizon-throttled-fire-departments-unlimited-data-during-calif-wildfire/>

"County Fire has experienced throttling by its ISP, Verizon," Santa Clara County Fire Chief Anthony Bowden wrote in a declaration. "This throttling has had a significant impact on our ability to provide emergency services. Verizon imposed these limitations despite being informed that throttling was actively impeding County Fire's ability to provide crisis-response and essential emergency services." Verizon also throttled firefighters during fires twice before.

### Watch out East Marin!

This reckless, life-endangering attitude towards public safety is demonstrated by the same industry that now wants to install thousands of new microwave and millimeter wave antennas on short poles along densely populated city streets near homes, schools, parks, offices, businesses, even though the science is clear on how harmful it is. Children, pregnant women, the ill and elderly are most vulnerable.

Recently, two major new studies added to the many thousands showing adverse health effects from microwave exposure. The National Toxicology Program, considered the gold standard for U.S. animal testing, showed 'clear evidence' of increased risk of cancers of the heart and increased risk for glial tumors in a \$25 million study using cell phone exposures. Italy's prestigious Ramazzini Institute then announced their major study showing the same cancers, but from cell tower exposure levels.

### Bolinas targeted for more radiation!

Bolinas is not as yet slated for the increase in antennas along our streets – we're not densely populated enough to attract that. However, now AT&T wants to switch out its existing equipment at the Fire House and install new panels that would be a large increase in radiation. And then Verizon, also on the Fire House site, most assuredly will want to do the same.

AT&T says its radiation will be 18.4% of FCC standards. If Verizon follows, that will add up to 36.8% of FCC standards. FCC standards only protect from intense shock and actual heating. Adverse health effects begin at levels many thousands of times lower than what heats a 200 lb. male, which is what they tested. Furthermore, now everyone is exposed to a myriad other sources, not just one. Microwave radiation effects are cumulative, additive and synergistic with other toxins.

We currently have really good, low levels of microwave exposure here in Bolinas. After the community in 2000, 2005 and 2010 expressed concern, the Fire Board negotiated an clause in AT&T's lease that agreed to keep the output of radiation no more than 10% over the baseline determined in 2015. The agreement included quarterly measurements to periodically check and has been preserved faithfully through the years by both board member David Kimball and by Fire Chief Anita Brown. However, AT&T and Verizon can insist on raising their radiation output anyway.

Watch for an announcement of an upcoming discussion at the Commons on these matters.

On Saturday, September 22<sup>nd</sup> from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. the Bolinas Fire Department and Bolinas Disaster Council will be conducting a VOLUNTARY FIRE EVACUATION drill for the Gridded Mesa.

We will be using AlertMarin to place a call to all landline home numbers with a prerecorded message at approximately 9:30 a.m. Saturday September 22<sup>nd</sup>. Alert Marin will also send text messages to all registered cell phones. We encourage everyone to participate as the evacuation from the Mesa will likely be the same during a real event.

If you choose to participate, please proceed in your vehicle to the Bolinas Fire Station on Mesa Rd. At the fire station you will find information on emergency preparedness from the Fire Department, Disaster Council, and West Marin CERT. We will also be providing light snacks.

While this exercise is focused on the Big Mesa, all citizens of Bolinas are encouraged to stop by the fire station to pick up information about Emergency Preparedness.

During the exercise you will see emergency vehicles moving throughout your neighborhood to simulate an actual response. This is not only great practice for us but it also allows us to familiarize ourselves with your neighborhood and identify potential hazards.
